WHEREAS, the Cities of West Linn and Oregon City value tradition and history as essential parts of their communities; and


WHEREAS, Oregon City High School and West Linn High School, formerly known as Union High School, have competed valiantly in the sport of football continuously since 1921; and


WHEREAS, on October 5, 2001, the teams representing these schools will renew their annual rivalry for the 81st time; and
