WORK SESSION

A work session of the Milwaukie City Council was held on August 3, 1982 with the following Councilors present:

Mayor Burgess called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Brown presented the billing from Cogan & Associates for an additional charge of \$1,740 for research and a report on the incorporation matter that came up the last 3 to 4 months. They did not have a contract for the additional work and it proved to be more time consuming than they had expected. They are agreeable to accepting half of the amount billed.

Brown asked the Council to approve payment of one more months' rent for his apartment. He will be moving into his house soon.

Eades handed out a memorandum with information for candidates filing for Mayor and Councilor positions. The memo listed deadlines for filing necessary documents.

Brown went over his recommendations for compensation for employees not covered by collective bargaining procedures. The recommendations are covered in the City Manager's memo to Council of July 30. Employee compensation was discussed.

The flyer regarding construction of a Tacoma St. overpass on McLoughlin Blvd. was passed around by Council and discussed. The flyer was mailed to residents of the city by Easton Cross, General Manager of Kasch's Garden Center & Nursery. The proposed overpass would go through the retail nursery.

The City Attorney's salary was discussed and compared with cities of similar size that have full-time City Attorneys.

The salary of the Municipal Court Judge was discussed and deferred until a letter could be sent to him regarding reduction of case load, payment of Social Security and possibility of a contract rather than payment of salary. The Council would like to have him present at a work session where a discussion could be held. It was suggested that Judge Morgan may be willing to accept less as the case load is 1/3 to 1/4 less than previous years. However, there is a possibility that Clackamas County District Court will be sending city cases back to Municipal Court for prosecution due

to the heavy District Court load and lack of money.

Paulson asked about the possibility of the city receiving funds from the Clackamas County Sheriff's levy. Eades said a consortium of county cities might have a chance to get into the levy and he was instructed by the Council to look into the possibilities.

The secretary announced that the North Clackamas Jr. Softball League representatives would not be present to make the presentation of the junior girls softball trophy to the city at the regular meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:48 p.m.
