The Fire & Water Committee asked that permission be given them to purchase beds mattresses and other necessary things to furnish the quarters for the Fireman. On motion by Metzner it was voted that same be granted and said Committee to have full power to act.

The City Attorney, recommended that the Fire & Water Committee meet With representatives of the Board of Fire Underwriters, and have an official and thorough test of the new Fire Apparatus before accepting the same, On motion by Metzner, the recommendation was adopted.

Mr E G Caufield reported that the condition of the 8th street Dock was in a dangerous condition and that the council should have the same removed at once, On motion it was voted to refer the matter to the Street Committee with power to act

The being no further business before the Council The Council adjourned to meet in regular session on April 6th 1921 unless instructed otherwise.
