A petition was read from citizens praying that J. B. Patterson be appointed Nightwatchman when the present watchman resigns.

On motion the petition was ordered placed on file.

N. W. Randall, Assessor & Collector returned his assessment role.

On motion the same was referred to a committee, consisting of D. P. Thompson, J. W. Shattuck & W. J. Caldwell, to report on the first Monday in July next.

The School Committee made a report recommending that an appropriation be made to repair fence around School property. Also that some improvement be made to deaden the sound, and that the inside be painted. Also that the Primary Department be divided and an other Teacher procured.

On motion the report was placed.

On motion the School Committee was authorized to make an estimate of the costs of improvements as recommended and report at the next meeting.

On motion the Chairman of the School Committee was authorized to procure new posts for two sides of the fence belonging to Seminary.

In the matter of a City order belonging to J. R. Ralston, which was presented.

It was ordered that the same be referred back to City Treasurer with instructions for him to pay the amount due on the same.

A petition from Willamette Steamboat Co. was presented, praying for the privilege of erecting a Ware House, at the foot of the Street first South of Paper Mill, in Oregon City.

It was moved and carried that the said Willamette Steamboat Co. be granted a license to erect said ware house, upon condition that the said company build a side walk and McAdamize or plank the street from said ware house to Main Street at their own expense, also to pass all materials for the use of said City and Fire department free of charge.

On motion the City Recorder

was directed to draw a contract in accordance with the above.

A petition was presented from numerous citizens praying the Council to build stores running from 4th Street up the Bluff to top of same.

On motion the same was referred to Chairman of Street Committee.

A petition was presented from the Oregon City Manufacturing Co. asking assistance to procure an Alarm Bell to be placed in tower of Factory.

On motion the same was referred to Finance Committee.

A. J. Apperson tendered his resignation as chairman of Finance Committee. On motion the same was rejected.

A petition was presented from J. R. Ralston, John Myers and J. H. Thessing asking permission from the City Council to erect an awning with posts resting on curb stone in front of their property.

On motion the prayer of said petition was granted.

A petition was presented from citizens asking a separate School District to be established for that portion lying south of 9th Street and East of High Street.

On motion it was ordered that said petition be referred to the School Committee.

It was ordered that the rate of taxes to be levied for the year 1868 be as follow, To wit:

An Assessment of 3 ½ mills for City Purposes

An Assessment of 3 ½ mills for School Purposes

An Assessment of \$1.00 Poll tax on all persons liable to Poll Tax.

On motion an Ordinance was ordered to be drawn in conformity to the same.

On motion it was ordered that no Road Money be expended, only such as was appropriated by the City Council.

On motion it was ordered that an appropriation of \$300 be made from the Road Fund for the purpose of improving Main and other Streets at the lower end and running to Abernethy Bridge.

On motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to work at least 10 men at a time each day on the Road.

The following ordinance was ordered to be drawn and posted up as required by Law to wit: That the Street Commissioner be required to collect the entire Road Fund, in the District of Oregon City, within forty days (40) from the 25th day of June. And that all parties failing to work when called on and notified according to Law be required to pay to the Street Commissioner the amount of their

Road tax in money (Coin)

On motion an appropriation of \$450.00 to repair and improved the Seminary and fences was ordered and the School Committee were authorized to proceed and make the necessary repairs.

The Street Committee to whom was referred the petition on Stairs up the Bluff made their report which on motion was rec'd and placed on file.

A motion the prayer of said petition was rejected.

On motion it was ordered that the Assessment Roll be returned to the Assessor for correction and for his certificate to be endorsed on the same as required by Law.

The following bills were read and placed in the hands of Finance Committee, to wit:

A petition was received from Mrs. R. Leary asking that she be permitted to sell spirituous and Malt Liquors in less quantities than one quart under a license granted to her deceased husband, until the date of said license expires.

A petition from numerous citizens was presented and read praying that a tax on Dogs be levied.

On motion the petition was ordered to be placed in the hand of the Street Committee and for said Street Committee to report on the same.

A petition on side walk was read and on motion was referred to Street Committee.

On motion an appropriation of \$170 of Road Funds was appropriated, to be expended on the road when Street Commissioner is now at work to fix Bridges on the Hill and to repair side walk going to Seminary.

On motion the City Recorder was instructed to notify the Oregon City Manufacturing Co. to do the work

On motion the Recorder was instructed to give notice that the Assessment Roll would remain open for inspection in the hands of the Recorder until July 20th 1868, after which time it would be placed in the hands of the Collector.

The Street Committee asked further time to report on the matter of Dog ordinance on motion further time was granted.

A petition from Messrs. McNamara asking that their Road Tax be remitted for labor performed in the Street near his own property.

On motion the petition was rejected.

The Finance Committee reported the following bills correct and they were ordered paid, to wit:

On motion the following portion was ordered to be stricken out to wit; "And not allow two out side walls to be built and then filled with loose Rocks as is sometimes done."

Also that in place of Arches, Holes, foot wide by 2 feet high be made on the bedrock.

On motion the batler was ordered to be built in the inside of the trace instead of being on both sides as in the original specification.

A petition was received from the agent of the Oregon City Manufacturing Co. asking to be relieved from contract in building a cement wall and that in place of a cement wall they will build one that will answer purposes. That, whenever the wall which build shall in any manner give way or need repair that they, the Oregon City Manufacturing Co. will keep it in good repair at their own expense.

It was moved and carried that the prayor of the petition be granted and that when the Company enter a bond for the faithful compliance of the petition, that then the former contract shall be given up. It was further ordered that the City Attorney be requested to draw up a proper Bond.

A petition from certain asking that a side walk be built in the Alley running between the property of W. P. Burns and E. LaForest was presented. It was moved and carried that

the petition be laid on the table.

A petition was presented from the People's Transportation Co. asking an abatement in the assessment of their property as returned by the City Assessor for the year 1868.

It was moved and carried that the petitioner be allowed until the next regular meeting of the Council to make a proper affidavit.

In the matter of the levy of taxes for School purpose as by Ordinance No. 74. It is hereby ordered that so much as pertains to the levy for School purposes be repealed. And that the following ordinance be drawn up to wit: Ordinance No. 75

Be it ordained and established by the City Council of Oregon City that an additional tax of one and a half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) mills on the dollar be levied for school purposes for the year 1868. Making a levy of five (5 mills on the dollar (instead of three and a half (3 $\frac{1}{2}$) as by former ordinance.

It is moved and carried that D. P. Thompson one of the members of the City Council be granted a leave of absence indefinitely.

It was moved and carried that the Street Committee be authorized to repair or make a new cross side walk on 5th Street near Logus & Albright's Market.

A bill from J. M. Bacon City Recorder was presented and referred to Finance Committee amounting to 58.00.

It was moved and carried that the office of Nightwatchman be discontinued on and after August 1st 1868 and that the City Recorder be instructed to notify the present watchman of this action. It was moved and carried that the School Committee be instructed to ascertain if the Salary of other School Teachers wages are as high as the wages paid the Teachers in our school, also to ascertain if other Teachers who are equally qualified with those who are now teaching can be hired for less wages than is now paid.

No further business on motion the Council adjourned.

The Street Committee to whom was referred the petition for extending the side walk from the Baptist Church on Main Street made their report.

It was moved and carried that the report be received and that the prayer of said petition be rejected. In the matter of an abatement in the valuation of the assessment of the P. T. Co's property as returned by the City Assessor.

A. A. McCully having filed an affidavit as required by Law.

It was moved and carried that an abatement of Fifteen Thousand Dollars be made in the assessed value of the P. T. Co's property as returned by the City Assessor for the year 1868.

A petition was presented by J. M. Frazer praying that the rails of the Rail Road be removed from in front of his stable &c.

It was moved and carried that the matter be referred to the Recorder to examine and see who should

be at the cost and expense of removing the same and make a report.

A petition was received praying that an appropriation be made from the Road Fund to improve 6th Street on the bluff.

It was moved and carried that an appropriation be made from the road fund of \$200 .dls be expended in improving 6^{th} Street on the bluff and the sum of \$100 for improving 7^{th} Street on the bluff.

George A. Pease represented that he had completed his contract in supplying water in the City, except about 100 feet near the factory, and requested that he be allowed time to complete the same after the Oregon City Manufacturing Co. had built the wall, and he also asked pay for 1 quarters salary, commencing August 1st 1868.

It was moved and carried that G. A. Pease be allowed one weeks time to complete laying the pipe at the South End of contract after the O. C. Man has finished the wall now in course of construction.

- 131, It was moved and carried that a warrant be drawn in favor of G. A. Pease for 1st qr. Salary of 250.00
- 132, The Finance Committee reported the bill of J. M. Bacon, Recorder, is correct and ordered it paid. 59.00
- 133, S. D. Richardson bill, \$35.83

The Superintendent of School presented his report for the year 1867 and 1868 up to July, together with an account current of incidental expenses and receipts.

It was moved and carried that the Report be received and placed on file.

It was moved and carried that the committee on Fire and Water be instructed to ascertain the condition of the hose belonging to the City and to report what number of feet would be required also to take into consideration the necessity of purchasing the Hydrant near J. L. Barlow's and to report by the next meeting.

On motion the Council adjourned.

Wm. Vandervort, Street Commissioner, represented to the Council that certain parties have offered to pay their Road Tax in City Orders and asks instructions in regard thereto.

It was ordered that the Street Commissioner be instructed not to receive City orders in payment of Road Tax.

On motion A. J. Apperson was appointed a temporary member of the Street Committee to fill a vacancy occasioned by the absence of D. P. Thompson.

On motion the Street Committee were authorized to confer and agree with the Oregon City Woolen Factory Company, as to what the City Council will fill the hole in Main Street for where the Factory has built a wall and if said Committee and the O. C. Man. can not agree, that they be authorized to leave it to three disinterested men. Each party selecting one and these two selecting the other if necessary.

It was further ordered that the City Council do the work as agreed upon and that the Street Committee order the Street Commissioner to do the work whenever they deem it necessary.

in regard to filling hole in Main Street on motion the report was adopted.

On motion the Finance Committee were instructed to settle with the O. C. Man. in regard to filling hole in Main Street and to draw the money due the City.

On motion the amount to be filled in the Bond to be given by the O. C. Man. for guaranteeing a perpetual wall &c was fixed at \$3000 in coin.

On motion the Street Committee were instructed to notify all persons owning property on Main Street each side of the wall lately erected by O. C. Man that a side walk was ordered built along side of said wall.

The committee on Fire and Water made a report in regard to Hose &c.

On motion the report was rec'd and adopted and the committees were instructed to purchase a coupling for hose.

A petition was presented from H. Humble, asking the culvert to be repaired between his property and Mr. Caufield.

On motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to clean out all obstructions from the culvert.

A petition was received from H. L. Kelley asking certain Indians be removed from the street near his residence.

On motion the petition was ordered to be laid on the table.

134, A bill from J. Meldrum for 18.00 was ordered paid.

135, A bill from J. Fleming for book for 7.00 was ordered paid.

J. M Bacon's Recorder's bill was read and referred to Finance Committee.

On motion the sum of \$100 from Road Fund was ordered to be expended on the Hill after the sum was expended the Street Commissioner was ordered to suspend the work on the streets and collect the Road Tax due.

On the motion J. W. Chase was allowed the privilege of removing any earth he desired on the cross street between his property and Dr. Barclay's, but to take none except on his side of the street by Mr. Warner's property, for the purpose of building a side walk.

Rule 1. The Mayor, or in his absence, the Recorder shall call the members to order, At the time the Council stands adjourned shall there be no quorum present it shall be the duty of the City Marshall immediately to inform the absent members, except those known to unavoidably detained that their presence is required to enable the Council to proceed to business. Shall they fail to appear on such notice the members present shall adjourn to the next regular meeting which may have been established by the Council.

Rule 2. A quorum being present the Council shall proceed in the absence of the Mayor and Recorder to appoint a president pro-tem after which the first business in order after the roll is called shall be the reading by the Recorder the minutes of the preceding meeting which if not objected to shall be considered as approved.

Rule 3. The Mayor shall announce at each meeting of the Council, the business in order agreeably to the following rules, and no business shall be taken up, or consider, until the class to which it belongs shall be declared to be in order, except as provided in Rule 27 and provided that communications from the Mayor may be read at any time.

Rule 4. The business of the Council shall come up in the following order:

- 1st Petitions, memorial, remonstrances and communications
- 2nd Reports from the Standing Committees, in the order named in Rule 26
- 3rd Reports from Select Committees
- 4th Report of Officers
- 5th Claims against the City
- 6th Reports and business on the table
- 7th Reading of Ordinances
- 8th Propositions, motions and miscellaneous matters

Rule 5. The Mayor shall preserve order and decorum, may speak to points of order, in preference to other members, rising from his seat for that purpose and shall decide all questions of order subject to an appeal to the Council by any two members, on which appeal, no member shall speak more than once without leave of the Council.

Rule 6. The Mayor shall rise to put a question, but may state if sitting.

Rule 7. Questions shall be distinctly put in this form, to wit: As many as one of the opinion that (as the question may be) say Aye and after the affirmative voice is expressed, "As many as are of the contrary opinion, say no." If the Mayor doubt or a division called for, the Council shall divide those of the affirmative of the question, shall first rise, and afterwards those in the negative.

Rule 8. All questions relating to priority of business shall be decided without debate.

Rule 9. When two or more members happen to rise at once, the Mayor shall name who is first to speak. Rule 10. No member shall speak more than twice on the same question without leave of the Council, or more than once until every member choosing to speak shall have spoken.

Rule 11. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be received unless:

1st To amend

2nd To substitute for the original

3rd To refer or commit

4th To lay it on the table

5th To postpone

6th The previous question

7th To adjourn

Rule 12. A motion to adjourn, shall always be in order, except when once put and voted down, it shall not be in order until some other business has been taken up, shall always be decided without debate. Rule 13. When any member is about to speak in debate, or deliver any matter to the Council, he shall rise from his seat and respectfully address the Mayor and shall confine himself to the question in debate, and avoid personalities.

Rule 14. Every member who shall be present when a question is put shall vote for or against the same unless the Council shall excuse him or unless he be immediately interested in which case he shall not vote; but no member shall be permitted to vote on a question when a division is called for, unless present when his name is called in its regular order.

Rule 15. A member of the Council acting as President pro-tem; may vote in all cases in which he might vote, if not so acting.

Rule 16. Whenever it shall be decided that the Council go into the Committee of the Whole, the Mayor shall leave the Chair and appoint a Chairman of the Committee of the Whole, who shall report the proceedings of the Committee.

Rule 17. No motion shall be considered unless the same shall be seconded, when a motion is seconded it shall be stated by the Mayor before debate. It shall be rendered in writing (if desired) by any member of the Council but the member may withdraw it at any time before a decision or an amendment be made to it.

Rule 18. On motion in Committee of the Whole to rise and report the question shall be decided without debate.

Rule 19. If the question in debate contain several points, any member may have the same divided but the mover of the question shall have the right to designate upon which point the vote shall first be taken.

Rule 20. When a question has been once decided, it shall be in order for any member who voted in the majority to move for a reconsideration thereof, but no motion for a reconsideration of a vote shall be made after the Ordinance, resolution or act shall have gone out of the possession of the Board and no motion of such reconsideration shall be made more than once, and provided the motion to reconsider is made the same day of the passage of the matter in question.

Rule 21. Upon a division of the Council the names of those who vote for and those who vote against a question, shall be entered upon the minutes, when any two members will require it, and in such case, it shall be the duty of the Recorder to enter on the minutes the names of the members so calling for a division, and in all appropriations

of public money, the Yeas and Nays shall be called for by the Recorder and recorded, and no proposition shall be deemed to be carried unless four members of the Council have voted on the proposition.

Rule 22. Appointments of officers shall be by ballot and a majority of the members present of the City Council shall be necessary to constitute a choice.

Rule 23. All committees shall report the facts in relating to the matter or subject referred with their opinion thereon in writing and no report shall be received as the report of a committee, except the same be signed by a majority of the committee.

Rule 24. All committees shall be appointed by the Mayor (except when it may be determined that the election be by ballot in the formation of Special Committees) and if not objected to by any member shall be considered as approved by the Council.

Rule 25. There shall be, until otherwise ordered by the Council, five standing committees to consist of three members each.

1st Committee on Finance

2nd Committee on School

3rd Committee on Fire and Water

4th Committee on Streets and Public Property

5th Committee on Health and Police

Rule 26. No standing rule or order of the Council shall be rescinded, or suspended, except by a vote of two-thirds of the members present nor shall the order of business established by the rules of the council be postponed or changed except by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

Rule 27. Upon the final passage of every ordinance, the question shall be taken by yeas and nays and shall be enrolled by the Recorder in a book kept for that purpose.

Rule 28. The previous question, until it is decided, shall preclude all amendments and debate on the main question, and shall be put in this form, to wit: "Shall the main question now be put,"

Rule 29. All questions shall be put in the order they are moved, except in filling blanks, the longest time and the longest sum shall be put first.

Rule 30. A member called to order shall immediately sit down unless permitted to explain and the Council if appealed to shall decide on the case, but without debate, if there be no appeal, the decision of the President shall be submitted to.

Rule 31. A motion "to lay on the table" shall be decided without debate.

Rule 32. The Mayor shall cause the Recorder to make a list of the Ordinances, reports, resolutions or other business on the table, which shall be considered. "Reports on Business on the Table."

Rule 33. The regular meetings of the Council shall be held once a month upon such evenings as may be deemed most convenient by the majority, and the hour of meeting shall be from September 15th to April 15th, 7 o'clock P. M.; from April 15th to September 15th, 7 ½ o'clock P. M.

To the Mayor, City Council, Oregon City

We your finance committee beg leave to report with reference to the bill of A. F. Forbes, City Atty, in the case of Oregon City Manufacturing Co. vs. Kelly and the City Council.

That in our judgment the claim for \$100 is unreasonable and unjust and ought not to be paid. The facts are that Messrs. Heulat & Warren were employed to attend to the case on behalf of the City and

drew up all the papers in the case. The City Atty. simply appeared before the Court and argued upon the papers, and it seems to us that this is simply an attempt upon the part of they City Atty. to take advantage of that provision of the City Charter which provides that he shall attend to all cases in which the City is interested and owing to the fact that the Ordinance providing fees for City Atty. simply provides how much he should have for trying cases before the Mayor & Recorder, and fails to provide what fees he shall have for trying any cases arising before other courts, and which would be very difficult to provide for in any Ordinance for the reason that in equity the fees should depend upon the nature of each case. And in the judgment of our committee thirty (\$30) Dollars would be a reasonable and just fee for the City Atty. in this case; and would recommend that amount be allowed him and no more. For in our judgment a demand for a greater sum would be simply extortion.

Your petitioner was compelled to keep a hired man and expand mooring in said law suit up to 1st of January 1873 in order to establish the City title to said property, without receiving or being allowed to charge one cent for ferryings or to take any thing by way of remuneration for said loss of money and time.

That for the 1st time on the 1st of January 1873 your petitioner charged for ferriage and on the second of January was arrested on two different charges which arrest brought solely in question the City's title to said ferry and in which said suits your petitioner was compelled to pay out on acct. of said lost litigation \$71.75/100 besides delay and trouble connected therewith.

That petitioner has finally succeeded in establishing the City's title so far to said ferry. Outside of certain a Justice of the Peace decision which never reached the real merits of the case the fact that said Justice at the instance of the prosecuting atty dismissed another case pending against petitioner of same nature justifies petitioner in the belief that all serious question is entirely abandoned in reference to disputing the City's title to the ferry.

That the petitioner has paid into the City Treasurer six months rent in advance, to wit fifty dollars on account of said ferry lease and that he has only had the real use of said ferry since Feby 1st 1873 being the time when petitioner commenced charging after his arrest of Jan 2nd 1873.

Section 2. The Street Commissioner is hereby directed to reject any person applying to him for labor as a suitable substitute (under Sec. 24 of an act entitled an Act to Regulate Roads passed Oct. 20th 1860) who comes within the prohibition of Section one of this Ordinance.

Such permit shall contain the name of the minor and specify the hour of the evening during which such minor may be on the said Street, provided that no minor may be deemed a violator of the foregoing section, when accompanied by and in the actual presence of the parent or guardian of such minor, nor when occupied in going to or returning from his or her place of regular work.

Provided that it shall not be deemed as violation of the foregoing section for a minor to go upon the Streets after said hour in any case of actual urgent and imperative necessity.

Sect. 3. Any minor found guilty before the Mayor or Recorder of violation of the provisions of the first section of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars or imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding five days or both in the discretion of the Court.

Sect. 4. All persons accused of violation of this Ordinance shall be permitted to testify in their own behalf.

Sect. 5. The Marshal shall take up all permits when exhibited and file the same with the City Recorder within twenty four hours thereafter.

Sect. 6. It shall be the duty of the Marshal to cause one of the fire bells to ring fifteen minutes before the time named in Section one of this Ordinance and again at said time.

Sect. 7. All citizens are hereby authorized to arrest and deliver to the Marshal any violator of the provisions of this Ordinance.
