WHEREAS, trees can reduce erosion of precious topsoil, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oregon City has instituted over past years, an annual beautification program to coincide with Arbor Week with this years activities co-sponsored by Oregon City 2000 and Oregon City Chamber of Commerce; and
