The matter of exchanging City property with the Board of Water commissioners for Park purposes was referred to Councilman Roake.

At this time the Mayor requested that the council investigate the question of all municipal improvements being made out of the General Fund of the City.

Also question of the rights of the City to condemn property for Municipal Dock, etc.

Rights of the City to use streets not innuse to establish electric stations.

All the right to remove obstructions from the streets at the expense of the abutting property owners.


Also whether or not the Municipal Elevator should be self sustaining.

The Mayor further suggested that some or all of these measures might be placed upon the ballot at the next regular election.

It was further voted that the City Recorder furnish a list of all the real estate held by the City corporation.

By common consent it was decided to discuss the Mayor's suggestions at the Budget Meeting to be held on the 19th day of October, 1916.

On motion the Council adjourned.
