Bill McDonald announced that a formal presentation will be made to City Council after Steve Hubbard has a chance to respond to the report. Suggestions were made that the government have its own public access on cable as an information medium for things such as, City Council meetings, police or fire department presentations, banking and data-based uses, elections, ballot measures, institutional uses, and educational programs for schools.

At 6:15 p.m. the City Council held a work session to continue their discussion on the impacts of Ballot Measure No. 2.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Mayor Kinsella introduced visitors Susan Clift with Troop 15 of the Boy Scouts, who are working on citizenship in the community.

Mayor Kinsella read a Proclamation about the YMCA Indian Guide Programs Week, September 23-29, 1984.

Dick Bailey gave a brief detail of a four-alarm fire which happened on September 13, 1984 on 32nd and Harrison.

LEGISLATION

Repeal of obsolete ordinance re sanitary and storm sewers

Greg Eades presented a memorandum as a first reading. It was MOVED by Hall, SECONDED by Wilson that this be the first reading of the ordinance by title only. The MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Amendment to ordinance re towing of abandoned vehicles

This amendment has been prepared to make the process more understandable and easier to enforce. Al Liane and Bill Hupp both expressed concern about having out-of-town friends parking their vehicles in front of the homes of people who drive them around this area while visiting. Staff explained that every attempt would be made to discover who the vehicle belonged to before determining it to be abandoned. It was MOVED by Hall, SECONDED by Wilson, that this be the first reading of the ordinance by title only. The MOTION CARRIED unanimously. Bill Hupp raised the question if utility trailers are considered vehicles. Council directed Greg Eades to research to see if there are any ordinances that deal with utility trailers and, if not, to bring a proposed ordinance to the next meeting.

Amendment to ordinance regulating security alarm systems and resolution setting fees

The amendment has been prepared to make the ordinance easier to understand and a request has been made to raise the fees as the current fees are inadequate. The question was raised about the current ordinance not allowing the programming of alarms to go directly to the police department. Mayor Kinsella suggested notifying the people that have applied for permits or have a business license associated with this in the city and make them aware that the ordinance is being rewritten to allow them the opportunity to review it and direct them to send written comments to Council or to attend the next meeting. It was MOVED by Kinsella,

SECONDED by Hall, to table the amendment to the ordinance regulating security alarm systems and resolution setting fees. MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Payment of bills

It was MOVED by Wilson, SECONDED by Kinsella, that the bills listed for September 18, 1984 be approved for payment. MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

OTHER BUSINESS

Annual evaluation of cable system-Cable Communications

Mayor Kinsella announced that the presentation by the Cable Commission will be tabled until next month.

Request to postpone appeal - Dieringer Properties

Steve Hall explained that Dieringer Properties appeal will be set aside until the second meeting of October.

Letter from Task Force on Needy - Doug McClure, Co-Chair

Doug McClure sent a letter to Council requesting that Council endorse a letter to local organizations to supply help for the needy. Mayor Kinsella prepared and read the letter and directed staff to put this item on the agenda to look at again right after the first of the year.

Appointment of Library Board member

It was MOVED by Hall, SECONDED by Wilson to appoint Carmelita Sweeney. MOTION CARRIED unanimously. Roger Hall suggested writing a letter to Mart Hughes notifying him that Council would like to maintain his interest and encourage him to apply for other commissions in the city.

Public Hearing for Withdrawals from Wichita and Clackamas Water Districts

Steve Hall requested that Council set a public hearing for withdrawals from Wichita and Clackamas water districts for the second meeting in October.

Roger Hall asked if we have or can get a progress report on the referral made earlier to the park and recreation commission with regard to possible improvements to be made at the south end of Main Street in regard to the area now encrusted with blackberry bushes. Steve Hall said there would be a report at the next meeting.

Cable Commission

Mayor Kinsella suggested instituting a work program to begin utilizing public access on the cable system and suggested notifying different groups showing interest, such as, the candidates running for office, taking the actions to set up a forum and put it on the public access prior to the election, and a presentation on the impacts of Measure No. 2 be made on cablevision outlining the potential impacts of the passage of Measure 2 as well as any other measure with significant public impact.

CONSENT

It was MOVED by Hall, SECONDED by Wilson, to approve the minutes of September 4, 1984. MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

INFORMATION

Public Works Director announced that the newsletter will be reaching homes and staff would like to solicit comments back.

It was MOVED by Hall, SECONDED by Wilson, to adjourn. The meeting was adjourned at 8:03 p.m.
