The City Council of OregonCity Met in special session on the above date in the council chamber at the hour of 7.30. o'clock P.M. With Mayor Shannonin the Chair . The Mayor stated that the purpose of the meeting was to pass on certain ordinances for final passage. The roll,was called and the following were present Jack, Bridges. Cross. VanAukin. Krassig. Mount. Metzner. Petzold.

The Following Ordinances were submitted,

ODRINANCE NO.—
An ordinance declaring the assess-
ment for the cost of laying and con-
structing the sewer in Sewer District
No. 13 Oregon City, Oregon, and de-
claring an emergency.
Oregon City does ordain as follows:
Section 1. The assessment for the
cost of laying and constructing the
sewer in Sewer District No. 13, Ore-
gon City, Oregon, be and hereby is
levied and declared in accordance
with assessment roll No. C, New
Series and the whole cost thereof is
\$1313.62 and the same be and hereby
is declared to be an assessment and
lien upon the parts and parcels of
land described in said assessment
roll in the respective amounts there-
in stated, said sewer District No. 13
being bounded and described as fol-
lowing:
Beginning at the Northwest corner
of Lot 6, Block 5 of Oregon City, Ore-
gon, according to the duly recorded
map and plat thereof; thence Easterly
to the Northwest corner of Lot 4,
Block 25 of Oregon City; thence
Northerly along the Easterly line of
Main Street to the Northwest corner
of Lot 5 said Block 25; thence Easterly
on Westerly line of Lots 5 and 2,
said block 25, and on a projection of
said line to the center of the main
line of the Southern Pacific Railroad
as now located and constructed;
thence Southerly along the center line
of said Railroad's main line to a point
of intersection of the North line of
the alley in block 26 of Oregon City
extended Easterly; thence Westerly
along the North line of said alley and
of the alley in Block 4 of Oregon City
to the Southwest corner of Lot 7 of
said Block 4; thence Northerly along
the Easterly line of Water Street to
the place of beginning.
Whereas the real property embrac-
ed in said district is business proper-
ty located in the business center of
Oregon City and is without adequate
sewers and the immediate construc-
tion of a sewer system therein is nec-
essary in order to protect the health
of the people residing therein, there-
fore an emergency is hereby declared
to exist, and this ordinance shall be
in effect upon its passage and approv-
al.
Read first time at a regular meet-
ing of the city council held on April

ordered published to come up for sec-
ond reading and passage at a special
meeting of the city council to be held
on the 18th day of April 1922, at 7:30

ODRINANCE NO.—
An ordinance transferring the sum
of \$2000.00 out of that part of the gen-
eral fund set aside and held as a prop-
erty fund, to the City of Oregon City
\$30,000.00 refunding bond fund, for
the purpose of providing sufficient
funds to retire \$2500.00 of principal
and of paying \$1800.00 of interest of
said bonds coming due May 1st, 1922,
and declaring an emergency.
Oregon City does ordain as follows:
Section 1. That there be and is
transferred the sum of \$2000.00 out of
that part of the general fund set aside
and held as a property fund, to the
City of Oregon City \$30,000.00 refund-
ing bond fund, for the purpose of pro-
viding sufficient funds to retire
\$2500.00 of principal and of paying
\$1800.00 of interest of said bonds com-
ing due May 1st, 1922, and the Mayor
and Recorder be and hereby are au-
thorized and directed to draw a war-
rant transferring the same.
Whereas \$2500.00 principal and
\$1800.00 interest of the City of Oregon
City \$30,000.00 refunding bonds will
be due and payable on May 1st, 1922,
and on account of the manner of col-
lecting the special tax provided for
the payment of the same, sufficient
money will not be on hand for such
purpose and it is necessary that
money be provided for the same from
another source, and said payment is
necessary for the health and safety of
the public, in the judgment of the City
Council of Oregon City an emergen-
cy exists, and this ordinance shall
take effect and be in force immedi-
ately upon its approval by the mayor.

ODRINANCE NO.—
An Ordinance appropriating the
sum of \$500.00 out of the general fund
as payment to Oregon City-West Linn
Ferry Co., for the purpose of assisting
and maintaining transportation across
the Willamette River, and declaring
an emergency.
Oregon City does ordain as fol-
lows:
Section 1. That there be and here-
by is appropriated the sum of \$500.00
out of the general fund as payment to
Oregon City-West Linn Ferry Co., for
the purpose of assisting and maintain-
ing transportation across the Willam-
ette River.
Section 2. The Mayor and Record-
er of Oregon City be and hereby are
authorized to draw a warrant in fa-
vor of Oregon City-West Linn Ferry
Co., in the amount of \$500.00 for the
purposes mentioned in Section 1 of
this ordinance.
Section 3. It is hereby adjudged
and declared that existing transporta-
tion conditions across the Willamette
River, are such that this ordinance is
necessary for the immediate preserva-
tion of the public peace, health and
safety, and an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, and this ordinance
shall take effect and be in full force
and effect from and after its approval
by the mayor.

ORDINANCE NO.—

An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$650.00 out of the general fund in payment for 500 feet of hose purchased of A. G. Long & Co., and declaring an emergency.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$650.00 out of the general fund in payment for 500 feet of hose purchased of A. G. Long & Co., and the mayor and re-

corner are hereby authorized to draw a warrant on said fund in favor of A. G. Long & Co., for the same.

Section 2. Whereas the fire department of Oregon City is in immediate need of the hose described in section 1 of this Ordinance, and the purchase of the same is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health and safety of the public, in the judgment of the city council of Oregon City, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its approval by the mayor.

ORDINANCE NO.—

An ordinance establishing the grade of Molalla Avenue from Division Street to Willamette Street.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The grade of Molalla Avenue from Division Street to Willamette Street, be and hereby is established as follows:

Beginning at the South side of Division Street at an elevation of 383 feet on the west side and 384.6 feet on the east side of Molalla Avenue; thence Southerly to the center of the alley to an elevation of 386 feet on the east side and 385.5 feet on the west side; thence southerly to the North side of Willamette Street to an elevation of 390.8 feet on the east side and 391.2 feet on the west side of Molalla Avenue.

Read first time at a regular meeting of the city council held on April 5th, 1922, at 7:00 o'clock P. M., and ordered published to come up for second reading and passage at a special meeting of the city council to be held on the 18th day of April 1922, at 7:30 o'clock P. M.

A Petition from property owners living between the intersection of Duane Street with Molalla Avenue on each side of said avenue to the City Limits be granted permission to build four foot sidewalks out of cement, or wood, same to be optional with the property owner.

On Motion the City Engineer was instructed to fix the line for the said improvements and that the property owners build their walks to conform to same, and that October 1st 1922 set as the time limit for the petitioners to comply with the request granted, So Ordered,

A Petition by property owners complaining about the Fumes from the Hawley Mills. was presented and read, and the matter was referred to the committee on Health & Police,

A communication from the Standard Oil Co asking that an option be granted for 90 days on the property and street between 11th and 12th on main for a Filling station at a rental of \$50.00 a month, was read and referred to the Street Committee,

A Petition asking that the Elevator be operated From 6,0, clock A.M Instead of 6,30 was read, Same was referred to the Street Committee,

A Petition From The Hill Improvement Club Stateing that they voted unanimously, to recommend the Singer Hill site as a compromise site for the City Hall. On Motion It was Voted That the Engineer proceed and get out the elevations and other data And have the same submitted to an Architect to see if suitable Plans could be worked out and submit a report on the same at a special meeting of council to be held on Saturday Evening April 22, 1922 at the Council Chamber at the hour of 7,30. 0, clock P.M.

On Motion, it was voted that the City advertize for bids for the Improvement of Division From Molalla Ave, to Harrison to 7th street And from 11 and John Adams to 12 th street, And of 15th Street from Harrison to Division, So Ordered,

The City Attorney asked that he be furnished a special Police Officer for the purpose of enforcing the Milk Ordinance, On Motion the request was granted,

The City Recorder was instructed to continue his office in the pesent quarters, until otherwise directed, XXXXX on Motion Council
