The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon, met in special session on the above date at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance NO. \_\_\_\_ An Ordinance providing for the issue and sale of negotiable coupon bonds of Oregon City, a municipal corporation, in the amount of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000) dollars pursuant to and in accordance with an amendment to the charter of Oregon City, approved and adopted by the legal voters at a special city election held on the 21st day of May, 1920, to provide funds to purchase and equip a fire department." was read second time and placed upon its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Raymond Fuson, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Morning Enterprise that the same had been ordered published as required by the charter and on motion and roll call the ordinance passed, the vote thereon resulted as follows:

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. 846 An ordinance providing for the issue and sale of negotiable coupon bonds of Oregon City, a municipal corporation, in the sum of Thirty-five thousand dollar (\$35,000) pursuant to and in accordance with an amendment to the city charter approved and adopted by the legal voters at a special city election held on the 21st day of May, 1920, to provide funds to construct a city hall." was read second time and placed upon its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Raymond Fuson, principal clerk of the Publisher and printer of the Morning Enterprise that the same had been properly published as required by ~~the~~ charter and on motion and roll call the ordinance passed, the vote thereon resulted as follows:

Gentlemen living on the Justin Property objected to the trees being in front of his property, the matter was referred to the committee on streets and public property with power to act.

The committee on streets and public property was instructed to have signs for street directions properly placed, also one directing way to Molalla Avenue.


The matter of the applications of Dickens and Ramsby to purchase some of the city's property was referred to the finance committee and the City Recorder was instructed to write to each of said gentlemen relative to sale of said lot and make the sale of the half block if possible.

The City Attorney and the Recorder were instructed to advertise and try to sell the bonds for the fire hall and city building.

Mr. Kelly stated that the county had not turned over its proper amount of road moneys to the city.

Voted that the City attorney bring in an opinion in writing on the said matter at the next meeting of the city council.
