

**WHEREAS**, the beauty of the native *Cornus nuttallii*, or Pacific Dogwood, was nurtured and cultivated by the earliest settlers of the Milwaukie area; and

**WHEREAS**, this community was incorporated on May 21, 1903, by the authority of the Oregon State Legislature and Governor George E. Chamberlain; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 9, 1962, the City Council designated the Dogwood as the City's official flower and "The Dogwood City of the West" as the City's nickname; and

**WHEREAS**, by designating May 21<sup>st</sup> as Dogwood Day this City is making note of our shared heritage with the earth and each other.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Mark Gamba, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, a municipal corporation in the County of Clackamas, in the State of Oregon, do hereby proclaim **May 21st**, **2017**, as **Dogwood Day** in the City of Milwaukie, the Dogwood City of the West.
