The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon met in Special Session, pursuant to the call of the mayor on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was called for the purpose to taking action on the Ordinance creating Sewer District No 3, and an Ordinance providing for the laying of sewers therein.

The petition of J. P. Finney asking that certain lots be omitted from Sewer District No 3 was read and on motion denied.

Ordinance No. 280

Entitled an ordinance establishing Sewer District No 3, and providing that property owners therein shall make connection with the public sewers. was read the second time, and it appearing from the affidavit of L. L. Porter, that said ordinance had been published as required by law on motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon Roll Call passed.

The vote upon said Ordinance as being as follows

 announced that the ordinance had passed.

Ordinance No.

Entitled "An ordinance to provide for the
 time and manner of constructing sewers in Sewer
 District No 3 of Ogden City, Ogden, at the expense of the
 property benefited by such sewers as provided for by
 Section 106 of the Charter of said Ogden City, was read the
 first time and upon motion ordered published."

The City Engineer submitted a report and plat
 recommending the grade of Jackson Street
 from 5th Street to 7th Street, on motion the report was
 ordered filed.

The City Engineer submitted a report and plans
 for the road in the South end of Ogden City, on motion
 the matter was referred to the Sanitation or Streets and
 public property, to act in conjunction with Hill
 road road committee and S.P. officials.

On motion the grade of Madison Street from 7th to
 9th Street was ordered re-established and the Recorder
 was instructed to publish a notice to that effect.

On motion the Council adjourned.
