Minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held Sept. 8
1898, and approved.

The Petition of Bellomy and Busch and 8 other business men of
Oregon City asking that an arc light be placed at the intersection
of Eighth and Main Streets, said petitioners agreeing to
pay the entire cost of maintaining said light, read and
on motion granted and the Recorder ordered to so instruct
the Portland General Electric Co.,

Application of A. Knapp for renewal of Saloon license
for saloon on S.E. corner of Main and Eighth streets,

John Riley for renewal of Saloon license for saloon
on Main bet. 4th & 5th streets,

J. N. Miller for renewal of Saloon license for saloon on
SW. corner of Main and 4th streets,

D. G. & M. Raabe for renewal of saloon license for saloon
on Main bet. 4th & 5th streets,

read and it appearing from the affidavits of
M. E. Bain published of the Oregon City Press that all

of said applicants had published, as required by law, a notice of their intention to apply for a license at this time and it further appearing that no remonstrance or objection to the granting of same had been filed, on motion the applications of said applicants were granted and the Recorder authorized to issue said license.

The request of Dan Lyons asking that he be paid the sum of \$150⁰⁰ on account of his contract for the improvement of the High Hill Road was read and on motion and Roll Call, all voting aye, the request was granted and the Recorder instructed to draw a warrant on the Road Fund for the amount.

Petition of Chris. Schubel and others asking that the City build a sidewalk from the section built by citizens of Elizaville to connect with walls at head of Seventh Street was read and on motion Committee on Streets and Public Property instructed to investigate the matter and if in their opinion such improvement was necessary to expend a sum not to exceed \$100⁰⁰ on said improvement from the head of 7th Street to the corner of Damrell's Addition.

The report of the Recorder for the month of September¹⁸⁹⁸ was read and ordered filed.

The report of the City Treasurer for the quarter ending Sept 30, 1898 read and on motion referred to Committee on Finance.

The following claims against the City having been examined and found correct by the Finance Committee were on motion and Roll Call allowed and Warrants ordered drawn on the Revenue Funds in payment thereof.

The Committee on Finance submitted a report stating that in compliance with Ordinance No. 237 they had instructed the City Treasurer to transfer \$3500.00 of the money received as the City's share of the County Road Tax as reimbursement of money expended from General Fund during the last three years on County Roads. On motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Finance, ^{submitted a report} stating that they had examined the report of the City Treasurer for the quarter ending June 30th 1898 and found the same correct and recommending that it be adopted, on motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property submitted a report regarding the application for a road from 3rd Street to a point at the top of the bluff in the southern part of the City, stating that they had examined the proposed route and believe the construction of the road would be of benefit to the people of Oregon City. That E.C. Chapman has raised by subscription the sum of \$865⁰⁰ to aid in the construction of such a road, and the Committee further recommends that the City Engineers be instructed to make a survey of the most practicable route for a road and also prepare estimated of cost of said improvements, on motion the report was adopted and the City Engineer instructed to proceed with such survey providing the cost does not exceed \$75⁰⁰.

Ordinance No. 238.

Entitled an Ordinance instructing the Mayor and Recorder to execute and deliver a quitclaim deed in the name of the City to certain property in the City known as the Rose property, was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of M.E. Bain, publisher of the Oregon City Press that the said ordinance had been published as required by charter, on motion and Roll call it was placed upon its final passage and declared passed. All concurred voting in the affirmative.

Ordinance No. —

Entitled an ordinance authorizing W.H. Burghardt, agent, his heirs and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate a railway on South, Outer and Sixth Streets, in the City of Oregon City, Oregon, read and on motion the same was ordered published.

Ordinance No. —

Entitled an ordinance regulating the Oregon City Fire Department and to repeal all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith, and said motion ordered published.

On motion the City of Oregon City and all property owners owning property abutting on the South side of 10th Street between Main Street and Railroad Avenue were ordered to build a sidewalk 6 feet wide in front of and the entire length of their property on 10th Street, as provided by Charter and that the Superintendent of Streets notify the said property owners.

On motion the light at head of 6th street was ordered moved to foot of Singers Hill and that 6th street light be replaced by a 32 candle power incandescent light. Ayes and nays called for. Those voting aye Busch, Koenig, Harris, Rocke, Mitzner, Miller those voting nay Detourith and Wilson.

On motion Council adjourned =
