February, 21st, 1921

The City Council of Oregon City Oregon met in Special session on the above date at 7.30 O'clock. Mayor Shannon in the Chair. Roll Call showed the following Councilmen present.

Albright, Bridges. Cross, Mount. Metzner. Petzold. VanAuckin. Absent, Krassig,

The Proceedings of the special meeting held on the February 16, were read and approved,

The following Ordinance submitted by the City Attorney,

ORDINANCE NO. 243

An ordinance providing that vehicles operated for the purpose of selling or delivering goods, wares or merchandise to any person engaged in re-selling the same, shall not be operated upon any street in Oregon City, except under or by virtue of a license issued by Oregon City, and fixing the amount of such license.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The word vehicle whenever used in this ordinance shall mean and include any traveling conveyance propelled, driven or drawn by any motive power whatever, or by horses or other animals.

The word street whenever used in this ordinance shall mean and include any public street, alley, avenue, highway, court, lane or place in Oregon City.

The word person whenever used in this ordinance shall mean and include individuals, co-partnerships, corporations or associations, their lessees, trustees or receivers, their agents or employees, and the singular number shall include the plural, and the masculine pronoun shall include the feminine and the neuter.

Section 2. From and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to operate any vehicle upon any street in Oregon City for the purpose of selling or delivering goods, wares or merchandise to any person engaged in the re-selling of the same without first having obtained a license therefor, as hereinafter provided.

Section 3. Any person who shall engage in the business described in Section 2 of this ordinance shall first pay to the City Treasurer as a license fee the sum of \$10.00 per month, each month in advance, which shall entitle him to receive from the Recorder, upon presenting the City Treasurer's receipt for such payment, a license authorizing the same, said license to be issued for not less than three months.

Section 4. Any person who shall engage in the business described in Section 2 of this ordinance, without first securing the license mentioned therein, shall upon conviction thereof before the Mayor or Recorder of Oregon City, be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than 10 days or more than 50 days or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.

Section 5. This ordinance shall not apply to any person engaged in selling or delivering any article of food actually grown or produced by himself.

Read first time and ordered published at a special meeting of the City Council, held on the 21st day of February, 1921, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting to be held on the 4th day of March, 1921, at 4:30 o'clock p. m.

ORDINANCE NO. 244

An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$7236.27 out of the cemetery fund and the further sum of \$3101.25 out of that part of the general fund set aside and held as a property fund, for the purpose of purchasing "Fire Department bonds" of Oregon City, dated July 1, 1920, of the par value of \$10.000.00 with accrued interest; authorizing and directing the Mayor and Recorder to draw warrants for the same and directing the Treasurer to purchase such bonds and to deposit and

hold the same for the benefit of said funds:

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$7236.27 out of the cemetery fund and the further sum of \$3101.25 out of that part of the general fund set aside and held as a property fund, for the purpose of purchasing Fire Department Bonds of Oregon City, dated July 1, 1920, of

the par value of \$10,000.00 with accrued interest to March 4th, 1921, amounting to \$337.52.

Section 2. The Mayor and Recorder of Oregon City be and hereby are authorized and directed to draw warrants against the funds named in Section 1 of this ordinance, for the respective sums appropriated whereby, such warrants to be drawn in favor of "Fire Department Fund."

Section 3. The Treasurer of Oregon City be and hereby is authorized and directed to purchase Fire Department Bonds of Oregon City dated July 1, 1920, at par and accrued interest, with the money appropriated by Section 1 of this ordinance and the warrants drawn under Section 2 thereof, and to deposit and hold the same for the benefit of such funds in the respective amounts appropriated from each.

WHEREAS, Oregon City is without adequate fire protection and is unable to sell its Fire Department Bonds dated July 1, 1920, authorized for the purpose of purchasing proper fire fighting equipment, and the purchasing of such bonds in the amounts and manner provided by this ordinance will provide money necessary to purchase such equipment, therefore, the peace, health and safety of the people of Oregon City is in danger and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in effect upon its passage and approval.

Read first time at a special meeting of the city council held February 21st, 1921, and ordered published, to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the city council to be held on the 4th day of March, 1921, at 4.30 P. M.
