Absent: Councilmen Frank Busch, L. C. Caples, Thos. E. Gault

On motion the Recorder was instructed and authorized to purchase a Record Book and procure a supply of blank warrants.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to publish notice of the General Election to be held for the Election of Officers on the first Monday, being the sixth day of December, as required by the City Charter.

The following Ordinances were read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of M. E. Bain, Publisher of the Oregon City Press, that the same had been published as required by the City Charter, on motion

and roll call each of them were passed as read, all of them receiving the unanimous vote in the affirmative of the City Council excepting Ordinance No. 1 which was passed by the following Councilmen voting in the affirmative: John Bittner, Rudolph Koerner, James Roake and R. D. Wilson. Councilman H. E. Harris

voting in opposition to the same.

Ordinance No. 1

An Ordinance regulating the use of the public streets, highways, alleys and sidewalks of Oregon City.

Ordinance No. 204 An Ordinance relating to the impounding, sale and redemption of animals.

Ordinance No. 205 An Ordinance to provide for the erection, care or removal of telephone, telegraph and electric wires and poles.

Ordinance No. 206 An Ordinance to regulate the building of flues and chimneys, entrances to public buildings and for the prevention of fires.

Ordinance No. 207

An Ordinance providing for the licensing and regulating the carrying on of certain professions, trades, callings and occupations carried on within the corporate limits of Oregon City, Oregon.

Ordinance No. 208 An Ordinance regulating the registry of dogs and providing for the taking up, impounding and killing of dogs without tags.

Ordinance No. 209 An Ordinance providing for the punishment of disorderly persons, and keepers and owners of disorderly houses.

Entitled and Ordinance to prevent the spreading of contagious, infectious or epidemic diseases and to prescribe the duties of the Committee on Health and Police in relation thereto.

Minutes of the regular monthly session held on November 3rd and adjourned meeting held on November 17th read and approved.

Application of Z. C. Wood for renewal of license for saloon on the west side of Main Street between Third and Fourth Streets to date from December 15, read, and it appearing from the affidavit of M. E. Bain, Publisher of the Oregon City Press, that notice of intention to apply for said license had been published as required by law, and that no remonstrance had been filed, on motion the petition was granted and the Recorder authorized to issue said license.

Communication of the Board of Water Commissioners, enclosing check for \$100.00 as payment on account due the city for percent of collections for water rates, read and on motion the communication was ordered filed and

the check turned over to the City Treasurer for the benefit of the General Fund.

The monthly report of the Recorder read and ordered placed on file.

The following claims against the City, having been examined and found correct by the Finance Committee, who recommended the drawing of warrants in payment of same, were read and on motion and roll call the same were allowed and warrants were ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of the several claimants for the respective amounts.

Ordinance No. 219

Entitled an Ordinance to license, tax, regulate and certain barkeepers, saloon keepers and dealers in spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, barrooms, drinking shops or places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are kept for sale, or in any manner disposed of, and the disposal thereof was read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of M. E. Bain, Publisher of the Oregon City Press, that the said Ordinance had been published in issue of said paper dated Nov. 6th on motion

and roll call the Ordinance was placed upon its final passage and receiving the unanimous vote of the members of the Council present, it was declared as passed by the Mayor.

Ordinance No. 220

An Ordinance providing for the purchase of 200 yards of crushed rock, was read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of M. E. Bain, Publisher of the Oregon City Press, that the said Ordinance had been published in the issues of said paper dated Nov. 6th and 10th, on motion and roll call the said Ordinance was placed upon its final passage.

Councilmen Busch, Harris, Koerner, and Roake voted in the affirmative and Councilman Wilson voted in the negative and the Mayor declared that the Ordinance had received a majority of the votes of the Council present and that the Ordinance was passed.

On motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to confer with Mr. Harding and other property owners in regard to the improvement of Tenth Street from Main Street to the road leading up the bluff. The following Resolutions were presented by Councilman R. Koerner and on motion were passed by the unanimous vote of the Council.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property is hereby instructed to make arrangements with the Portland General Electric Company for the purpose of placing five (5) incandescent lights along the road to Elyville east of the square at the head of Seventh Street, providing it can be done, without more cost per light than the City is paying now.

Resolved, that the Committee on Streets and Public Property be instructed to confer with the Portland General Electric Company

in regard to the entering into a contract to furnish more and better lights at reduction of present rates, and to report their findings to the Council at next meeting. On motion Council adjourned to meet December 8, at 7:30 P. M. Thos. F. Ryan Recorder December 8, 1897

On motion, the Council resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to canvas the vote for the Election of the City Officers as shown by the returns of the Judges and Clerks of Election held Dec. 6, 1897. Councilman R. Koerner acting as Chairman.

On rising from sitting as a Committee of the Whole the following report was submitted of the findings of said committee.

To the Honorable, the Mayor and City Council: We the undersigned, members of the City Council of Oregon City, while acting as a Committee of the Whole for the purpose of canvassing the returns of the General Election held on the 6th day of December for the Election of City Officers respectfully submit the following: Whole number of votes cast for Mayor in the First Ward - 330 E. G. Caufield received of the same -188J. W. Powell received of the same – 142 Majority for E. G. Caufield, 46 Whole number of votes case for Mayor in the Second Ward -332. E. G. Caufield received of the same -229J. W. Powell, received of the same -103Majority for E. G. Caufield – 126 We find that E. G. Caufield received in both wards -417We find that J. W. Powell received in both wards -245E. G. Caufield was elected by a majority of 172 Whole number of votes case for Treasurer in First Ward - 252 of which H. E. Straight received – 252 Whole number of votes for Treasurer in Second Ward - 265 of which H. E. Straight received -265We find that H. E. Straight was elected Treasurer of Oregon City by a majority vote of -517

For Councilman in the First Ward Rudolph Koerner received 213 For Councilman in the First Ward C. D. Latourette received 184 For Councilman in the First Ward John Bittner received 124 For Councilman in the First Ward H. C. Stevens received 118 We find that Rudolph Koerner and C. D. Latourette received a majority of all the votes cast and are duly elected as Councilmen in the First Ward for a term of two years.

For Councilman in the Second Ward Fred Metzner received 191 For Councilman in the Second Ward Arthur Milln received 172 For Councilman in the Second Ward Geo. Broughton received 163 For Councilman in the Second Ward S. Walker received 117 We find that Fred Metzner and Arthur Milln received a majority of all the votes cast and are duly elected as Councilmen in the Second Ward for a term of two years.

Minutes of regular meeting of the Council held on December 1st and adjourned meeting held on December 8th read and approved.

The Council proceeded to the election of a President of the Council for the ensuing year.

Rudolph Koerner was placed in nomination.

No further nominations being made on motion the Recorder was instructed to cast the unanimous vote of the Council in favor of Mr. Koerner.

The vote was cast and the Mayor declared Rudolph Koerner duly elected President of the City Council of Oregon City for the ensuing year.

The Council proceeded to the election of a Recorder to serve during the year 1898, the Mayor appointing as tellers Councilmen Harris and Busch.

Thos. F. Ryan and Fred Hesse were placed in nomination

and the Council proceeded to ballot with the following result: Thos. F. Ryan received five votes and Fred Hesse received three votes. Thos. F. Ryan having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected Recorder for the ensuing year.

The next order of business was declared to be the election of standing committees for the year. On motion the Recorder was instructed to cast the ballot of the Council in favor of the following Councilmen for the respective committees.

Finance Committee: Rudolph Koerner, Chairman. Frank Busch, Chas. D. Latourette Fire and Water: Frank Busch, Chairman. Arthur Milln, Henry E. Harris Health and Police: Robert Wilson, Chairman. Fred Metzner, Chas. D. Latourette Cemetery: James Roake, Chairman. Rudolph Koerner, Arthur Milln Streets and Public Property: Henry E. Harris, Chairman. James Roake, Fred Metzner

The Recorder having cast the ballot as directed by the Mayor declared the said Councilmen duly elected on the several committees as above set forth, for the ensuing year.

Petition of Jacob Rauch and nine others for an incandescent light to be located on the Southwest corner of J. Q. Adams

and Ninth Streets, read and on motion was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Petition of the Willamette Bowling Alley, by its manager John Bean, for permission to run its alley on Sundays was read and a motion was made to grant the request of the petitioner.

And amendment was offered that the Mayor and Police Officers be instructed to allow the running of said Alley on Sunday afternoons, it being understood that the Alley should be conducted in an orderly and quiet manner, keeping the front door closed and the sidewalk clear of loungers.

The mover of the original motion accepting the amendment the vote was taken and the motion adopted, all members voting in the affirmative with the exception of Councilman Roake.

Communication of Chas. H. Dye, Attorney for the City in the injunction suit brought by the Estate of M. A. Stratton to prevent the selling of property on account of improvement of Seventh Street, he stating that the same was tried on demurrer in the Circuit Court, resulting in a decision in favor of the City, and that judgment had been entered dismissing the suit at Plaintiff's cost, and that the matter was completed as far as the Circuit Court was concerned, read and on motion the same was ordered filed.

The Mayor then read his annual message to the Council, which on motion was ordered placed on file.

The report of the Recorder for the month of December was read and ordered filed.

The annual report of the Recorder was read and on motion was ordered placed on file.

The annual and quarterly reports of the Treasurer were read

and on motion were referred to the Finance Committee.

The semi-annual report of the Board of Water Commissioners was read and on motion was ordered referred to the Finance Committee and a copy of the same ordered published.

The Mayor announced the following appointments for the ensuing year, which were on motions confirmed by the Council.

On motion it was voted that the Regular monthly meetings of the Council should be held on the First Wednesday of each month.

G. B. Dimick appearing before the Council on behalf of Cataract Hose Company, and, stating that the condition of the House of said company was badly in need of repairs, on motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to investigate and ascertain what was necessary to be done to place the building in good condition and to report their findings to the Council, provided that the committee be empowered to repair at once any leaks or other matter that it would be necessary to have done at once to protect the property.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to invite sealed bids to be opened at the next meeting of the Council, for the printing of the Ordinances of the City in Pamphlet form.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property made a verbal report in the matter of lighting the outlying districts of the City, stating that they had interviewed Mr. Good, the Superintendent of Portland General Electric Company, who had informed them that no reduction would be made in the cost of lighting and that he had requested them to furnish him with an estimate of new extensions required, before he could make any arrangements looking towards making rates on same.

Ordinance No. 255

Entitled and ordinance declaring the probable cost of the proposed system of sewerage as provided for in Ordinance No. 252 and assessing the cost thereof among the several property owners benefited thereby, was read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of A. W. Thornton, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said ordinance had been published as required by Charter on motion and roll call it was placed upon its final passage and declared passed. All Councilmen present voting in affirmative.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to mail postal cards to each person assessed under Ordinance No. 255 notifying them that if they desired to take advantage of the Bancroft Act that it was necessary to make application in writing to the Recorder. The Recorder was also instructed to publish to the same effect.

The Committee on road in south end of City submitted a report stating that Mr. Cunningham would make an estimate of the cost of building road for \$95.00 and recommending that he be employed. On motion the report was adopted and the Committee authorized to employ Mr. Cunningham.

Thornton, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said notice of application had been published as required by Charter and it further appearing that no remonstrance to the granting of the same has been made on motion the Recorder was authorized to issue said license.

A communication from the Water Commission stating that the water main was not large enough to place a fire hydrant on Madison Street but that the Board would place a hydrant on 4th & Jefferson Sts. if the Council would furnish a hydrant and also asking the Council to investigate the

manner in which water was used in sewer flushing tanks and take some measure to reduce the amount of water used. On motion the matter of placing hydrants and also the matter of use of water in flushing tanks was placed in the hands of the Committee on Fire & Water with power to act.

A communication from F. E. asked that the Council again take the matter up whereupon the following resolution was introduced: Resolved that whereas there is a dispute between the City and the contractors for building of sewer in respect to extra work on Center Street sewer and branches on streets and alleys west of Center Street an din order to obtain settlement of said dispute it is proposed to pay said contractors \$772.20 for extra excavation on center Street and three and 60/100 dollars per yard for extra excavation on streets and alleys west of Center. This proposition is made solely for the a proposed settlement of said dispute and shall not in any way admit liability on the part of the City or prejudice its rights of defense and shall be accepted within ten days or be considered withdrawn.

On motion the foregoing resolution was unanimously adopted.

The report and estimate No. 2 of Mr. Cunningham showing that work amounting to \$3,429.34 had been performed by Mitchell & Hard Contractors, on the sewers of sewer Dist. No. 1 since last estimate and that under the terms of the contract 25% of said amount was to be retained by the City, that \$2,472.00 was due said contractors on account of sewers.

On motion and roll call the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the sewer fund in favor of Mitchell & Hard for \$2,572.01 as a payment for construction of sewers in Sewer Dist. No. 2.

The report of the Engineer, Mr. Cunningham, stating that many changes were necessary in the sewer system on account of the incompleteness of the plans furnished by Mr. Kelly, and that such changes had been made as the work progressed; that the changes were unavoidable and that while they increased the cost of the work, the result was a vastly improved system; that the contractors, Mitchell & Hard; has up to this time performed work to the value of \$12,077.57 that under the terms of the contract 25% of the amount was to be retained by the City, also that payment amounting to \$4,100.97 had been made

and that there was due Mitchell & Hard, Contractors, at this time on account of sewer contract the sum of \$4,957,21.

On motion and roll call the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant on the sewer fund for \$4,957.21 in favor of Mitchell & Hard as a payment on account of sewer contract.

In the matter of advertising for bids for Sewer bonds the following resolution was adopted: Resolved that the Recorder advertise in the two Oregon City papers that at a meeting of the Council to be held Dec. 20, 1900 bids will be opened for sale of \$12,000.00 Sewer Bonds. That such bonds will be sold to the highest resident bidders in lots of not to exceed \$500.00 to any one person.

M. Thursday December 20, 1900.

On motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to notify the property owners on Washington Street between 5th & 7th Streets that they must improve Washington Street adjoining their property.

On motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was authorized to repair the culvert on Singer Hill, at a cost not to exceed \$25.00.

On motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to notify all parties whose sidewalks were out of repair and to give them 10 days to repair same and if they did not do so to repair said walks and report the same to the Council.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to advertise for proposals for Sewer bonds said bonds to be sold in amounts not to exceed \$500.00 to any one person at a premium of 2% and to be

sold to resident buyers only.

On motion the Council resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to canvas the vote for the election of City Officers as shown by the returns of the Judges & Clerks of Election held December 3, 1900, Councilman Powell, President of the Council acting Chairman.

Porter, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said ordinance had been published as required by Charter, was read the second time and upon motion of the Council Charman placed upon final passage.

Councilman Albright moved that the ordinance be amended by the adoption of the following amendments: substitute for Section 6 the following: Sec. 6 That the said Fred S. Morris, his successors and assigns are hereby granted the rights and privileges to operate passenger cars on and upon any of the aforementioned streets of the City of Oregon City, for a period of forty-three (43) years from the date of the approval of this ordinance and the said Fred S. Morris, his successors and assigns is entitled to collect tolls therefore. Strike out Section 8.

Add to the ordinance the following:

Morris, his successors and assigns the right and privilege to operate freight and express cars along and upon any street railway constructed upon any of the aforementioned streets of the City of Oregon City for period of Five (5) years from the date of the approval of this ordinance, and the said Fred S. Morris, his successors and assigns, is entitled to collect charges and tolls therefore.

Sec. 14. The said Fred S. Morris, his successors and assigns shall pay annually to the City of Oregon City as a license for the privileges granted hereto, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum payable on the first day of January of each year.

Sec. 15. All ordinances granting franchises to the East Side Railway Company, its successors and assigns, are hereby repealed and the said Fred S. Morris as successor of the East Side Railway Company, shall file his approval of all provisions of this ordinance, also relinquish any and all rights and privileges conferred upon the said East Side Railway Company by former ordinances within sixty days from the date of the approval of this ordinance. A failure on the part of the said Fred S. Morris, his successors and assigns to file the aforesaid approval and relinquishment, shall be deemed to have abandoned all rights and privileges conferred by this ordinance.

Said motion to amend was duly seconded by C. G. Huntley. Councilman Powell moved that the said amendments be laid on the table and motion was duly seconded, put and carried.

On motion the Cemetery Committee was authorized to have the cemetery put in condition for Decoration Day and said committee was also authorized by motion to have plans prepared for graveling the roadway in the cemetery.

On motion the Finance Committee was authorized to look into the matter of the City printing and to report at the next meeting.

On motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was authorized to repair the watering trough at Elyville.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property made a verbal report stating that in the matter of the electric lights at 4th Street and 8th & Main St. they believed said lights as necessary as other lights on Main Street and recommending that said lights remain, on motion duly seconded the report was adopted.

On motion duly seconded the Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to confer with the Portland General Electric Company and obtain a reduction of cost of lighting the City.
