WHEREAS, The Oregon City Post Office links us with the nation and the world by our National Mail Service,

WHEREAS, The welfare of every citizen, every business, on every city street and across the countryside, is dependent upon this vast communications network, available to all our people the year round, at a cost everyone can afford,

WHEREAS, Trustworthy mail service is the birthright of every American,

WHEREAS, By law, your Postal Service -- and the men and women who operate it -- are obligated to serve this community and the Nation on a non-profit basis, with courtesy and care, and to keep postal costs in balance with postal revenues,

WHEREAS, The mail service needs the informed understanding, cooperation, support and constructive suggestions of every citizen,

THEREFORE, I, Howard Klemsen, Mayor of Oregon City, proclaim April 29 through May 5, 1973 POSTAL WEEK in Oregon City, Oregon, as an appropriate occasion for recognition of the vital responsibilities assigned to the mail service, and a valid time to take stock of the challenges which must be jointly met by postal people and by the citizens of this community who depend upon the mail as an essential part of their personal and business lives.
