AN ORDINANCE DELETING TITLE 13: PUBLIC SERVICES, CHAPTER 12: STORM DRAINAGE SYSTEM, OF THE OREGON CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, 1991, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

OREGON CITY MAKES THE FOLLOWING FINDINGS:

In 1991 Oregon City adopted Ordinance No. 91-1021 which amended the Municipal Code by adding Chapter 13.20, System Development Charge for Capital Improvements, which established a system development charge for, among other things, storm water drainage facilities;

In adopting Ordinance No. 91-1021, the City Commission intended to replace all of the thenexisting Municipal Code chapters which established a system development charge for individual public facilities;

One such existing chapter, Chapter 13.12 establishing a system development charge for storm water drainage, was superseded by Chapter 13.20, and should have been but was not specifically deleted upon the adoption of Ordinance No. 91-1021;

Given that provisions of Chapter 13.12 are redundant in some respects and contradict in other respects the provisions of the recently adopted Chapter 13.20, it is appropriate that the City Commission specifically delete Chapter 13.12 to avoid any potential confusion or conflict.

Now, therefore,

OREGON CITY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Title 13: PUBLIC SERVICES, Chapter 12: STORM DRAINAGE SYSTEM, of the Oregon City Municipal Code, 1991, is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Section 2. Because this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace and public health, safety and welfare of Oregon City, and to provide for an orderly transition in a reasonable amount of time to this regulatory system, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on passage.

Read first time at a regular meeting of the Commission held on the 19th day of May, 1993, and the foregoing ordinance was finally enacted by the City Commission this 19th day of May, 1993.

At its July 17, 1991 meeting, the City Commission adopted Ordinance No. 91-1021 which added Chapter 13.20 and replaced a number of Municipal Code chapters that established a system development charge for individual public facilities. Ordinance No. 91-1021 did not specifically delete Chapter 13.12.

On the May 19, 1993 agenda is proposed Ordinance No. 93-1010 (copy attached) which will delete Chapter 13.12 of the Municipal Code. This is presented as part of the continuing "housekeeping" of the Code.

Notice of proposed Ordinance No. 93-1010 has been posted at City Hall, Courthouse and Senior Center by direction of the City Recorder. An emergency clause has been included with the ordinance because Chapter 13.12 creates a conflict with Chapter 13.20; therefore, it is recommended that first and second readings be approved unanimously for enactment of the ordinance to become effective immediately.

Dear Jean:

In response to your inquiry earlier this week, I reviewed the above-mentioned Municipal Code chapters and noted a conflict which arguably calls for some sort of Code amendment. Attached is one such suggestion.

I spoke with Tim Sercombe who drafted the City's SDC brdinance - Ordinance 91-1021 codified as chapter 13.20. In addition to establishing chapter 13.20, Ordinance 91-1021 was also designed to delete several then existing code provisions and supersede any others with which it conflicted. Chapter 13.12 appears to be one of those conflicting chapters; however, it was not specifically mentioned in Ordinance 91.1021. To avoid any potential or actual confusion, I recommend that chapter 13.12 be deleted - something the attached ordinance is intended to accomplish.
