GOAL SESSION

The Milwaukie City Council participated in a goal setting session on October 22, 1983 for the purpose of determining goals for the coming year. Present at the session were the following Councilors:

Himmel spoke briefly of future needs and goals from last year as outlined by Council prior to the goal setting session. He asked that Council prioritize the major goals decided on last year keeping in mind available city resources. The vote was as follows:

1. Service Provision - 7 votes
2. Growth Policy - Transportation - 5 votes
3. Community Relations - Budgeting Process - 4 votes
4. Capital Improvements - 0 votes

There was discussion on the results of the vote. Council agreed that Community Relations should be equally as important as Service Provision, and that Capital Improvements as outlined would not involve city resources to the same extent as the others. City manager said a staff person would have to be assigned to a Capital Improvements Committee.

Himmel asked that Council prioritize the subheadings under each major goal with the following results:

City Services

1. Maintain 1983-84 level of services
2. Develop a more extensive code enforcement program
3. Develop a volunteer program
4. Develop, with the assistance of the PARC, an expanded program of park maintenance and recreation opportunities
5. Implement and expand recycling program

Community Relations

1. Expand the mailing of city information to citizens
2. Meet with advisory commissions on a regular basis
3. Hold town meetings in different areas of the city
4. Have Cable TV coverage

Transportation

1. Determine location of Tri-Met transfer station
2. Determine desirability and location of transit trunk line improvements between Milwaukie and the Clackamas Town Center
3. Decide on McLoughlin improvements at Tacoma and through downtown Milwaukie

Growth

1. Hold election on Linwood annexation
2. Fund continuation of Milwaukie Storefront or similar downtown development program
3. Develop statement defining desired riverfront development and a strategy for financing implementation

Budget Process

1. Conduct a tax base election to achieve a tax base at a level which provides for desired city services
2. Survey community residents to determine priorities prior to goal setting
3. Initiate discussions to achieve state-wide collective bargaining reform and a more equitable resolution of bargaining impasse.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:20 p.m.
