WORK SESSION

A work session of the Milwaukie City Council was held on June 15, 1982 with the following councilors present:

City Manager asked Council to note change on the regular meeting agenda, June 15. Under Consent Agenda, item V c, request for special liquor license for Festival Daze was not necessary and should not be on agenda. In its place will be a request for a blanket permit for Festival Daze activities.

Municipal Court Procedures

City Attorney has requested that Len Kovac, Prosecuting Attorney continue on an on call arrangement to handle outstanding warrants. Eades said he could handle the routine matters but Kovac's experience with the court and judge would be valuable. There is enough money in the Legal Department budget to cover this, Eades said, and he does not anticipate that many hours will be involved. Kovac will be paid \$45.00 per hour and the fines received will more than cover his fees.

It was MOVED by Graf, SECONDED by Bischoff to accept recommendation of City Attorney. MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

City Manager reviewed schedule for the balance of the evaluation and selection process for Cable T.V. proposals to be heard June 21 and 22.

Bev Bookin, Planning Consultant from Cogan and Associates, presented a report containing assessment of feasibility of annexing areas adjacent to Milwaukie, listing estimate of time and cost for consultation in these matters by Cogan and Associates between June 1982 and January 1983. The tasks listed were as follows:

1. Explore alternative approaches to economic revitalization.
2. Develop and implement a strategy to respond to incorporation efforts of areas adjacent to Milwaukie.
3. Continue to assess feasibility/desireability of annexation.

There was discussion on the area under study and whether the Council would want to include the area to I-205. There was extensive discussion on the provision of services and problems caused by this. The Council did not think a contract could be agreed upon at this time.

It was decided to have further discussions with staff and take up the matter at a later date.
