In the absence of the Mayor, Councilman Leyer, president of the Council, presided.

The City Engineer filed his acceptance of the sewers on Jackson, J.Q.Adams and Sixteenth Streets in Sewer District Ho.10, and the City Council has set the 8th day of January, 1913, at the Council Chamber as the time and place of hearing of objections to the said aceptance, if any are had.

The communication of 'ouncilman Beard in regard to the unsafe condition of the Mountain View Company Hose House was read and referred to a special committee composed of: Councilmen Meyer, Pope and Holman, to furnish plans and specifications for a new building.

The petition of Philip Streib for using a part of Sixth Street was granted.

The petition for an arc light on Fourteenth and Jacksons Streets was referred to the Commit'ee on Streets and Public Property to investigate.

The objections filed against sewers in District No. 8, green Point were referred to the Finance Committee and acceptance thereon postponed until the next meeting.

The Mayor came in and was recorded present.

On recommendation of the Committee on Streets and Public Property the bid for the sewers on J.Q.Adams and on Eighth Streets was awarded to the Oregon Engineering and Construction Company.

The following were appointed appraisers on Jackson, Sixteenth and J.Q.Adams Streets: W.A.White, George Randall, and John Bittner.

The charges against cCouncilman Wm. Beard were referred to the following committee; Horton, Pope, and Holman.

A motion duly made by Councilman Albright and seconded by Council man Tooze that a committee of three be appointed to investigate the matter of having an expert chemist test material for Main Street Improvement. and report t the next meeting, the Mayor appointed the Finance Committee for said purpose.

The final passage of the Ordinance assesing Sewer District No. 7 was postpones until the meeting of the 8th day of January, 1913.

It was ordered that the freight permit to the Fortland Rallway, Light and pow er Company be extended 30 days from the 25 rd day of December, 1912.

The petition of the members of the Hook and Ledder Company and The Fountain Hose Company for careets, furniture etc. was referred to the Committee on Fire and Water to report back to the Council.

It was ordered that an Ordinance be drawn revoking the franchise of the Mt. Hood Railway and Power Company.

It was ordered that the Recorder notify the Southern Pacific Co., that their assessment on Fourteenth Street must be paid, also to ascertain what position they intended taking in the matter of their franchise on Center Street.

The motion was duly made, seconded and carried that the Saloon License of Frank Udermann be revoked.

The matter of the purchase of a hose cast for Sixteenth Street was referred to the Committee on Fire and Water.

The recorded was directed to draw an Ordinance appropriating funds for the purchase of the same.

There being no further business on mation the Chuncil adjourned.
