#### **Regular Meeting**

- 1. Call to order: 7:00pm
- 2. Introductions
- 3. Approval of minutes September 24, 2015 Regular Meeting: Approved as written.
- 4. Citizen comments on issues and items not on the agenda:
  - a. Karen Buehrig, Scout Troop 45064 leader and members of the troop spoke regarding D.C. Latourette Park & Barclay Parks. The troop would like to apply for a *Karma for Kara* grant to host an open house at a park to find out what improvements the community would prefer. PRAC and staff recommended working on Lautourette Park. Motion Gifford, second Neely for PRAC to write letter of support to the scout troop for the grant to hold a community gathering at Latourette Park. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. Presentations
  - a. Beavercreek Road Concept Plan Update, Pete Walter, City Planner. Re-adoption process for area plan, which is in the UGA but not yet in the City limits. Concept plan is required in order to consider future annexation. City approved initial concept plan in 2007-08, however, it was appealed to LUBA and remanded back to City and Metro to resolve some of the issues identified. Issues were settled in 2014, appeals were dismissed, and the City may now proceed with re-adoption. Planning Division requests PRAC's input

and support. Motion Meier and second Tupper (amended) to support and provide ongoing input into the parks & trails portion of the plan. Motion passed unanimously.

- 6. General business
  - Willamette Falls Legacy Project Reminder PRAC tour of the site is scheduled for October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2:00 PM.
  - b. Barclay Hills Park playground replacement. Working with the Oregon City High School construction program. Schematic of proposed playground distributed. Archer reminded PRAC that the program's instructor Britt Tucker is retiring after this school year, and the status of the construction program is not certain. PRAC discussion about how they might support and relay the importance of the program to the school district and community. Bob Burns will contact the Superintendent of the school district to discuss the matter and report back to the PRAC about potential future action.
  - c. Latourette Park: Moved this discussion into 5.a. PRAC requested to discuss at this meeting. Reviewed this issue in conjunction with the request of the Girl Scouts Troop to work with the City.
  - Movies in the Park discussion continued from last meeting at request of committee.
     Doug Neeley concerns about content (rating) of movie. PRAC requested reviewing the selection of movies for future years.
  - e. Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee member terms. Three members' terms expire December 31, 2015; Roger Fowler-Thias, Kathleen Baker, and Shawn Dachtler.
    All are eligible to apply for an additional term. To date we've received three applications, two from current members. Interviews to be scheduled at next meeting.
- 7. Future agenda items
  - a. PRAC interviews at next meeting
  - b. Parks Development Budget (SDC's) discussion next meeting
- 8. PRAC member reports
  - a. Roger Fowler-Thias:
    - i) Pioneer Center update Holiday Wreath sales are brisk, and we are gearing up for a big push to encourage volunteering at the Pioneer Center. We have new volunteer posters, and hope to get these out and about in the community. The last Autumn Hike was Wednesday the 21st and it was a very positive season. Our annual appeal letter is ready to be mailed in early November. A dental bus will be here Thursday

Nov. 12 for the second time this year as part of a grant. Halloween costume party is scheduled on Oct. 30 around lunch time. There will be prizes, cookie decorating, a small craft table and the movie 'Hocus Pocus' will be playing.

- ii) Library Art A call for artists was sent out nationally October 1st with an October 30 application deadline. Artist interviews and selection of finalist will happen mid November.
- iii) The Oregon City Parks Foundation by-Laws are still in review.
- b. Doug Neeley: Trails connectivity. Suggest we look at signage on streets where there are connections between parks, and recommend consideration of some funding to address this in the next budget cycle. Questions about disc golf.
- c. Joyce Gifford: Pickleball use update. October is teen traffic safety month.
- d. Bob Burns: Noted the amount of rentals, Meals on Wheels, and other uses. Suggests we schedule a future meeting at the Pool to view the recent upgrades. Also, would suggest a future tour of Ermatinger House. School district transportation facility would like more information at some point.
- Dachtler: Election of Chair timeline members may want to consider nominations in December.
- 9. Staff reports:
  - a. Ermatinger House project update: The project has been finalized. Programming and use still needs to be determined.
  - b. Recreation update: Monthly reports distributed.
  - c. Pickleball group update.
  - d. Newell Creek Canyon Steering committee meeting was held Monday evening, Scott Archer attended. Final public open house meeting to be held in December, details will be distributed to PRAC.

Dear Scott,

We appreciate the opportunity to prove ourselves at Hillendale Park as a viable and vibrant revitalization of the once-moribund tennis courts here and establishment of a sustainable and growing pickleball venue at this park. Starting with the Launch Party on Saturday June 20<sup>th</sup>, this challenging location has steadily grown into a premier location enjoyed by the local players as the bedrock of action. We have sold dozens of paddles to new players here and expect this trend to grow in coming years.

Locally our USAPA NW Oregon District has raised over \$22,000 in paddles and net sales, memberships and special fundraisers to provide growing clubs with support and amenities at their respective venues From Newport and Northern Oregon Coast, Wilsonville, Tualatin, Newberg, Lake Oswego and now Oregon City. Storage boxes hold playing equipment and related hospitality items to create a welcoming presence and the portapotty at Hillendale provides sanitation at our expense since no other close options exist. Our support at Hillendale this season exceeds \$3000 in materials and related expenditures.

We are conducting fundraisers at each of our venues now going into budgeting periods and would like to extend an offer to raise funds via matching grant from our USAPA NW District towards improvements at Hillendale which might include resurfacing/restripe on playing surfaces, lighting, removal of unused basketball hoops and sanitation facilities. In Tualatin we successfully partnered with Park & Rec there to upgrade lighting from dim parking lot configuration to modern cost-effective L.E.D. court-specific lighting for evening play...Pickleballers are undeterred from cold or dampness but darkness is an issue for our preferred after-work playtimes.

I can speak for our local District that funds are readily available to support Trails End Pickleball Club in such a fundraiser to show support for our Sport to Oregon City. As an example we raised \$3000 in cash and \$1000 in short-term pledges (membership drive underway) in Tualatin which allowed their Park/Rec to secure matching funds and grants in safety/policing to offset lighting costs.

We applooking forward to continued successful relationship here with your department.

#### PARKS SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT

#### **FUND OVERVIEW**

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The City collects System Development Charges (SDCs) for Parks Development to construct projects which provide additional capacity and increase parks and open space facilities and resources. The Park and Recreation Master Plan and Capital Improvement Plan identify and prioritize projects that are eligible for SDC funding, as defined through Municipal Code. Planning for growth related system improvements is also considered eligible for SDC funding.

- Completed Glen Oak and Filbert Run Parks Master Plans
- Updated Trails Plan

#### **GOALS AND PROJECTS**

- Utilize Parks and Recreation Master Plan to begin developing strategies for acquisition and development recommendations, pending available funding, to implement
