In the absence of the Mayor, Mr. Tobin, president of the council presided.


The Acting Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to read an ordinance entering into a contract for the street improvement on Washington and Fourteenth.

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. \_\_\_ An Ordinance Authorizing the making of a contract with J. W. Moffatt, to repair Washington and Fourteenth Streets with cement pavement and declaring an emergency" was read time time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the said city council to be held on the 23rd day of June, 1919, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

The matter of the usual vacations for the police officers was referred to the Mayor and the committee on Health and Police with power to act.

The communication from the Portland Gas Company relative to permits for gas connections was read and it was ordered that said permits be granted but streets must be tamped and filled in and left in as good condition as they were prior to such installation.
