#### EASEMENT

TRI-CITY SERVICE DISTRICT, a County Service District (District) as Grantor, hereby grants and conveys to the City of Oregon City, a Municipal corporation (City) as Grantee, a non-exclusive pathway easement over a strip of land twenty (20) feet wide, the center line of which is located as follows across the property of District:

See Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

The purpose for this easement is to grant the City access along the Clackamas River in furtherance of its objectives to provide parks and park related facilities within its boundaries.

The true consideration for this easement consists of the covenants and agreements set forth below .

City shall if it elects to improve the easement incur all costs to construct, operate and maintain the pathway easement and shall have the obligation to maintain and repair the easement area except for repairs resulting from the actions of District and its agents, employees, guests, invitees, permitees or licensees. District shall have no maintenance costs or other obligation with respect to this easement except for repairs resulting from the actions of District and its agents, employees, guests, invitees, permitees or licensees. However, nothing herein shall prevent District from repairing damage or making such maintenance and repairs as its deems necessary to prevent hazardous or dangerous conditions from occurring or continuing over the easement area and in such case the City shall fully indemnify and reimburse District for such repairs.

City hereby agrees to the full extent permitted by law to indemnify and hold harmless the District from any and all claims, actions, suits or demands arising out of City's use, operation or maintenance of the easement.

This easement shall be perpetual; however, in the event that it is not used by City or its agents, employees, guests, invitees, permitees or licensees for a period of three (3) years, this easement shall automatically expire and City shall upon request execute a recordable document evidencing such expiration. Further, this easement is subject to the District's right to modify the location of or terminate the easement if it becomes necessary as a result of expansion or other operation of its sewage treatment plant facilities provided that termination shall only be permitted if there is not other suitable location upon District's property for such easement.

This easement is granted subject to all prior easements or encumbrances of record which District will defend, indemnify and hold City harmless therefrom.

On the July 1, 1992 City Commission agenda is an easement across Tri-City Service District property for the Phase 1 River Access Trail project. As the Commission recalls, staff has identified four phases to the River Access Trail project. Maps of the four phases and easement are attached for Commission Review. Plans for the Phase 1 project will be available at the meeting.

Phase 1 is funded by the Oregon City-Metro Enhancement Committee, and constructs a multi-use pedestrian/bicycle trail from the 82nd Drive bridge to the old traction railroad bridge. This phase is to be constructed Summer/Fall 1992.

Phase 2 is proposed for ISTEA funding and would continue the trail from the railroad bridge to Clackamette Park, bridging over the inlet to the Lagoon. This phase is to be constructed Summer/Fall 1993.

Phase 3 is proposed for Park funding and would continue the trail through Clackamette Park and connect to the existing State bike path near Sportcraft Marina. This phase is also to be constructed Summer/Fall 1993.

Phase 4 is proposed for various funding sources and constructs the linear parkway portion of the Willamette River Waterfront Park project. This phase is to be constructed when funding is available.

It is recommended the City Commission adopt a motion accepting the access easement and authorizing the Mayor and City Recorder to execute respectively.
