PROCLAMATION

Reducing Youth Access to Alcohol Project

- **Withereas**, 47% of 11th graders and 27% of 8th graders in Clackamas County report drinking alcohol in the last 30 days;
- **Whereas**, 28% of Clackamas County 11th graders report having five or more drinks on at least one occasion in the last 30 days;
- **Withereas**, Alcohol is by far the most commonly used drug among youth in Oregon City, Clackamas County, and Oregon;
- **Withereas**, The total cost of youth alcohol use is over \$59 million annually in Clackamas County and \$697 million in Oregon
- **Whereas**, Over 80% of 11th graders in Clackamas County say it is easy to get alcohol if they want it;
- **Wittens**, Clackamas County and Oregon teens report getting alcohol both by purchasing it and by getting it from friends, family members, and acquaintances;
- Now, Therefore, I, Alice Norris, Mayor of the City of Oregon City, hereby declare that
 - We support a policy of zero tolerance regarding alcohol made available to youth of Oregon City;
 - We want all of the laws enforced involving youth access to, possession of, and use of alcohol:
 - We want all laws relating to furnishing alcohol to minors, to be enforced;
 - We commend merchants, parents, and all Oregon City citizens who refuse to sell or give alcohol to our young people.
