On Motion It was Voted That the Engineer proceed and get out the elevations and other data And have the same submitted to an Architect to see if suitable Plans could be worked out and submitt a report on the same at a special meeting of council to be held on Saturday Evening April 22.1922 at the Council Chamber at the hour of 7,30. O,clock P.M.

On Motion, it was voted that the City advertize for bids for the Improvement of Division From Molalla Ave, to Harrison to 7th street And from 11 and John Adams to 12 th street.

And of 15th Street from Harrison to Division. So Ordered.

The City Attorney asked that he be furnished a special Police Officer for the purpose of enforcing the Milk Ordinance. On Motion the request was granted.
