## ELECTRIC POWER LINE EASEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That THE CITY OF OREGON CITY

(hereinafter called "the Grantee," whether one or more than one), its successors and assigns, a perpetual easement and right of way over, under and across the following described parcel of land situated in <u>Clackamas</u> County,

Oregon, being a strip of land 10 feet in width, extending 5 feet on each side of a center line more particularly described as follows:

See attached EXHIBIT "A"

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above described easement and right of way unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns, together with the present right to top, limb or fell trees located on land owned by the Grantors, adjacent to the above described right of way, which danger trees will be determined by the Grantee.

Said easement and right of way shall be for the following purposes, namely: the perpetual right to enter upon and to erect, maintain, repair, rebuild, operate and patrol electric power lines, and appurtenant signal or communication lines, including the right to erect such poles, wires, cables, guys, supports and appurtenances as are necessary thereto, together with the present and future right to clear said right of way and keep the same clear of brush, timber, structures and fire hazards, including the right to restrict the growth of trees and brush on said right of way by the use of chemical sprays.

Grantors shall have the right to use the lands subject to the above described easement for all purposes not inconsistent with the uses and purposes herein set forth, except Grantors shall not build or erect any structure upon the right of way without the prior written consent of the Grantee.

If the Grantee, its successors and assigns, shall fail to use said right of way for the purposes above mentioned for a continuous period of five years after construction of said power lines, then and in that event this right of way and easement shall terminate and all rights and privileges granted hereunder shall revert to the Grantors, their heirs and assigns.

The Grantors hereby warrant that they are possessed of a marketable title to the property covered by this easement, and have the right to grant the same.

The Grantors, for themselves and their heirs and assigns, covenant to and with the Grantee, its successors and assigns, that the Grantee, its successors and assigns, shall peaceably enjoy the rights and privileges herein granted.

Subject: Portland General Electric Easement at Kelly Field

Portland General Electric is designing a new 12 kilovolt (kv) primary feeder line to serve the Clackamas Transfer and Recycling Center. The line would feed from the Abernethy Substation at 82nd Avenue. Direct egress from the Abernethy Substation is needed because the existing feeder on 17th Street does not have adequate capacity to serve the additional load and maintain satisfactory service to existing customers.

Attached is a copy of the proposed easement and a drawing. The easement is for a 10 foot overhang on the east side of 82nd Avenue and a three foot by 25 foot long easement to install a pole and anchors. The pole and anchors would be located at the entrance of Kelly Field. Portland General Electric would install the necessary guardrail to protect the pole and anchors. A 40 foot wide entrance would be maintained at Kelly Field.

If the Commission has no objection to this easement, the following motion should be approved:

That the Mayor is authorized to sign the Easement as described in Commission Report No. 82-113.

I have reviewed the attached letter dated June 16, 1982, from Portland General Electric, requesting an easement from the City of Oregon City to install a power pole and two anchors. I personally met with Dave Mitchem, PGE's engineer, approximately two weeks ago and worked out the details of this on the site.

The new pole guy wire and additional guard rail will be installed by PGE's contractor. The arrangement as shown on the attached sketch leaves an opening of 40 feet for the Kelly Field entrance, which is adequate. I have discussed this with Les Pakulak and he agrees that 40 feet is adequate.

PGE is designing a new 12 KV primary feeder to serve the proposed Clackamas Transfer and Recycling Center. The attached easement drawing dated May 18, 1982 shows the proposed feeder route from our Abernethy Substation to 82nd Ave. Direct egress from the substation is required because our existing feeder on 17th Street does not have adequate capacity to serve the additional load and maintain satisfactory service to our existing customers.

This letter confirms my verbal request to install a PGE pole and two anchors, as shown on the attached sketch dated 6-15-82, on City of Oregon City property. Per your request the anchoring has been redesigned to reduce the lead from 20 feet to 16 feet. PGE will furnish and install an extension of the existing guardrail around our new facilities. The pole and guardrail will be located to provide a 40 foot driveway access at the Kelly Field entrance.

If these arrangements are acceptable, Mr. Roger Sharp of our Permits Section will be contacting you for the necessary easement.
