

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt proposed Resolution No. 05-05 declaring the discharge of raw sewage from the "Tumwater Houses" (316 and 320 Tumwater Street) a public nuisance and authorizing the Oregon City Public Works (OCPW) Department to abate the nuisance and seek recovery of a portion of its costs from the owners of the properties.

#### REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The Oregon City Municipal Code includes standards and ordinances that speak specifically to acceptable management of public storm water and sanitary sewer systems. The City has the legal authority and responsibility to enforce these standards and ordinances. After discovering the cross connection of the "Tumwater Houses" private sanitary sewer disposal systems to the municipal storm drainage collection system which thereafter drains directly to the Willamette River, OCPW capped off the cross connection and has continued to pump the private septic tanks regularly. Availability of an accessible sewer will require an extension of the public sewer system.

# **BACKGROUND**:

On November 4, 2004, OCPW was contacted by Northwest Natural Gas Co. to respond to their concern of possible septic system failure. Later testing and examination confirmed that on-site sewage disposal systems were being used by two occupied homes and one vacant home fronting Tumwater Street. The septic tanks serving the two occupied homes were connected directly to a street catch basin.

OCPW determined a feasible solution and assembled a bid package to complete a public sewer extension to serve the three residential properties fronting Tumwater Street. Bids have been solicited from three contractors, two of which submitted bids. K & R Plumbing submitted the lowest qualifying bid of \$39,860.

The designed public sewer extension is troubled by complicated access to an available sewer and by the low-lying "Tumwater Houses". One public sewer easement is required and each home will have an individual pump system with its own electrical source. Costs associated with the individual pumps and electrical equipment is what the City will seek to recover from the owners of the properties.

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#### **RESOLUTION NO. 05-05**

# A RESOLUTION DECLARING A NUISANCE IN THE AREA OF TUMWATER STREET AND AUTHORIZING ABATEMENT OF THE SAME

WHEREAS, in late 2004, the City discovered that several houses located on Turnwater Street (the "Turnwater Houses") have wastewater collection tanks that discharge directly into the City's storm drainage system and thereafter discharge directly into the Willamette River; and

WHEREAS, the discharge of raw sewage into the City's storm drainage system and, ultimately, the Willamette River endangers the public health and safety and pollutes the waters of the State, specifically the Willamette River; and

WHEREAS, the City has temporarily addressed this illicit discharge of sewage into the storm drainage system by manually draining small tanks at the Tumwater Houses twice a week to ensure that no additional sewage enters the City's storm drainage system or waters of the State; and

WHEREAS, the twice weekly draining of the tanks is a significant cost to the City and is not a solution of the problem of the non-compliant sewage disposal system at the Turnwater Houses; and

WHEREAS, immediate abatement of the illicit discharge of sewage is necessary to prevent harm to the public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the City has sought a bid to remedy the improperly designed sewage system, which includes improvements to the City's infrastructure and improvements for each individual property owner of the Tumwater Houses; and

WHEREAS, the total construction cost to abate the nuisance caused by this illicit discharge is anticipated to be \$44,860 and the portion of the cost to be allocated to the properties at 316 and 320 Tumwater for on-site pump stations and electrical work is expected to be \$9,930 each;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission that:

The discharge of raw sewage from the Tumwater Houses is hereby declared a nuisance and the City's Public Works Department is authorized to abate the nuisance and seek recovery of a portion of its costs from the owners of the properties.
