

RESOLUTION NO. 23-2011

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO INCREASE THE PERSONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH AHA CONSULTING, INC. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000 THROUGH THE END OF FISCAL YEAR 2010/2011

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie entered into a personal services agreement with aHa Consulting, Inc. for website redesign services in June 2010 for an amount not to exceed \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, the amount of that personal services agreement was within the City Manager's authority to obligate the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has identified the goal of cultivating other avenues of two-way communication between its citizens; and

WHEREAS, an element of that goal is to evaluate the effectiveness of the City's public outreach and communication strategy; and

WHEREAS, a potential outcome of that goal is to modify the City's business practices through online services, and

WHEREAS, certain modifications are outside the scope of staff expertise and require professional programming services to accomplish in excess of the original personal services agreement with aHa Consulting, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, increasing the amount of the personal services agreement beyond \$25,000 requires City Council authorization;


NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the City Council of the City of Milwaukie authorizes the City Manager to increase the City's personal services agreement with aHa Consulting, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 to continue to upgrade the City's website through the end of fiscal year 2010/2011.

Section 2: That the City's personal services agreement with aHa Consulting, Inc. should not exceed \$30,000 through the end of the fiscal year 2010/2011.

Section 3: This resolution takes effect immediately upon passage.
