The Council of Oregon City, Oregon met in Regular Session on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M.

Mr. M. D. Latourette was elected Recorder pro-tem by the Council for the evening.

The minutes of the proceedings of the regular meeting of the Council held January 2nd 1907 were read and duly approved.

The communication of A. Mihlstin in regard to returning to him by the City of a check for \$91 forfeiture by said Mihlstin to the City in connection with bids for the construction of sewers in Sewer District No. 5 was read and ordered placed on file.

The communication of the city mail carriers relative to house numbers, sidewalks and street names etc., was read and ordered placed on file.

The application of D. McHenry for a renewal of his saloon license for a period of six months from Feb. 9, 1907 was read and it appearing from the affidavit of Snow V. Heaton

principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, that said applicant had published notice thereof as by ordinance required upon motion said license was granted for a period of six months.

The communication of J. C. Stone, manager of the Board of Fire Underwriters of the Pacific relative to the wiring of Cataract Hose House was read and referred to the Committee on Fire & Water with power to act.

The Recorder's monthly report was read and ordered placed on file.

The annual report of the Chief of the Fire Department was read and ordered placed on file.

The Finance Committee having examined the following claims against the City and finding them correct in the amounts stated herein, upon recommendation of said committee said claims were allowed and upon motion and roll call warrants were ordered drawn upon the respective funds in payment thereof:

The following report of the special committee appointed to investigate the advisability of improving certain cross streets from Main Street to Water Street and from Main Street to Railroad Avenue and of the establishing of the grade of a portion of Water Street was read:

Report

To the Honorable Council of Oregon City:

We the undersigned special committee to whom was referred the question of improvement of Water Street and streets intersecting Main Street below the Bluff, would respectfully report as follows; we would recommend that all streets intersecting Main Street below the bluff from Fourth to Tenth inclusive, not already improved, be

ordered improved, also that a grade be established on Water Street from Third to the Alley in Block between Tenth and Eleventh Streets.

Said report was adopted by the Council as submitted and upon motion the Recorder was instructed to publish notices respectively of the establishment of the grade of Water Street as in said report designated and of the improvement of said cross streets as in said report recommended and set out. Said street improvements to be according to the established or proposed grade thereof and with sidewalks, cross walks, curbs, gutters, drains, corner blocks, and by the laying of crushed rock or gravel thereon.

The matter of building a culvert on Jefferson Street near the property of Geo. Randall to connect with the culvert at property of Thos. F. Ryan was brought before the Council and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

Mr. F. T. Griffith appeared before the Council and asked that a special committee be appointed and that the matter of new franchise for the Portland Railway Light & Power Company be taken up, but nothing was done by the Council in regard to said matter further than by motion further consideration of said matter was laid over for a special meeting to be called Wednesday Feby. 20th 1907 at 8 o'clock P. M.

The Finance Committee to which committee had been referred the matter of looking up the advisability of accepting the proposition for payment of \$100 in full of all demands of the City against Lots 7 & 8 of Block 163 of Oregon City, acct. of Jackson Street improvement from the heirs of Jno. Welch, recommended that said proposition be not accepted, upon motion said report of the Finance Committee was adopted by the Council, the whole matter was referred to the City Attorney to take the regular course as prescribed by the Charter for the selling of property for such delinquent liens.

Upon motion the committee to which had been referred the matter of alleged damages of Chas. Albright on account of his barn burning near the garbage dump was given more time in which to investigate the same and report to the Council.

The affidavit of Snow V. Heaton, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, showing that notice of assessment for the laying of sewers in Sewer District No. 5 had been published in the issues of said paper of date of Jany. 4th & 11th, 1907 was read and ordered filed.

Upon motion the matter of the gift of the old office building, located on the property commonly known as the Broughton property by the Oregon City Mill & Lumber Co. to the City for an engine house, was referred to the Committee on Fire and Water to look up the cost of the removal of the same across the street to City property.

Ordinance No. ____

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance to an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as the "Bonding Act" as the same has been amended, was read for the first time and upon motion ordered published in the City official paper, to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held Feb. 20, 1907 at 8 o'clock P. M. of said day.

The matter of granting to Frank Busch a new franchise for the use of and conveying the waters of Singer Hill Creek to his property below 11th Street was brought before the Council and upon motion said matter was referred to a special committee consisting of the Mayor and three Councilmen to be appointed by the Mayor, said committee to report said matter back to the Council at the special meeting to be held Feb. 20, 1907. The Mayor appointed Councilmen Andresen, Knapp and Williams upon said committee.

The special committee to which committee had been referred the matter of looking up the advisability of requiring all electric telephone and telegraph wires on Main Street and other portions of the City to be placed underground, reported to the Council as follows:

To the Honorable Council of Oregon City

We the undersigned special committee to whom was referred the matter of the unsatisfactory and dangerous condition of the Electric, Telephone and Telegraph wiring in the City with instructions to investigate and take

necessary action to correct same, beg leave to respectfully report as follows:

We have looked over the situation carefully and thoroughly and would state that we consider the manner in which the wires carrying electric current of very high voltage, ordinary electric current wires, telephone and telegraph wires are placed through the business part of Main Street a constant menace to life and property.

On account of the peculiar location of Oregon City on one short and narrow street, we consider that the future welfare of the City demands that all wires be removed from above the surface on Main Street from the Basin to Eleventh Street and placed in conduit.

The removal of the unsightly poles and myriad of wires will not only remove the element of danger to life and property but will also materially help the appearance of that part of the City. We also recommend that such control be exercised by ordinance over all future placing of poles and wires, that the situation we now have on Main Street shall not be repeated on the other streets of the City. Having in mind the future welfare and appearance of our City, we would suggest that great care be exercised in the granting of rights for pole lines over streets of the City in future and that some arrangement be effected with the different telephone, telegraph and electric companies so that as a rule streets will not be encumbered with more than one line of poles.

In order that the City may more advisedly and safely in the matter we have had the City Attorney examine carefully all the franchises

granted by the City, under which the present system of wires have been placed. He has also looked up the law and decisions of the courts regarding the extent of control that the city can exercise over these matters. Having due regard for the rights of the companies under their franchises, we have no question of the Councils right to carry out the recommendations of the committee. We attach hereto the written opinion of the City Attorney rendered to the committee.

The committee has had an ordinance carefully prepared along the lines of these recommendations compelling all companies having overhead electric, telephone or telegraph wires on that part of Main Street between the basin and Eleventh Street to remove the same within a reasonable time and place them underground in conduits. We submit the same herewith and would respectfully recommend its passage.

Upon motion the foregoing report of said committee was adopted by the Council. Accompanying said report was an opinion of the said City Attorney in regard to said matter which was ordered placed on file.

Said committee also introduced the following ordinance:

Ordinance No. ____

An ordinance requiring directing and regulating the placing of certain electric wires, cables and appliances in underground conduits or subways in a certain district or part of the City of Oregon City, said ordinance was read for the

first time, and upon motion ordered published in the City official paper.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Mayor appoint a committee of twenty five said committee to include the Mayor, the nine members of the City Council, the Recorder, the City Attorney the three members of the Board of Water Commissioners and ten citizens and residents of Oregon City, among them representatives of the Board of Trade, to act as a charter commission and revision committee and to take up the matter of the revision of certain parts of the charter of Oregon City.

The annual report of the Treasurer for the year ending Dec. 31 1906 and the Treasurer's quarterly report for the quarter ending Dec. 31 '06 were each upon recommendation of the Finance Committee, accepted by the Council and ordered placed on file.

Upon motion the matter of unpaid street assessments on account of J. Q. Adams Street Improvement from 6th Street to 7th Street was referred to the Finance Committee for collection and if said assessments were not paid to proceed to collect the same as under the Charter provided.

Upon motion the Finance Committee was granted more time (2 months) in which to report concerning the matter of granting a lease to the foot of 8th Street to the Oregon City Transportation Company.

Upon motion the matter of the change of the capacity of the sewer along Center Street was left in the hands of the Committee on Streets and Public Property for investigation said committee to report at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Upon motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to confer with the Committee on Streets and Public Property as to notifying property holders to comply with the ordinance in regard to bad sidewalks and so notify said property holders as directed by said committee.

Upon motion Councilman Andresen was instructed to assist the Committee on Streets and Public Property in the repair of the walk through the City Park.

Upon motion the dispute between Hose Co. #3; and the downtown company over who should have possession of a certain nozzle recently purchased was left with the Chief of the Fire Department to look into the same and report to the Council at the next regular meeting.

Upon motion the matter of repairs to the Cemetery fence was left with the Cemetery Committee with power to act.

Upon motion the matter of damages to the City, its property, waterworks, etc. on account of recent washout of Portland General Electric Company's breakwater at the basin was referred to the City Attorney to look into the same and report.

Upon motion the matter of overhead crossing at 6th Street & Railroad Avenue was left with the special committee to which said matter had been previously referred, and the Recorder was instructed to confer with the Southern Pacific Railroad Company in regard to the present status of said matter, also the Recorder was instructed to ask said company to repair its crossing at 10th Street and the foot of Singer Hill.

Upon motion the special committee heretofore appointed to take up the matter of overhead wiring in the streets of Oregon City and which special committee at this meeting of the Council reported an ordinance covering such matters was instructed to confer with any representatives of the various companies affected by said ordinance relative to said matters therein contained, provided any of such representatives asked to confer with said committee.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

The Council of Oregon City, Oregon, met in Special Session pursuant to the call of the Mayor on the above date at the hour of 8 P. M. of said day.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider certain pending ordinance in regard to the issuance of improvement bonds, the final passage of the same and any other business which might regularly be brought before the Council.

The communication of the Southern Pacific Company in regard to overhead crossing at 6th Street was read and ordered placed on file, said communication was reporting the progress of said matter.

The bid of C. G. Miller for wiring Cataract Hose Company house #2 for \$15.00 and Engine House Hose Company #3 for \$16.50 with chandelier and for \$12.50 without chandelier. According to requisite demands of Board of Fire Underwriters of the Pacific, was

read and upon motion said matter was left with the Committee on Fire and Water with power to act.

The communication of Dr. Robert C. Yenney, State health officer, relative to the appointment of a City health officer was read and ordered filed and upon motion said matter was left over until the next regular meeting of the Council.

The report of the Street Committee as to sidewalks in the City, ordinances covering the same together with recommendations as to said matter, etc., was read and ordered accepted and placed on file and upon motion said committee was instructed to submit an ordinance to the Council covering such matters.

The final estimate of the City Engineer on the Construction of sewers in Sewer District No. 5, as to present status of same, how much was due contractor A. Mihalstin, etc. was read.

Said estimate showed the sum of \$1,253.60 due said contractor. Said estimate was not accepted as read, owing to the fact of the allowance of \$0.00 extra for connecting with main sewer on 7th Street. But on motion and roll call a warrant was ordered drawn on Sewer District No. 5 Fund in favor of A. Mihalstin for the sum of \$1,000.00.

Ordinance No. 368

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance to an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as the "Bonding Act" as the same has been amended, was read for the second time and it appearing

from the affidavit of Snow V. Heaton, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, that said ordinance had been published as by law required, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows, Ayes: Councilmen Andresen, Knapp, Meyer, Pope, Rands & William (six). Noes none. Absent, Councilmen Brandt, Harrington & Logus. The Mayor announced that the ordinance has passed.

Councilman Rands introduced the following ordinance:

Ordinance No. ____

An ordinance granting the Oregon City and Farmers Independent Telephone Company its successors and assigns the right to lay and maintain underground conduits and wires and to construct the necessary manholes, make house connections and to erect poles and thereon to fasten wires, on the streets and alleys and operate a telephone and telegraph system in the City of Oregon City, state of Oregon was read for the first time and upon motion ordered published.

The Mayor appointed the following citizens to act in conjunction with the nine members of the City Council, the Mayor, Recorder, City Attorney and the three Water Commissioners as a Charter Commission and Revision Committee: Thomas A. McBride, Thos. F. Ryan, H. C. Stevens, F. T. Griffith, W. S. U'Ren, E. A. Sommer, Geo. A. Harding, D. C. Latourette, W. A. Huntley and C. H. Dye.

Said members of said committee were appointed by the Mayor in accordance with the terms of a motion passed by the Council at its regular meeting held Feb. 6, 1907.

Upon motion Councilman Pope was added to the committee heretofore appointed to take up the matter of overhead steps at 6th Street & Railroad Avenue with the Southern Pacific Railroad Company.

Upon motion the matter of the construction of a small culvert across 6th Street at the intersection of J. Q. Adams Street for drain purposed, was left with the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

The applications of Griesser and Casseus and E. A. Brady for a renewal of their saloon licenses respectively for a period of six months each, at 7th & Main Streets and on Main Street between 4th & 5th Streets were read, and it appearing

satisfactorily to the Council that each of said applicants had published notice thereof as required by ordinance, upon motion each of said licenses were granted for a period of 6 months from the date of their respective expirations.

The petition of C. N. Greenman asking for a rebate of \$5.00 amount over paid the City in the matter of dray licenses for the fiscal quarter ending March 31, 1907 was read and the Council being fully informed in the premises upon motion and roll call a warrant was ordered drawn on the general fund of the City in favor of C. N. Greenman rebate in said matter, for the sum of \$5.00.

The petition of Drs. Mount, Carll, Meissner and Stuart asking for the appointment of Dr. J. W. Norris as Secretary of the City Board of Health together with an application of Dr. M. C. The Recorder's monthly report for the month ending March 6, 1907 was read and ordered placed on file.

The report of the Board of Fire Commissioners showing the election of Max Bollack, E. A. Leighton and W. Peters as Fire Commissioners for the ensuing term and the election of C. Bruner as Assistant Engineer of the Fire Department for the ensuing term and the election of Lawrence Ruconich as Chief of the Fire Department for the ensuing term

was read and ordered placed on file.

Whereas under the terms of an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as the "Bonding Act" as the same has been amended, there is a provision providing for the cancellation of improvement bonds, at or after one year from the date of said bonds, upon payment of the face of said bonds and interest to the date of payment and

Whereas, Oregon City did issue improvement bonds for the partial payment of the assessments for the laying of sewer in Sewer District No. 3 upon application of certain property owners owning certain property in said Sewer District assessed for the laying of sewers in said District said bonds bearing date of Sept. 1, 1903 and Whereas two of said bonds bear the number of 34 & 35 dated as aforesaid and are of the face value of \$500 each are therefore subject to cancellation on March 1st 1907, upon the payment of the face value thereof and the accrued interest thereon.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Council of Oregon City, that said improvement bonds Nos. 34 & 35

WHEREAS Portland Railway Light and Power Company is the successor in interest of the Oregon Water Power and Railway Company, grantee named in Ordinance No. 274 of Oregon City approved November 10, 1902, and is the present holder of all rights and privileges conferred upon the said The Oregon Water Power and Railway Company by the said ordinance No. 274, and is also the successor in interest of East Side Railway Company, and as such successor in interest, the holder of all rights, powers and privileges conferred upon said East Side Railway Company by Ordinance No. 139 of Oregon City, approved July 11, 1892, and WHEREAS the said Portland Railway Light and Power Company desires the approval of the pattern of rail and kind of foundation to be used by it for its railway upon the paved portion of Main Street in Oregon City, and has submitted to the council for its approval, specifications governing the pattern of rails and the kind of foundation for road bed for its railway tracks to be placed upon the paved portions of said Main Street, which specifications are as follows:-

Rail to be 6½ inches in depth, of a weight not less than seventy five (75) pounds to the yard, with groove capable of accommodating standard flange of the Masters Car Builders Association, excepting that the curved rails to be used in side tracks, turn-outs and switches shall be tee rails six inches in depth, of a weight not less than seventy (70) pounds to the yard. All rails to be supported on ties six inches by eight inches by eight feet in length, which in turn are to be supported by a bed of gravel ballast six inches in depth. Ballast to be well tamped under ties, between ties to be filled with cement concrete, well tamped under the rail; concrete to be formed with one part of first-class Portland cement, three parts of clear sharp sand and five parts of broken stone or course gravel. Paving between rails and between the tracks and one foot outside the rails, to be of either vitrified brick or well cut ballast paving blocks, to be well bedded in a layer of sand, forming a cushion and joints grouted in with Portland cement, grouting formed with one part of cement to two parts of sand, or joints to be filled with paving pitch of proper consistency, as the Railway Company may elect.

The paving, whether of brick or stone blocks, to be laid to a true surface with close joints, and finished in a workmanlike manner."

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED,

That the pattern and style of rails and the manner of constructing and laying down the same and the foundation for such rails as set forth and described in the said specifications, be and they are hereby each and all approved by the Council, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that during the reconstruction of the present road bed of said Railway Company upon the said paved portions or Main Street, that the said Railway Company be and it is hereby authorized to lay down and maintain temporarily above the grade of said Main Street, railway tracks for the purpose of accommodating railway traffic upon said Main Street during the said period of construction, provided that such Railway Company shall so place the rails laid above the said grade as to offer as little obstruction to team traffic upon said Main Street as practicable, provided that in laying new tracks on said Main Street, not more than two blocks of said Street shall be torn up at one time nor more than two blocks of said temporary track above the grade of said Main Street be maintained and operated at any one time, and provided further that at all cross street crossings, said Railway Company shall maintain crossings over said temporary tracks during the course of construction, and be it further

RESOLVED that said Railway Company may use all suitable vitrified brick displaced by it in repairing and replacing the pavement torn up by it.

An ordinance to amend section 10 of ordinance No. 274 entitled and ordinance authorizing the Oregon Water Power & Railway Company its successors and assigns to construct, maintain and operate a railway on Third Street in Oregon City and to erect the necessary poles and string the necessary wires for the operation thereof and to carry freight and express matter on and over said railway on said Third Street and on and over said company's railway on Main Street in Oregon City and to collect charges and tolls for the carrying of freight and express matter was read for the 1st time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the Council of Oregon City Wednesday April 17, 1907 at 8 o'clock P. M.

The matter of the lateral sewer in alley in Sewer District No. 5 where said sewer was higher than the houses' tributary to the same, was referred to the City Engineer to investigate the same and report to the Council at its next regular meeting.

Upon motion the Committee on Fire and Water was authorized to buy a new shut off nozzle for Hose Co. #3.

The report of the City Engineer, showing plans, specifications and estimate of probable cost for the improvement of J. Q. Adams Street from 7th to 8th Streets were read and exhibited to the Council. Upon motion said specifications, plans and estimate of cost were each accepted by the Council.

The affidavits of Snow V. Heaton, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, showing that notices of the improvement of lower 7th, 4th, 9th and 10th Streets had each been published in said paper in the issues of April 19 & 26, 1907, were each read and ordered placed on file.

Ordinance No. ____

An ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving John Quincy Adams Street of Oregon City, Oregon, from the north line of Seventh Street to the south line of Eighth Street was read for the first time and ordered published to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held Saturday May 11th 1907 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Upon motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to look up the matter of Mr. Topelman's fence and walk on 3rd Street between High and Center Streets and report the status and condition of the same back to the Council at its next regular meeting, complaint having heretofore been lodge against the same, with the City officials.

Upon motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to tear down the fence located on lots belonging to the City at 5th & Jackson Streets or near by said location, and use said lots for a place to store lumber when needed.

Upon motion, the matter of the sale of property belonging to the City at 5th & Jackson or near said location taken in by the City on account of street improvement was referred to the Finance Committee.

There being a vacancy in the Council on account of the resignation of J. N. Harrington ex-councilman from Ward No. 3. The Mayor declared nominations for the filling of such vacancy in the Council in order.

Frank Betzel was placed in nomination for such vacancy and there being no other nominations, nominations were closed, the ballot was spread and Frank Betzel received 5 votes, that being all the votes cast in said matter. The Mayor declared Frank Betzel the duly elected Councilman from Ward No. 3, Oregon City, until the next general City election to fill the vacancy of J. N. Harrington, resigned.

The Street Committee brought up the matter of putting in a new 12 inch pipe to drain off the surface water and sewerage on Center Street after discussion by Councilmen and Mayor in regard to the same, said matter was upon motion referred to the Councilmen of Ward No. 2, to go over the ground, formulate

some plan therefor, and report the same back to the Council.

The Street Committee to which committee had been referred the matter of F. C. Burke petition for the City vacating his premises as a roadway at 11th Street just east of Oregon & California Railroad Company right-of-way, reported to the Council as follows: that unless Mr. Burke would give the City a better proposition than he had offered in his communication to the Council relative to said matter now on file with the Recorder that said committee, did not favor vacating said roadway, as the City probably had some rights to the same at this time.

Upon motion the whole of said matter was laid on the table.

The Street Committee, to which committee had been heretofore referred to matter of the petition of F. E. Leavens for a 4 foot walk in front of the property of Mary A. Maddock on 13th Street and for two crosswalks at the intersection of 13th & J. Q. Adams Streets, recommended to the Council that said walks be built upon motion said report was adopted. The Street Commissioner was instructed to notify Mary A. Maddock to put in said 4 foot walk along her property on 13th Street and said Street Commissioner was also instructed to put in said crosswalks.

The Street Committee recommended to the Council that the lateral sewer in the alley in Sewer District No. 5 running along by the property of W. & L. Bluhm and Jos. L. Noble should be lowered so that the houses tributary to the same could use

such sewer and upon motion said committee was instructed to have such work done.

The Street Commissioner reported to the Council that the Trembaths refused to build a new sidewalk along their property on Pleasant Avenue after being duly notified to build such walk and upon motion said Street Commissioner was instructed to build such walk and take a lien against said property for the cost of the same.

The Street Commissioner also stated that the new and proposed walk along the Savage Property along said Pleasant Avenue would soon be built as he had been authorized by the owner of the property to build the same.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

Harding appeared before the Council in the interest of the Clackamas County Humane Society and on behalf of said society proposed to the Council that said society would bear ½ the expenses of putting in a new drinking fountain, if the Council would stand an equal amount of such expense, the total expense not to exceed \$150.00 and the location of such fountain to be chosen by the Council.

The matter of repairing and bringing up the proper grade (of) the pavement on Main Street between the west side of the Oregon Water Power & Railway Company's division of the Portland Railway Light and Power Company's track, and the trench of the Home Telephone Company was brought before the Council and said matter was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property to investigate the same and report at the next regular meeting of said Council, and upon motion the Mayor appointed Councilmen Andresen, Meyer and Logus as a special committee to confer with the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Company and the Portland General Electric Company as to the probability of said companies putting their wires underground in the near future, with the idea of said companies using that portion of Main Street for putting their wires underground where said proposed pavement improvement was to be made.

Upon motion the matter of repairing the plank road at the head of Fifth Street was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with instructions to investigate the same and report at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Upon motion the Council adjourned.

The petition of A. C. Warner, Chairman Road Committee, Mt. Pleasant Civic Improvement Club introduced by Councilman F. Betzel, asking for permanent improvement of what is commonly called the plank road from the head of 5th Street to the city limits was read, and referred to the Street Committee, the same to be reported back to the Council at the meeting thereof to be held June 14, 1907.

The petition of T. L. Charman et al asking for electric light on Water Street

between 4th & 5th Streets was read and referred to the Street Committee with instructions to investigate and report the same back to the Council.

The petition of E. Matthies et al retail liquor dealers, asking that the hour of closing of saloons be put at 1 o'clock A. M. instead of at 12 o'clock midnight, as stated in the pending ordinance governing the same, was read and upon motion put over until the special meeting of the Council to be held June 14, 1907.

The petition of Multnomah Lodge #1, A. F. & A. M. asking for permission to excavate under the sidewalk on Main Street in front of Lot 3 Block 6 where they were putting up their new building was read and upon motion ordered granted, the same to be done under the direction of the Council.

The communication of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Company relative to their franchise or a proposed franchise in Oregon City, was read.

Upon motion it was ordered by the Council that the Mayor appoint a committee of three Councilmen, said Councilmen to act with the Mayor and form a committee of four, and said committee of four to draw up an ordinance and have the same ready for first passage at the next regular meeting of the Council, repealing the franchise of the Oregon Telephone & Telegraph Company. Chas. H. Caufield received of same 7 votes.

Chas. H. Caufield having received all of the votes cast for said office at said election, the Mayor declared him the duly elected member of the Board of Water Commissioners for the ensuing term of 3 years.

The Finance Committee to which committee had been referred the matter of the adjustment of the salary to the City Engineer, reported to the Council that they had conferred with W. A. White, City Engineer, and that they recommended to the Council that he be paid the sum of \$125 per month. Upon motion said salary was fixed at that amount from the date of his appointment until the present pending street improvement was completed.

Upon motion the special committee appointed to confer with the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. and the Portland General Electric Company relative to the putting of their wires underground on Main Street between the west line of said street and the trench of the Home Telephone Co., was granted more time in which to report.

Upon motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property were granted more time in which to report in regard to the repaving of the westerly part of Main Street and in regard to the proposed culvert on the hill from the property of Jno. Bittner to that of the Welch estate, although said committee

recommended the building of said culvert.

Upon motion the City Engineer was instructed to draw up plans and specifications and estimate of cost of said proposed culvert, as the same had been petitioned for by the property owners adjacent thereto, and as the same was to be recommended by the Committee on Streets and Public Property and report the same to the Council as soon as possible.

Dr. A. F. Beatie appeared before the Council on behalf of the 4th of July Celebration Committee and asked the Council for an appropriation for prizes for hose races for the benefit of the Fire Department for July 4, 1907. Upon motion it was ordered by the Council that a sum equal to \$50.00 for each company which took part in said races, when the warrant for such amount to be drawn the same to be placed in the hands of the Finance Committee, was appropriated for such purpose.

Upon motion the City Engineer was instructed to draw up plans, specifications and estimate of probable cost for the improvement of 9th Street from the east line of Water Street to a point on said 9th Street 150 feet west of the west line of Main Street and report the same to the Council at his earliest possible convenience.

Upon motion Councilman Brandt was added to the committee to which the matter of a new sidewalk in front of Mr. McGeehan's property was referred to, said matter having been brought before the Council by Councilman Brandt.

Upon motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to notify all real property owners, owning real property abutting on Main Street from 14th Street north to repair said walks wherever necessary, and to put in new walks wherever necessary, the same to be done forthwith.

Upon motion the Street Superintendent and the Chief of Police were instructed to keep on the look out for bad sidewalks and bad places in walks, the Chief of Police to report whatever of such places he found to the Street Superintendent and the Street Superintendent to notify all abutting real property owners or their resident agents to fix up or put in new walks as the same are needed, all over the City.

Upon motion the matter of street sprinkling and the matter of the charge of \$1.00 per day for water for street sprinkling purposes by the Board of Water Commissioners, was referred to a special committee of four, the Mayor to be a member of said committee, and he to appoint 3 Councilmen on such committee. The Mayor appointed Councilmen Knapp, Pope & Meyer on said committee.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

The communication of J. H. Walker in regard to the planting of roses and shrubbery between the sidewalk and curb in front of his property on 7th Street was read. of their building in said block was read. Councilman Meyer spoke of a remonstrance of the Barclays et al against the same but said remonstrance was not filed.

Upon motion the petition was granted, provided however said matter was to be entirely under and suitable to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Upon motion Mr. Carter was given permission to erect a small platform in the street at 10th & Main Streets for a short time only for advertising purposes.

The sealed bids of Harry Jones as per the advertisement therefor for improving 4th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, J. Q. Adams and Madison Streets were opened and read to the Council.

It appearing that each bid was regularly made, on the proper forms, and accompanied by the required certified checks.

Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilman Rands (1). The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Ordinance No. 393

An ordinance to amend Section 5 of Ordinance No. 219 entitled An Ordinance to license, tax, regulate and restrain bar keepers, saloon keepers and dealers in spirituous, vinous and malt liquors, bar rooms, drinking shops or places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are kept for sale or in any manner disposed of and the disposal thereof approved December 2, 1897, was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of H. B. Cartlidge, foreman of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, that said ordinance had published as by law required, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Andresen, Brandt, Betzel, Knapp, Logus, Meyer, Pope & Williams (8). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilman Rands (1). The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Ordinance No. 394

An ordinance fixing the hours in which saloons, bar rooms, drinking shops or places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are kept for sale shall be kept closed, was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of H. B. Cartlidge, foreman of the Oregon City Enterprise, the City official paper, that said ordinance had published as by law required. It was moved and seconded that the time provided in said ordinance regulating

the hour of closing as specified therein be changed from 12 o'clock midnight to 1 o'clock A. M., but upon motion being put the same was lost. Then upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Andresen, Brandt, Betzel, Logus, Meyer, Pope & Williams (7). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilman Rands (1). Councilman Knapp was excused from voting. The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Councilman A. The affidavit of Frank C. Lowing, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Oregon City Enterprise the City official paper, showing that notice for bids for the improvement of that portion of Ninth Street, above mentioned, had been duly and legally published in said paper, was read and ordered filed.

The bid of Harry Jones for the improvement of that portion of Ninth Street above mentioned, for the sum of \$246.85 was read to the Council, and it

appearing that said bid was duly and regularly made and accompanied by the required certified check, upon motion said bid was accepted by the Council and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into contract with Harry Jones for such street improvements according to the plans and specifications therefor.

The report of the City Engineer relative to the construction of a lateral sewer on Willamette Street in Sewer District No. 5 was read. Said estimate showed the proposed cost of such sewer to be \$176.40. Upon motion said matter was referred to the Finance Committee to look up the same and try to ascertain who was responsible for the construction of the original lateral sewer in said District on such locality, alleged to be defective, and report their findings to the Council at its next regular meeting.

The estimate of the City Engineer showing that it would take 761 cubic yards of macadam to full improve Mt. Pleasant Road beyond the head of Fifth Street, was read to the Council, and by order of Council, the following ordinance was introduced:

The matter of installing a new manhole on Center Street between 6th & 7th Streets near the proposed culvert in said locality to take of the the over flow from Center Street sewer, was brought before the Council, and upon motion the same was referred to the committee heretofore appointed on the proposed Main Street pavement and repairs with power to act.

Ordinance No. 411

An Ordinance granting the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, its successors and assigns, the right to lay and maintain underground conduits and wires and to construct the necessary manholes, make house connections, and to erect poles and thereon to fasten wires on the streets and alleys, and to operate a telephone and telegraph system in the City of Oregon City, state of Oregon, was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of N. C. Cochran, principal clerk of the Oregon City Courier, the City Official paper, that said ordinance had been published as by law required, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Knapp, Logus, Meyer, Rands & Williams (5). Noes, none (0). Absent, Andresen, Betzel, Brandt & Pope (4). The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property to which committee had been referred the matter of alleged damages to the property of Kate L. Newton on 5th Street from overflow from Singer Hill Creek, reported to the Council that they had examined said matter & that they could not find where Mrs. Newton was damaged to any great extent if at all but said committee did recommend that the City put in a culvert for said creek across Monroe Street at its junction with 5th Street. No action was taken on said report, but said matter was ordered brought up at a later meeting of the Council.

Upon motion the matter of obtaining the privilege of long distance telephone service for the City Police on the system of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Company in Oregon (City), in connection with the passage of franchise Ordinance No. 411, previously at this meeting passed by the Council, was referred to the Mayor with power to act, said matter to be evidenced by agreement in writing.

The matter of the contractor on Madison Street Improvement filling in on real property belonging to Samuel Kilpatrick and of Mr. Kilpatrick's objection thereto, was brought before the Council, no action was taken in regard to said matter, but the same was ordered to be brought before the Council at a later date.

The following report of the City Engineer relative to monuments on Main Street at the intersection of cross streets from 3rd to 10th Streets, was read, adopted by the council and it was ordered that said report be

spread upon the minutes of the Council in full.

Report

Oregon City, Oregon, Dec. 23, 1907

To the Honorable Mayor and Council of Oregon City:

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your instructions to the City Engineer dated May 11, 1907, relating to the preservation of monuments on Main Street, between Third and Tenth Streets, and also to the placing of monuments where the same are required on Main Street between the above stated limits, I have to report the following:

All monuments on Main Street have been fitted with iron covers, so that the monuments may be readily accessible and also be safe-guarded against displacement by the jar of traffic on the street.

New monuments have been set for the intersection of the center lines of:

Main and Seventh Streets

Main and Ninth Streets

Main and Tenth Streets

and also for the angle in the center line of Main Street in Sixth Street.

These monuments are of cut stone about twenty-four inches long and five inches square on the top, are set in concremented, with the exception of the monument at the angle in Sixth Street, which is set in well tamped earth and gravel.

These monuments and the monuments at the intersection of the Center lines of Main and Third Streets, Main and Fourth Streets, Main and Eighth Streets and at the intersection of the center line of Main Street with the southerly line of Sixth Street, have each been centered with a copper wire set in the stone.

The centering of these monuments was done as follows:

I.

Alignment

A. From the angle in Sixth Street, southerly to the Basin.

Old monuments were found evidently set to mark the intersection of the center line of Main Street with the center line of Third and Fourth Streets, and the southerly line of Sixth Street.

The angle in the center line of Main Street in Sixth Street was determined by a mark which had been used by surveyors since Main Street was improved in 1893, which being proved, was accepted and is now marked by the copper wire in the monument in said Sixth Street.

The mark on this monument and the marks on the old monuments at the intersection of Main and Third, Fourth and the southerly line of Sixth Street, not being in a straight line, the center line of this part of Main Street was determined by reference to these monuments and the older and more permanent buildings along the street.

The center line of Main Street as so determined, coincides with the mark on the monument on the southerly line of Sixth Street, falls 0.08 feet easterly from the old mark on the monument at Fourth Street and 0.16 feet westerly from the old mark on the monument at Third Street. In this line, after the measurements were made as hereinafter noted, a monument was set for the intersection of the center line of Fifth and Main Streets, and all centers marked with copper wire as already stated; and in the projection of this line a copper plug was firmly set in the heavy concrete wall of the Basin at the head of Main Street.

B) Alignment from the angle in the center line of Main Street in Sixth Street northerly to Tenth Street. An old monument was found to mark the intersection of the center lines of Main and Eighth Streets.

The hole in this monument was carefully centered and the center marked by a copper wire. In the line determined by this monument and that at the angle of the center line of Main Street in Sixth Street, the monument at the intersection of the center lines of Main and Seventh, Ninth and Tenth Streets were established.

This monument was centered in June 1907 and the monuments at Seventh, Ninth and Tenth Streets set and the line carefully marked thereon. Shortly after, in relaying the street car track, the top of this monument was found to be broken off by an old break.

The top was carefully replaced and the alignment and distance being

found to agree with the earlier determination, it was, and is now, as set in cement in exactly the same position as formerly.

II. Measurement

A) From the angle in Sixth Street southerly to Third Street:

From the undisturbed monument on the southerly line of Sixth Street to the monument in Third Street, the measurement is in accordance with the map known as the "Preston Map of Oregon City". This measurement places the intersection of the center lines of Main and Fourth Streets 0.18 feet southerly from the original mark on the monument. At Third Street it places the intersection 0.09 feet southerly from the original mark on the monument.

The distance from the monument on the southerly line of Sixth Street to the monument at the angle of the center line of Main Street in Sixth Street is 38.82 feet.

B) From the angle in Sixth Street northerly to Tenth Street.

From the undisturbed monument at the intersection of the center lines of Main and Eighth Streets, the measurement to the intersection of the center lines of Main and Seventh Streets, and Main and Tenth Streets are in accordance with the Preston Map.

The distance from the monument at the intersection of the center lines of Main and Seventh Streets to the monument at the angle in the center lines of Main Street in Sixth Street is 244.23 feet.

The measurements were made at a mean temperature of 60° Fahrenheit with a steel tape, tested and found to agree with the standard one hundred foot tape in the Surveyor General's Office in Portland, Oregon.

The Burrage Report

This report was made by William Burrage in 1867 with the ordinances resulting therefrom, together with all matter of like nature, was given careful and thorough consideration, and it is the opinion of the present Engineers concurred in by the City Attorney, that no report of a surveyor even when authorized by the City Council and backed by an ordinance can change

the size of any lot or block from that given in the original plat.

WHEREAS one of said bonds bears the number of 44, and is of the face value of Five Hundred Dollars and is therefore subject to cancellation on April 1st, 1908, upon the payment of the face value thereof and accrued interest thereon,

Be it further resolved that this permit, grant and privilege, cannot be transferred or assigned without the consent of Oregon City.

The communication of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company asking that a permit be granted to make and underground conduit across Main Street at the corner of Sixth and Main Streets, together with proposed map of the same were read and exhibited to the Council and upon motion it was ordered that the Recorder notify said Company that they must file their bond in accordance with the ordinance governing such matters and it was further ordered that the City Engineer make an estimate of the cost of the repaving of that portion of the street to be dug up in installing said underground conduit and that after said estimate was made that said company put up the necessary certified check covering the same in accordance with the ordinance governing such matters.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of laying curbs and gutters on Fifth Street on the hill be put over until the next regular meeting of the Council.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Finance committee get estimates of the

cost of the removal of the home of Dr. John McLoughlin from upper Main Street, its present site, to the City Park at Seventh and Center Streets and report same back to the Council.

The removal of said building was brought before the Council and E. G. Caufield and Rev. A. Hillebrand et al addressed the Council about the same.

Upon motion Council adjourned.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held April 7, 1909, of the regular adjourned session held April 14, 1909 and of the special session held April 21, 1909, were each read and upon motion approved by the council.

The resignation of J. U. Campbell, the City Prosecutor, was read and accepted and the Mayor appointed Livy Stipp as City Prosecutor for the remainder of the unexpired term of J. U. Campbell resigned and the said appointment was duly confirmed by the Council.

Upon motion and roll call the rules and the regular order of business were suspended for the evening and business was transacted by the Council in the following manner:

The Finance Committee, to which Committee

was referred the matter of securing estimates of the cost of the removal of the McLoughlin home from upper Main Street to the park at Seventh and Center Streets, reported to the Council that such removal would cost about \$600.00.

Hon. E. G. Caufield, Rev. A. Hillebrand, et al, appeared before the Council and asked that the Council appropriate the sum of \$300.00 on account of the cost of such removal of said building and that if such amount would be appropriated private individuals would raise the balance.

It was moved and seconded that the Council promise to pay \$300.00 toward the expense of the removal of said building when the same was placed in the park at Seventh and Center Streets. Said motion was put by an aye and nay vote with the following result: Aye, Councilmen Cooke and Michels (2). Nay, Councilmen Andresen, Betzel, Knapp, Meyer, Pope, Sheahan and Strickland (7). The Mayor announced that said motion was lost.

Upon motion it was ordered that a committee of three Councilmen be appointed to select a site for said McLoughlin building in the park at Seventh and Center Streets and in addition to the three Councilmen the Mayor also to act upon said committee. The Mayor appointed Councilmen Cooke, Knapp and Strickland to act upon said committee.

The petition of Harry Kellogg et al asking for a sidewalk on the north

side of Third Street between John Adams and Jefferson Streets was read and upon motion the Street Superintendent was ordered to notify the property owners along said street to put in such sidewalk, the same to be six feet wide.

The communication of E. F. Riley asking that the matter of the vacation of certain portions of Central Addition to Oregon City be deferred until the regular meeting of the Council to be held in June, 1909, was read and upon motion the whole of said vacation matter was placed upon the table.

The communication of O. B. Jefferson offering to work for seven months for the City, with team, etc. for \$108.00 per month was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property. Also said committee was given power to make all temporary arrangements for the continuation of such work as he was doing at present.

Upon motion the unexpired term of saloon license No. 606 was ordered transferred from A. J. Surber to Hull & Smith.

The report of the City Engineer that the contractor for Fifth Street Steps be allowed payment for the full contract price thereon was read, accepted and upon motion and roll call a warrant was ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of J. W. Moffatt for \$450.00, the amount of final settlement for said steps.

The bids of F. S. Baker, C. W. Frost and

O. P. Kellogg for the construction of addition to Hose House No. 5 were each read. The bid of O. P. Kellogg and C. A. Frost being the lowest bid, being for the sum of \$312.45, was accepted by the Council and the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into the necessary contract with said bidders in accordance with plans and specifications therefor.

The Mayor's veto of an ordinance making it unlawful to obstruct the view into the interior of any saloon, barroom, drinking shop or place where spirituous, malt or vinous liquors are sold or kept for sale during certain hours was read. Nothing was done with such veto message other than to order it filed and the Chief of Police was instructed to see that all saloon men kept the blinds on their windows and doors up so that the same would not obstruct the view of people on the street in said saloon after closing hours and on Sundays.

The Recorder's monthly report was read, accepted and ordered filed.

Upon motion W. Bluhm was given permission to pay his sewer assessment in Sewer District No. 5 at the rate of one-tenth per year; interest 6% on deferred payments, all payments to be made up to date however before he would be permitted to make such arrangements with the City.

Upon motion it was ordered that the two old buildings between the ice works and the old Barnum saloon, and the old building next to the alley on

the west side of Main Street between Third and Fourth Streets and the old building next to the Armory on the east side of Main Street between Third and Fourth Streets be declared a nuisance and that the Chief of Police instruct the owners thereof, or their resident agents, to tear the same down.

Upon motion the matter of painting the City Hall and the jail was referred to the Committee on Fire and Water with power to act.

Upon motion the Street Superintendent was instructed to notify the property owners having Hughes Street fenced up in Ely's Addition to Oregon City to open the same for public travel.

The representative of the Western Union Telegraph Company appeared before the Council and asked that said Company be permitted to keep their cable running across Main Street, above ground. Upon motion said request was refused.

Upon motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was authorized to repair Main Street whenever it was needed.

The petition of the Hawley Pulp and Paper Company and C. H. Jeremiah for the vacation of alley running through Block 29, Oregon City, together with a remonstrance against the same was re-read to the Council and the communication of all the signers of such remonstrance, that the same be withdrawn was also read to the Council and whereupon the following action was taken by the Council.

The matter of the ordinance for the vacation of the alley running through Block 29 of this city coming on for final action and it appearing that notice of the proposed vacation of said alley has been published more than thirty-days

We your committee, to whom was referred the matter of the petition of the Hawley Pulp & Paper Company for the vacation of the alley in Block 29, Oregon City, report as follows, to wit:

We have carefully gone over the premises in question and find that all the property owners in this block have requested that the said alley be vacated. We also find that the easterly end of said alley extends against the railroad track and can never be made a satisfactory way for travel either for vehicles or pedestrians.

We further find that a sewer and a flush tank are on said alley and a pole for electric wires for light, telephone and telegraph service.

While we do not as a rule favor the vacation of alleys, yet in this instance, in view of the foregoing, we recommend that the said alley be vacated, upon the condition and express agreement, finding said company and its assigns, and as a condition upon which the said alley remain vacated, that said company take care of and keep in repair said sewer and flush tank or remove the same and provide other means as adequate for caring for the sewage from said block, or locate said sewer or flush tank or both at some other place as suitable, and at such place as the Council may require, and keep the same in repair, and also provide means

for supporting and a place or places for crossing or extending electric light, telephone or telegraph wires, on said alley or block, and that each and all of the said things so to be done, be done at the expense of said Hawley Pulp and Paper Company, and in such manner as the Council may adopt or require, and should these conditions be not faithfully complied with, or at any time should said company fail to keep and comply with each of said conditions, that said alley shall then be considered to be open to the public and the public shall have the right to go upon the said alley, the same as if it had not been vacated.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to take up matters relative to the improvement of Eleventh and Twelfth Streets and matters relative to the change of grade of Twelfth Street and any other matter which might regularly come before the Council.

The Committee heretofore appointed to consider the matter of the improvement of Eleventh Street from Water Street to Van Burn Street, the kind of improvement and son to be made upon such street, reported to the Council and recommended that the following kind of improvement be made upon said Eleventh Street.

Improvement of Eleventh Street from Water Street to Van Buren Street
From the westerly line of Main Street on the

southerly 60 feet of Eleventh Street said improvement shall consist of a frame and pile trestle 60 feet wide for a distance of 200 feet westerly; thence with a contracting width of said frame and pile trestle to that of 56.7 feet westerly to the east line of Water Street. Said improvement to be done in accordance with the established grade of said street.

From the easterly line of Main Street to the easterly line of Van Buren Street said improvement of Eleventh Street shall consist in making such excavation\ and embankment as is necessary to bring the street to sub-grade, the entire width of the street except at such places as in the judgment of the Committee on Street and Public Property of the Council of Oregon City and the City Engineer it is not essential to bring to sub-grade that part of the street occupied by sidewalk or parking; of placing a line of wood curbing 12 feet from the property line on each side of said street; of constructing wood sidewalks 6 feet wide on each side of said street; of placing macadam on that portion of the street (36 feet) between curb lines, the macadam to be a depth of not less than 6 inches at the curb line and 9 inches at the center of the street, and of placing such drains and culverts and doing such other work as shall be necessary to complete the improvement of said street in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor to be prepared by the City Engineer and by grading said street according to the established grade thereof.

Upon motion the report of the Committee was adopted and the Recorder was instructed to publish the necessary notice, provided by the Charter, for the improvement of Eleventh Street in accordance with the foregoing report of the Committee from east line of Water Street to east line of Van Buren Street.

The committee heretofore appointed to consider the matter of the improvement of Twelfth Street, the kind of improvement to be made upon such street and so on, reported to the Council that the improvement of said street could not be proceeded with at present for the reason that there was some property in Twelfth Street owned by private individuals and that the city could not improve the street over such private property before acquiring the same. Said committee asked for more time in which to report as to the kind of improvement on said street and recommended that a Committee be appointed to consider the matter of the formation of a district as provided by the Charter for the acquiring and paying for said private property.

Upon motion said report was adopted by the Council and the Committee was given more time in which to report as to the kind of improvement on said Twelfth Street and it was ordered that a committee of three be appointed to consider the matter of the formation of a district as provided by the Charter for the acquiring and paying for said private property. The Mayor appointed Councilmen Andresen, Betzel and Cooke upon said committee.

Upon motion the Recorder was instructed to publish the necessary notice as provided by the City Charter for the alteration and re-establishment of the grade of the south half of Twelfth Street from the west line of Washington Street to a point 152.7 feet east of the east line of said Washington Street. Said new grade to be established in accordance with the following

survey recommended by the City Engineer.

Beginning (for south on-half of Twelfth Street) at an elevation of 132 feet at the west line of Washington Street, thence on an ascending grade across Washington Street to the east side of Washington Street, at an elevation of 133 feet, thence easterly on a descending grade to an elevation of 130 feet to a point 152.7 feet east of the east line of Washington Street.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Committee on Streets and Public Property advertise for sealed bids for the construction of concrete sidewalk in front of city property on Main Street at Third and Main Streets.

Pratt, chief clerk of the printer and publisher of the Oregon City Courier, the city official paper, that said ordinance had been published as by the Charter provided, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon motion and roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Andresen, Betzel, Cooke, Knapp, Meyer, Michels, Sheahan and Pope (8). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilman Strickland (1). The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

The bid of O. B. Jefferson, W. W. Linten and G. T. Palmer for cleaning Main Street, etc., were read and placed on file until the committee heretofore appointed was ready to report relative to the matter of obtaining a street sweeper.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of leasing property on or near the South End Road 200 feet by 200 feet from Mr. H. Schroeder was referred to the committee on Streets and Public Property to report back to the Council at the next meeting.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of compelling public service corporations such as telephone, electric light companies, etc., to give service to anyone within the city limits asking for same, the investigation of the same and the drawing of an ordinance to that effect if the hereinafter named committee saw fit to draw such ordinance was referred to a committee consisting of the Mayor, the City Attorney and three Councilmen appointed by the Mayor. The Council of Oregon City, Oregon met in special session pursuant to the call of the Mayor on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider matters relative to the passage of certain pending ordinance, including the time and manner ordinance for Eleventh Street, improvement, the assessment ordinance for Water Street improvement and the franchise ordinance granting certain franchise rights to F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, over certain streets in Oregon City, and any other matter which might regularly come before the Council.

In the absence of the Recorder, upon action of the Council by separate vote taken, Councilman F. J. Meyer was selected as Recorder Pro-Tem for the present session of the Council.

The ordinance granting certain franchise rights to the Oregon & California Railroad Company on Center Street, at about Fifteenth Street, was read and upon motion it was ordered that said railroad company furnish the City with copies of blue prints, with figures on fills, and copies of said ordinance, and that the grade stakes be set at said location and that the Council meet in a body on the ground at the location of said franchise rights Wednesday night, August 11th, 1909, at 7 o'clock P. M. to consider the same and report to the Council.

The communication of J. I. Fuller, Vice President of the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, relative to the fill under the bridge on Main Street, north of Fourteenth Street, was read, the same was ordered filed and referred to the Mayor and the Committee on Streets and Public Property for consideration to report back at the next meeting of the Council.

The report of the City Attorney relative to matters pertaining to the improvement of Taylor Street was read and upon motion placed on file.

Upon motion the City Engineer was instructed to make the necessary survey and report to the Council for the change and re-establishment of the grade of Taylor Street from the north line of Seventh Street to the south line of Twelfth Street.

Ordinance No. 449

An Ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving Eleventh Street of Oregon City, Oregon, from the westerly line of Main Street on the southerly 60 feet of said Eleventh Street for a distance of 200 feet westerly, thence with a contracting width to that of 56. feet westerly to the easterly line of Water Street, also from the easterly line of Main Street to the easterly line of Van Buren Street was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of C. A. Pratt, Chief Clerk of the Publisher and Printer of the Oregon City Courier, the City official paper, that said ordinance had been published in the issue of said paper dated July 30, 1909 as by Charter provided, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Andresen, Betzel, Meyer, Michels, Knapp, Sheahan and Strickland (7). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilman Pope (1).

Previous to the vote upon said ordinance the rules were suspended and Councilman Knapp was allowed to vote. The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Finance Committee be given more time in which to report to the Council its findings in the matter of tax rebate

for Mrs. Randall.

Upon motion it was ordered that the City Attorney represent the City's interest and make appearance for the City in the suit of John T. Apperson vs Oregon City et al relative to certain proceedings instituted in the Circuit Court in regard to Eleventh Street improvement.

The report of Dr. J. W. Norris, City Health Officer, relative to alleged nuisance at Eighth and Taylor Streets was read and referred to the Committee on Health and Police for investigation, with instructions to report back to the Council.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the final consideration and second passage of Ordinance granting certain franchise rights over certain streets in Oregon City to F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, be deferred until an adjourned meeting of this special meeting to be held Wednesday, August 11, 1909, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the second reading, voting upon and the final passage of an ordinance declaring the probable cost of and the assessment and the share of each tract, lot or part thereof, for the improvement of Water Street, Oregon City, Oregon from the northerly line of Fifth Street to the southerly line of Sixth Street and directing an entry of such assessment in the docket of City Liens, be deferred until an adjourned meeting of the present special meeting of the Council to be held Wednesday, August 11, 1909, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the complaint as to rock put upon Water Street between Fifth and Sixth Streets be referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property for investigation.

Upon motion it was ordered that the

matter of placing fire hose in Kansas City Addition be referred to the Committee on Fire and Water for investigation.

Upon motion and roll call a warrant for the sum of \$35.00 was ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of First National Bank, account of P. S. Finucane, special police services.

Upon motion Council adjourned to meet again in adjourned session of the present special session on Wednesday, August 11, 1909, at 8 o'clock P. M.
