November 1st 1922

The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon. met in regular session on the above date in the council chamber at 7,30, P.M. with Mayor Shannon in the Chair. Rollcall showed the following councilmen present, Bridges, Jack, Cross, Krassig, Metzner, Mount, VanAukin, absent Hodgeson.

The Minutes of the previous sessions were read and approved.

A petition from the property owners in the neighborhood of 911 J.Q. Adams Street asking that provision be made to fill up an old well on the property owned by Mrs Kate Newton, On Motion the matter was referred to the City Attorney, and see if he could find a way to have the same done.

A communication from the North West Tire Shop asking that permission be granted to them to install a gas tank and pump, at 407 Main, street, on Motion permission was Granted.

A Remonstrance from the property owners effected by the improvement of John Adams street from 7th to 9th, asking that the Bids submitted be rejected and that the Council readvertise for new bids, on motion it was so ordered and the City Recorder was instructed to advertise for new Bids.

The Reports of the City Recorder and the Chief of Police were read and on motion were adopted.

A communication from the State Highway Commission replying to resolution stating that they would like to have more definite assurance that the City would take care of the improvement on Rail Road Avenue between 5th and 7th street. The matter was laid over to the regular meeting to be held in December.

A communication from the Oregon City Abstract Co by L A Henderson regarding insurance on buildings in the Auto Park was read and on motion was referred to the Dec Meeting

A report from the City Engineer certifying that the Alley in Block 4, Oregon City, Oregon had been Completed By Mike Long, and that the Total cost was \$613.80 and recommended that it be accepted. On Motion the Report was adopted, and the Recorder was instructed to give notice by publication that Nov 10th at the council chamber would be the time and place for considering the acceptance.

A report showing that the Harrison Street from the South side of 7th street to the south side of Division and Division Street from the Westerly side of Molalla Ave, to the East side of Harrison was submitted by the Engineer, and was adopted. and on Motion the council set Nov, 10th 1922 as the day, at the council chamber at 7,30 o'clock P.M. for considering the acceptance of same.

A communication from the Highway Commission with a bill enclosed to cover the City's amount due them on account of the Bridge amounting in the sum of \$7,183.20. being Principal and interest, on \$6,481.14 with sum according to agreement must be paid in four annual payments on Nov 1st of Each Year.
