The City Council of Oregon City Met in special session on the above date in the Council at 7.30, o'clock. P.M. with Mayor Shannon in the chair.

Roll call showed the following present, Jack, Bridges, VanAukin, Krassig, Mount, Metzner, Absent. Cross, Hodgeson.

The Mayor stated that the purpose was to consider the passage of certain ordinances, and any other business that may come before the council.

An ordinance authorizing and directing the council to construct, a City Hall and Fire Department quarters on the Northerly 33ft, of Block 24, and that the same be placed on the ballot to be voted on at the regular election to be held on November 7th 1922. for there approval or rejection.

Ayes. Jack, Bridges, VanAukin, Krassig, Mount, Metzner, Noes. none. Absent, Cross, Hodgeson.

A communication from the Maryland Casualty Company submitting a plan of Firemans Insurance was read and referred to the Fire and Water Committee, to get further data on,

Bids For the Improvement of John Adams Street from 7th to 9th were submitted by The Oregon City Sand & Gravel Co, H Burdine. and the Oregon Contract Co, and on motion the Matter was referred to the Street Committee with power to act,

The Mayor stated that a committee of ladies waited on him and asked, if it would be possible to rent the rooms adjacent to the council chamber for a womans club, on motion it was voted to rent them the rooms for the sum of \$10.00 a month.

In the matter of the filling of certain lots on 12th street near Center was referred to the Chief of Police.

In the Matter of the Dent Franchise case Mount moved that the case in the Supreme Court be carried to a decision.

In the matter of the Bush Store failing to conform to the Fire ordinance, The Fire & Water committee reported that they had taken the matter up with Mr Bush, but nothing of a definite nature had been agreed to.

In the Matter of the O 6 Foundry Building repare not conforming to the Fire Ordinance, the same was held up for the State Fire Marshall to pass upon.

An Ordinance for the Improvement of Third Street from the Westerly line of Madison Street to the Easterly line of Jeffers on Street Oregon City Oregon. was read and on motion was declared the First reading and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a meeting (Special) to be held by the Council on the 28th day of October 1922 at 7.30, o'clock P.M. Ayes. Bridges, Jack, VanAukin, Krassig, Mount, Metzner, Absent, Cross, Hodgeson.

Permission was Granted to Pollock & Wheeler to hang an Electric Sign over their place of business Between 5th & 6th Street same to conform to the City Ordinance.

A communication from the Hawley Pulp and Paper Co asking that permission be granted them to rebuild their pipe line between the basin and third Street, on motion their request was granted.

A communication from the American Telephone Users Association was read and referred to a committee appointed by the mayor Committee appointed were, O D Eby, W. B. Howell, Burt Roake, Linn, E Jones, and Wm. Andreson.

The Report of the committee appointed to apportion the cost of ~~XXXX~~ each lot in sewer Dist #14 was read and on motion was adopted and ordered published and that Oct 28 be the date set for any objections thereto, So ordered.

Ballot Titles Were submitted by the City Attorney for City Election and measures to be voted on, and on motion were adopted and ordered posted

Resolution,

WHEREAS various property owners have signified their desires to subscribe to the construction of a certain Highway within the City of Oregon City, known as the Bluff highway and extending from the west side of the Southern Pacific track on Fifth Street in said City southerly to the city limits of said city, and

WHEREAS, It is important at this time to determine the actual cost of such work to ascertain whether or not the various amounts subscribed will in the aggregate, be sufficient to defray the cost of such improvement, and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission is better ~~equipped~~ equipped than the city of Oregon City to intelligently investigate and determine the cost of such work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the honorable Highway Commission be and it is hereby requested to advertise for bids for such work with the idea of ascertaining such actual cost, reserving of course, the right to reject any and all bids.

On Motion the resolution was adopted by unanimous vote.

The City Council of Oregon City Oregon met in special session on the above date at the council chamber at 7.30, o'clock, P.M. With Mayor James Shannon in the Chair, Roll call showed the following present Bridges, Cross. Jack. Krassig. Metzner,

Absent, Mount. Hodgeson, VanAukin,

The Mayor stated that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the final passage of certain Ordinances, and to consider any other business that may come before the council.

An Ordinance Authorizing and directing the City Council to purchase a site for the City Hall and Fire Department and to expend the sum of \$5.000.

for the same and that the site described as follows All of the Easterly $\frac{1}{2}$ of lots (10 and (2) Block (63) of Oregon City Oregon according to the duly recorded map and plat thereof not including any part of the alley dedicated on said plat. Was read second time, and on motion was placed on its final passage. The vote resulting as follows,

Ayes. Bridges, Cross. Jack. Krassig. Metzner, Noes. none, Absent, Mount, Hodgeson, VanAukin,

In the matter of a bus line franchise. the City Attorney was instructed to take the matter up with Mr Phillip Hammond and see if they could get out a franchise that would be acceptable to the parties concerned and submit the same to the council for approval.

In the Matter of the Mr Roake not conforming to the provisions of the Fire Ordinance, It was voted to refer the matter to the State Fire Marshall and see if he would pass on the improvement made to Mr Roake's Building.

Councilman Cross, reported that parties were occupying the street at south High, and that they had buildings thereon and were living in same and that they were in a filthy condition, and should be removed,

Metzner, assured the council that the party referred to had purchased a lot and would move on to it and remove all obstructions from the street,

at This time the Mayor appointed the following citizens and property owners to act and assist in preparing the Budget for the ensuing year 1923. Wm. Andresen, L.E. Jones, Al. Price. W.B. Caufield. Carl Green. C. Schubel. J.A. Cameron. R.L. Greaves. L.A. Henderson,
