The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon, met in special session on the above date at 7 p.m.

The Mayor was present and presided.

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. An Ordinance levying taxes for the year 1920 for municipal purposes, for paying interest and principal of refunding bonds; for Library Purposes; for paying interest and principal on Fire department bonds and for amintaining a paid fire department and for paying interest and principal on fire department bonds, and for maintaining a paid fire department and for paying principal and interest on City Hall Bonds." was read second time and placed upon its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Alene Phillips, principal clerk of the publisher of the Morning Enterprise that the same had been properly published as required by the charter and on motion and roll call the ordinance passed, the vote resulted as follows:

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and City Recorder to execute deeds to Charles Dicken and to Everett Foulkds to the first named to Lots 1 and 2, Block 145, and the second named to the westerly half of lots 1 and 2, Block 159, Oregon City." was read second time and placed upon its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Alene Phillips principal clerk of the publisher of Horniang Enterprise that the same had been properly publoshed as required by the charter and on motion and roll call the ordinance passed, the vote resulted as follows: Albright, Bridges, Green, Kelly, Krueger, Petzold & Tobin (7)

Absent: Eby,

The communication of the public service commission relative to a the raise in telephone rates and the Mayor appointed the following Councilmen to attende the meeting: Petzold, Bridges and Albright.

Letter notifying the city of the meeting for said purpose to be held on the 21st day of December, 1920, at 10 a.m. in the Portland Count house was read.

It was voted that the city council is opposed to any raise in the said rates.

The report of the committee to whom was referred the matter of the application of Elevibeth Shively to connect with the 7th Street Sewer was read and the matter referred back to the said committee by request of the committee.

Application of the Portland Gas & Coke company for permission to to make cut in pavement to locate the gas leak was granted.

The following ordinacne Ordinance No. An Ordinance changing the Grade of Twelfth Street from the easterly side of Main Street to the Vesterly side of Center Street, Oregon City, Oregon." was read first time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the city council to beheld on the 30th day of December, 1920. at 7 p.m.

The committee on streets and public property reported that the overhead crossing at Canemah was repaired and now in good vondition.

The City Attorney repoeted that he had accepted the offer of Ers Emily Hood in the sum of 30.31 for sewer assessment against lot 4, Southerly half of Block 48, Oregon City.

The petition for the improvement of First Street between High and Center Streets was read and referred to the new city council.

Ir. W.C.Green, chairman of the committee on streets and public property reported that the tenants of hte 8th street dock were scattered over a large territory and that it would be about March or April before they would call for their property and that he recommended that the dock stand until that time.

The matter of the removing of the barn from Alley Block 103 was referred to the nwe council.

Mr. Bridges reported that the new fire truck would be here in a day or two from the information that he got from the A.G.Long Co.m

The City Recorder reported thathe had not got any bids for the fire truck bonds. Remarks were made about interesting local people but no action was taken.

C.T.Kelly resigned as councilman from Ward No 3 in order to qualify as City Recorder to take immediate effect, and same was accepted by the council.

Mr. Frank Cross was placed on nomination and itnwas voted that his name be accepted and the recorder was instructed to canvass the vote for said Mr. Cross to fill the unexpired term casued by the resignation of Mr. C. W. Kelly, the vote thereon resulted as follows: Ayes: Albright, Bridges, Green, Krity Krueger, Petzold & Tobin (6) Not voting Kelly.

Absent: Eby.

The Seventh Street Parking ordinance was discussed but no action taken.
