The Council of Oregon City met in Regular Session on the above date at the hour of 7:30 P. M.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held September 2, 1903 and special meeting of September 11th 1903 read and approved.

The resignation of S. E. Pheister as Councilman from the Second Ward was read and upon motion accepted.

The petition of Mr. Woodward asking leave to erect sign boards on 10th Street and on Singer Hill was read and upon motion referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property to report.

The petition of Sugarman & Co. offering to purchase the City's "old iron" was read and upon motion referred to the Committee on Streets & Public Property with power to act.

The Recorder's report for September was read and ordered filed.

The Treasurer's report for the quarter ending September 30th 1903 was read and upon motion referred to the Finance Committee.

The Finance Committee submitted a report showing that bids for the Sewer Improvement Bonds of Sewer District No. 3 were received as follows:

Chas. H. Caufield, par value, accrued interest & 5 1/10 % premium; C. D. & D. C. Latourette, par value, accrued interest and 2 1/10 premium; Ellingwood, Chicago, par value and accrued interest and that the bids had been awarded to Chas. H. Caufield at the sum bid. On motion the report was approved.

The Finance Committee submitted a report stating that the report of the Treasurer for the quarter ending March 31, 1903 had been examined and found correct and recommending its approval. Upon motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Streets & Public Property submitted a report regarding the coast of a fill on Main Street from 11th to 12th Streets, on motion the report was ordered filed.

The Finance Committee reported that the case of Oregon City vs. Oregon Street Railroad Company would be argued during October.

On motion it was ordered that the matter of continuing the improvement of Jackson Street be placed in the hands of the Street Committee.

The following Resolution was read:

Whereas it is necessary for the Main sewer of Sewer District No. 3 to cross over and upon Lot 4 of Block 10 of Oregon City, Oregon, in order to avoid added cost of construction and,

Whereas in order to obtain permission to cross over and upon said Lot it is necessary to cancel the assessment on said Lot for the construction of the sewers of Sewer District No. 3,

Now, therefore, Be it Resolved by the Council of Oregon City that the assessment made upon Lot 4 of Block 10 of Oregon City, Oregon, amounting to \$58.84 for the construction of sewers of Sewer District No. 3 be and the same is hereby ordered canceled upon the delivery to Oregon City of a deed of easement over and upon said Lot for the said sewer, and upon motion the forgoing Resolution was unanimously adopted.

The following Resolution was read:

Whereas a large number of the property owners assessed for the cost of the improvement of Jackson Street from the southerly line of Fifth Street to the southerly line of Thirteenth Street of Oregon City, Oregon have made application to pay their said assessments for said improvement by installments as provided by an Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon entitled "An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and laying sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of the costs of such improvement and laying of sewers by installments, "filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 22, 1893, as amended by an Act entitled "An Act to amend Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7 of an act entitled "An Act to

provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and laying of sewers in incorporated cities and for the payment of the costs of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 22nd 1893, approved February 28th 1901 and

Whereas the aggregated amount of said applications is the sum of \$2,637.58 and

Whereas, it is necessary under said Act to sell bonds to provide said amount,

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved that the Finance Committee of this Council be and is hereby authorized and instructed to advertise for bids for the sale of Street Improvement Bonds amounting to \$2,637.58 as provided by said Act of the Legislature, said Resolution was upon motion unanimously adopted.

An Ordinance entitled "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of the act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon known as the "Bonding Act" as the same has been amended, was read the first time and upon motion ordered published.

The City Engineer submitted estimate No. 4 on the work performed showing that work aggregating the sum of \$14,805.74 has been performed, that 75% of said amount is \$11,104.31. That previous payment amounting to \$9,803.43 has been paid the contractor and that the amount due the contractor at this time is \$1,301.88. Upon motion the estimate was ordered filed and upon roll call the Recorder was instructed to draw a warrant upon the Sewer Fund of Sewer

District No. 3 in favor of E. W. Riner for the sum of \$1,301.88.

Upon motion the matter of Reddaway, Myers & Trullinger & Welch assessments for the Jackson Street Improvement was placed in the hands of the Finance Committee for consideration.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Cemetery Committee be authorized to adopt such a system of records as they deemed necessary and also to have the Cemetery plats recorded.

Upon motion the Finance Committee was authorized to have the City Records indexed.

The Mayor announced that the election of a Councilman from the Second Ward to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of S. E. Pheister was in order.

H. L. Kelly was nominated. There being no further nominations, the nominations were declared closed and upon roll call the Recorder was instructed to cast the ballot of the entire Council for H. L. Kelly. The Recorder cast the ballot for H. L. Kelly as Councilman from the Second Ward. Whereupon the Mayor declared Mr. Kelly duly elected as Councilman.

Upon motion and roll call the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants upon the Jackson Street Improvement Fund to the amount of \$3,000.00 in favor of John Bittner for improvement of said Jackson Street.

Upon motion the Council adjourned.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council of October 7, 1903 read and approved.

The application of Kelly and Ruconich for renewal of saloon license for saloon on Main Street near 7th Street; of A. Knapp for renewal of saloon license for saloon at corner of Main and 5th Streets; of A. H. Griessen for renewal of saloon license for saloon at corner of Main and 6th Streets; of Phil. Roos for renewal of saloon license for saloon at corner of Main and 8th Streets and E. Matthies for renewal of saloon license for saloon on 8th Street near Main Street were read, and it appearing from the affidavit of L. L. Porter, publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said applicants had published notice of their intention to make application at

this time and it further appearing that no remonstrance or objection to the granting of same has been filed, on motion the applications were allowed and the Recorder instructed to issue said licenses.

The application of F. J. Meyer et al asking that an electric light be placed at the corner of 7th & Jackson Streets was read and upon motion referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to place said light on 7th & Jackson Streets or at such place on Jackson Street as may be necessary.

The petition of G. W. Church asking leave to place a warehouse on Railroad Avenue was read and upon motion referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with instructions to report at next meeting.

The Recorder's report for October 1903 was read and ordered filed.

Mrs. Davoren's claim for damages was referred to the Finance Committee to report at next meeting.

The Finance Committee submitted a report regarding the Jackson Street assessment upon the property of Reddaway, Trullinger, W. Myers and Dr. Welch stating the amount of the assessment they were willing to pay upon motion the matter was referred back to the Finance Committee to agree with the parties regarding said assessment.

The Finance Committee submitted a report stating the Mr. D. C. Latourette has bid the face a accrued interest on the \$2,637.58 worth of improvement bonds (Jackson Street) upon motion the report was accepted and the bonds ordered sold to Mr. D. C. Latourette.

Upon motion it was ordered that the amount paid the Oregon City Machine Company for shaft, to wit the sum of \$75.00 together with the freight on said shaft be deducted from the rental of the rock crusher.

Ordinance No. 294

Entitled an ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of the Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon known as the Bonding Act as the same has been amended was read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of L. L. Porter, publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said ordinance had been published as required by law, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows, Ayes: Huntley, Koerner, Kelly, Mason, Powell, Scott & Sheahan (7). Noes none. Absent: Councilman Story. Not voting, Councilman H. L. Kelly (1). The Mayor declared the ordinance passed.

Upon motion the Committee on Health and Police was authorized to purchase 3 locks and locker for the City Jail.

H. E. Harris made application to put in a railroad switch at or near his property at 12th and Main Streets, said application was granted provided said switch was constructed under the supervision of the Committee on Streets and Public Property and said switch to remain or be removed at the pleasure of the Council.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to have 1,000 posters printed upon paper and 24 upon cloth containing the proposed amendment to the City Charter to be voted for at next election and the Chief of Police was instructed to tack up said posters.

Upon motion and roll call the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants upon the Jackson Street Improvement Fund in favor of John Bittner for \$2,000.00 for the Jackson Street Improvement.

Upon motion it was ordered that when the Council adjourns it adjourn until Friday November 6, 1903 at 8 o'clock P. M.

The matter of providing a plot for the erection of a monument to the memory of Dr. John McLoughlin was presented to the Council by Mr. C. B. Moore upon behalf of the Ladies of the Lewis and Clark Club of Oregon City. Upon motion the matter was referred to a special committee appointed by the Mayor consisting of Councilmen E. D. Kelly, H. L. Kelly and Dr. Powell to confer with the Ladies of said Lewis and Clark Club.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to publish notice of the City Election to be held Monday, December 7, 1903, and the several engine houses were selected as polling places and the following Judges and Clerks were chosen:

Whereas the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon has rendered a decision holding that the tax law known as the "Phelps Law" makes no permanent provision for a tax levy prior to September 1st, 1904 and

Whereas the indebtedness of Oregon City would be greatly increased by the failure to make the tax levy at the usual time, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the Legislature of the State of Oregon should be convened in extra session to remedy the defect in said law.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, that the Council of Oregon City, does hereby petition the

Governor of the State of Oregon to convene the Legislature in extra session, that said law may be remedied.

Upon motion the foregoing resolution was unanimously adopted and the Recorder instructed to forward a copy of said resolution to the Governor.

The City Engineer submitted a report showing that the work on the sewers of Sewer District No. 3 of Oregon City has been completed according to the plans and specifications, that the total cost of the said work as performed by the contractor was \$14,903.74 upon which payments amounting to the sum of \$11,104.32 have been made.

Whereas, the bid of Jones & McKay for the grading of Center Street to the center of said street in front of and abutting Lots 3 and 4 of Block 81 is the sum of \$300.00 and an excessive amount for the said work and would be an unreasonable burden upon the property subject to pay the assessment therefore, and

Whereas there are errors in the extension of the amounts in cash of said bids,

No therefore, be it resolved, by the Council of Oregon City that the said bids and

each of them be and the same are hereby rejected for the reasons heretofore stated and the Recorder is hereby instructed to return to said bidders their certified checks deposited with said bids and the Committee on Streets and Public Property is hereby instructed to re-advertise for bids for said improvements as provided by said Ordinance No. 304.

And, whereas, by said ordinance a contract is to be entered into by and between the Southern Pacific Company, as lessee of the Oregon & California Railroad Company, and said Oregon City, said contract to be prepared by said Oregon & California Railroad Company and to be subject to the approval of the Common Council of Oregon City and when approved by said Common Council to be executed on behalf of said City by the Mayor and Recorder of said City, and a duplicate thereof to be file din the office of said Recorder;

And whereas, said contract with attached plans and specifications has been prepared and submitted to said Common Council by said Oregon & California Railroad company;

And whereas, said contract with attached plans and specifications is satisfactory to said Common Council'

And, whereas, said Common Council and the Mayor and Recorder of said city have by order of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Clackamas County been restrained and enjoined from entering into said contract.

Therefore, Be it Resolved by said Common Council of Oregon City that the contract with plans and specifications

attached as submitted to said Common Council by said Oregon & California Railroad Company be and the same is declared satisfactory to said Common Council, and that the Mayor and Recorder of said city be and they are hereby authorized and directed as soon as permitted so to do by the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Clackamas County to enter into, sign and execute said contract as drawn and submitted.

Whereas it is commonly known that the said drug stores, within the corporate limits of Oregon City, sell large quantities of vinous and spirituous liquors retailed as a beverage, without any physician's prescription, therefor, and

Whereas the said drug stores have no liquor license, authorizing them to sell said

spirituous and vinous liquors, as a beverage within the corporate limits of Oregon City, therefor be it Resolved that the said drug stores be compelled to take out a liquor license, in compliance with said Ordinance No. 219, and be it further resolved that the Mayor immediately cause the police to strictly enforce said Ordinance No. 219.

Upon motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to notify residents and property owners living along the Promenade between 2^{nd} & 6^{th} Streets to move their fences off from city property.

The committee consisting of Councilmen Mason, Brandt and Chapman appointed to confer with the G. A. R. in regard to the purchase of lighting material in the City band stand reported unfavorable as to the purchase of said lighting material

and upon motion said report was adopted.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to look up and draft an ordinance covering the use of explosives within the City limits.

It was moved and seconded that the Committee on Streets and Public Property put gravel upon lower Main Street between 12th & 14th Streets, which motion was amended to the effect that said committee put Cazadero crushed rock upon said street in the place of gravel, an amendment to the amendment was offered to the effect that one block be improved with crushed rock and one block with gravel, upon the amendment to the amendment being put the same was carried, and the Mayor declared that it carried the original motion with it.

Upon motion the Finance Committee was empowered to confer with, arrange for and employ the City Attorney to commence suit against residents along the Promenade between 3rd and 6th

Streets to open city property heretofore fenced by private individuals.

Upon motion the City Engineer and City Attorney were instructed to draw up an ordinance covering the laying of sewer and water pipes in improved streets, the digging up, the improvement of the streets and replacing the same, also covering fee for the City Engineer.

Upon motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to get a reserve of 100 yards of crushed rock, place the same upon the hill in reserve for patch work on the streets.

for the partial payment of the assessments for the laying of sewers in Sewer District No. 3 of Oregon City, Oregon, upon application of certain property owners owning certain property in said Sewer District assessed for the laying of said sewers, said bonds having date of September 1st 1903, and whereas two of said bonds and dated as aforesaid bear the numbers 28 & 29 and are of the face value of \$500 each, and are therefore subject to cancellation upon the 1st day of September 1905 upon the payment of the face value thereof and the accrued interest thereon.

Now therefore be it resolved, by the Council of Oregon City, Oregon that said improvement bonds No. 28 & 29, bearing date of September 1, 1903 be and the same are hereby ordered taken up, the face value thereof together with the accrued interest thereon paid, and that the interest on said improvement bonds No. 28 & 29 shall close at and after the 1st day of September 1905, and that said improvement bonds be canceled.

And that due notice of the taking up and cancellation and payment of said bonds and the ceasing of interest thereon, be and is hereby ordered published as required by the law under which said bonds were issued.

The petition of property owners, adjacent to the proposed 5th Street improvement, asking that the improvement of said street be as follows, 40 feet roadway, 10 feet sidewalks, concrete curbs, and crushed rock, and that the grade of said street between Railroad Avenue and

The committee of the whole, composed of the nine Councilmen, the Mayor and City Engineer, to which committee had been referred the matter of the vacation of certain streets and alleys, in Central Addition to Oregon City, recommended that at present no action be taken on the aforesaid vacation, choosing to await until a decision was rendered regarding the recent vacation of portions of 11th & Moss Streets, said vacation having been taken to Court.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property to which committee had been referred the matter of investigating the advisability of erecting a flight of steps at Main & 15th Streets, reported to the Council that it was not advisable to build said steps.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to notify the Portland General Electric Company to move the arc light now located at 9th and Monroe Streets to 9th & J. Q. Adams Streets, also to install an arc light on the south end road about one block south of Third Street.

That portion of the agreement with the Portland General Electric Company with the city, relative to the location and re-location of arc lights in the city, was read to the Council by the Recorder.

Upon motion the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of probable cost for the improvement of J. Q. Adams Street, Oregon City from the south line of Seventh Street to the north line of Sixth Street and report the same to the Council.

The affidavit of John W. Cochran, chief clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise, the city official paper, showing that notice of the establishment of the grade of 12th Street from the east line of Main Street easterly to the west line of Jackson Street, that notice of the improvement of J. Q. Adams Street from the south line of Seventh Street to the north line of Sixth Street, that notice of assessment for improving alley in Block 22, Oregon City, from the east line of Main Street easterly a distance of 160 feet, had been published as by City Charter provided, were each read and ordered filed.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to publish notice that sealed bids for furnishing the city lumber for the ensuing year would be received by the Council; also the Recorder was instructed to notify each of the city papers to present bids to the Council for city printing for the ensuing year.

Upon motion the matter of fenced up alleys and streets in the city limits, fenced by private individuals, was laid over until next regular meeting of the Council and the Street Superintendent was instructed to report as many of such instances to the Council at its next regular meeting as he was able to find in the intervening time.

Upon motion the matter of repairing the trestle or bridge on Main Street north of Fourteenth Street was left in the hands of the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

The following resolution was read and upon motion adopted:

Whereas under the terms of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as the Bonding Act, as the same has been amended, there is a provision providing for the cancellation of improvement bonds, at or after one year from the date of said bonds, upon the payment

of the face of said bonds, with interest to the date of payment, and

Whereas Oregon City did issue improvement bonds for the partial payment of the assessments for the improvement of Jackson Street from the southerly line of Fifth Street to the southerly line of Thirteenth Street of Oregon City, Oregon, upon application of certain property owners, owning certain property along said Jackson Street, asses for the improvements of said street, said bonds hearing date of October 1st, 1903 and Whereas one of said bonds dated as aforesaid bears the No. of 43 and is of the face value of \$500.00 and is therefore subject to cancellation upon the 1st day of April 1906, upon the payment of the face value thereof and the accrued interest thereof.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, by the Council of Oregon City, Oregon, that said improvement bond No. 43, bearing date of October 1st 1903, be and the same is hereby ordered taken up, the face3 value thereof and the accrued interest thereon paid, and that the interest on said improvement bond No. 43, shall cease at and after the first day of April 1906; and that said improvement bond be canceled; and that due notice of the taking up of said bond and the cancellation and payment of the same, and the ceasing of interest thereon, be and hereby is ordered published as required by the law under which said bond was issued.

The report of the City Engineer reporting a proposed grade for 12th Street, from the easterly line of Main Street to the west line of Jackson Street was read and ordered accepted by the Council. Said report was attached to the following ordinance.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property recommended to the Council that in connecting the Congregational Church with a sewer, that the same be connected onto Sewer District No. 3, by crossing private property, said committee also reported that the lumber for sidewalks on Willamette Street, also at the Public Square on Center, 7th & 8th Streets was on hand and that said walks would soon be built.

Upon motion the matter of the collection of the ten percent back road tax due the City from the County for several years was left in the hands of the Finance Committee with power to act, and with additional power to employ the City Attorney in said matter if necessary.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to write the Portland General Electric Company and the Pacific States Telephone & Telegraph Company in regard to installing an electric alarm between the central telephone office and the power plant of the Portland General Electric Company for us in case of fire or other accident in shutting off the electric current.

Mr. J. J. Cooke appeared before the Council and asked that the owners of Lots 5 & 6 Block 62 be required to clean up said lots and put in a new sidewalk, on the Washington Street side of said lots at the intersection of said Washington Street with Fifth Street. Upon motion the Street Superintendent was instructed to notify the owner of said property to clean off the dead grass on said property and build said sidewalk on the Washington Street side of said property at the intersection of Fifth Street.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

Whereas repeated failures of savings banks involving the savings of small wage earners

and others have demonstrated the necessity of a system by which such savings can be made absolutely secure, and

Whereas the question has been solved in other countries by the institution of Postal Savings banks which have proven effective in encouraging thrift and economy among the people, therefore, be it Resolved that we favor the establishment of Postal Savings Banks in the United States and urge upon Congress

a speedy enactment of the necessary laws for that purpose.

The following resolution was read, and adopted by the Council.

Resolution

Whereas under the terms of an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as the "Bonding Act" as the same has been amended there is a provision for the cancellation of improvement bonds at or after one year from the date of said bonds upon the payment of the face of said bonds and interest to the date of payment, and Whereas Oregon City did issue improvement bonds for the partial payment of the assessments for improving Center Street from 1st Street southerly to 16th Street, upon application of certain property owners owning certain property along said Center Street assessed for the improvement of said street said bonds having date of Nov. 1 1904 and

Whereas one of said bonds, dated as aforesaid bears the No. of 55 and is of the face value of \$290.73 and is therefore subject to cancellation upon the 1st day of Nov. 1906 upon the payment of the face value thereof and accrued interest thereon.

Now therefor be it resolved by the Council of Oregon City, that said improvement bond No. 55 bearing date of Nov. 1, 1904 be and the same is hereby ordered taken up, the face value thereof together with the accrued interest thereon paid, and that the interest on said improvement bond shall cease at and after Nov. 1, 1906 and that said improvement bond be canceled. And that due notice of the cancellation and payment of said bond and the ceasing of interest thereon be and the same is hereby ordered published as required by the law under which said bond was issued.

The matter of excavating and removing the rock located on Washington Street, Oregon City, Ore., between the center line and the westerly line of said street and between 6th & 7th Streets was brought up before the Council, and upon motion the Mayor and Recorder were instructed and empowered to enter into a contract with Harry Jones and the abutting real property owners at said locality for the excavation and removal of said rock at a price of not to exceed \$75 cents per cubic yard in place, the City to pay 25 cents per cubic yard and the abutting property owners to pay 50 cents per cubic yard.

The matter of holding the coming City nomination election, under the direct primary law was brought up before the Council, and upon motion said matter was referred to the Finance Committee and Recorder to look the same up, and with power to act.

Upon motion it was ordered that the City Attorney assist Mr. J. A. Cain in the collection of road poll tax for Oregon City road district by giving him advice in the matter and by prosecuting by legal measures if necessary in cases where payment is refused.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

Resolution

Whereas Oregon City owes to its founder, Doctor John McLoughlin a debt of gratitude it can never repay except in part, we believe it to be the duty of Oregon City to purchase his old house, where he spent the last ten years of his life, and restore the same to its original condition as near as possible, preserving it always as a memorial.

Now therefore be it resolved, that the following proposition be submitted to the voters of Oregon City, at the regular election to be held Dec. 3, 1906, viz:

Shall Oregon (City) purchase the old home of its founder Doctor John McLoughlin and establish a fund for that purpose by annual levies of one mill upon each and every dollar of assessable property within the corporate limits of Oregon City until a sum not to exceed \$4,500.00 be raised in said fund.

Councilman Straight moved the adoption of said resolution which motion was seconded by Councilman Justin, and upon said motion being put the same was carried and said resolution was unanimously adopted.
