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August 11, 1909

The Council of Oregon City, Oregon, met in special adjourned session of the special session of said Council held August 9, 1909, on the above date at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider matters relative to the Swift franchise for railroad purposes, etc. and the final passage of assessment ordinance for the improvement of Water Street between Fifth and Sixth Street, and any other matter which might regularly come before the Council.

In the absence of the Recorder, by order of the Council by separate vote taken, Councilman F. J. Meyer was chosen as Recorder Pro-Tem for the present meeting of the Council.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the final vote and passage upon ordinance granting certain franchise rights unto F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, over certain streets in Oregon City be deferred until an adjourned meeting of the present meeting of the Council to be held August 18, 1909, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Ordinance No. 450

An Ordinance declaring the probable cost of and the assessment and the share of each tract, lot or part thereof, for the improvement of Water Street, Oregon City, Oregon, from the northerly line of Fifth Street to the southerly line of Sixth Street, and directing an entry of such assessment in the docket of City liens was read for the second time and it appearing to the Council from the affidavits of C. A. Pratt, Chief Clerk of the Publisher of the Oregon City Courier, the city official paper, that said ordinance was published in the said paper in the issue dated July 30, 1909, as required by the City Charter, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed, the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Andresen, Meyer, Michels, Knapp and Sheahan (5). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilmen Betzel, Cooke, Pope and Strickland. The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Upon motion the Council adjourned to meet again in adjourned special session of the present adjourned special session upon Wednesday August 18, 1909 at 8 o'clock P. M.

In the absence of the Mayor Councilman Knapp, President of the Council, presided and acted as Mayor. In the absence of the Recorder by order of the Council, by separate vote taken, Councilman C. W. Pope was chosen as Recorder Pro-Tem for the present meeting of the Council.

The acting Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the passage of certain ordinances granting franchise rights to F. M. Swift, also to the Oregon & California Railroad Company

and any other matters which might regularly come before the Council.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the final vote upon and 2nd passage of the ordinance granting certain franchise rights for railroad purposes over certain streets in Oregon City to F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, be deferred until an adjourned meeting of the present meeting to be held Monday August 23rd, 1909 at 8 o'clock and that in the meantime the Committee on Streets and Public Property should investigate the same thoroughly and report their findings to the Council.

Upon motion the matter of the repair of sewer on 11th Street was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

Upon motion and roll call a warrant for \$20.00 was ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of W. Rambo, as rebate for moving picture show license not used.

The communication of the Oregon City Lumber & Manufacturing Company relative to the laying of a plank roadway on 16th Street was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

Ordinance No. ____

An Ordinance authorizing and permitting Oregon and California Railroad Company, its lessee, successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate a side track in Center Street of Oregon City from a point in the main track of Oregon and California Railroad Company at the southerly end of the trestle of Oregon and California Railroad Company crossing Abernethy creek to a point where the north line of 15th Street crosses the said main track of said Oregon and California Railroad Company and to construct and make and maintain a fill in Center Street between the south line of 16th Street and the north line of 15th Street was read for the first time and upon motion ordered published.

Upon motion Council adjourned to meet again in adjourned session of the present special adjourned session on Monday, August 23rd 1909 at 8 o'clock P. M.

In the absence of the Mayor, A. Knapp, President of the Council, acted as Mayor and presided at the meeting.

He announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the final passage of ordinance granting to F. M. Swift, certain franchise rights for railway purposes in Oregon City, and any other matter which might regularly be brought before the Council.

The estimate of the City Engineer as to the amount of dirt required to fill under the bridge on Main Street north of 14th Street was read and referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property, and said committee, together with the Mayor, to whom had heretofore been referred said matter, were given more time in which to report.

Upon motion the saloon license of Bennett & Moon was transferred to J. B. Kerrick, provided he should furnish the required bond.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property reported that they had been unable to confer with Mr. F. M. Swift in regard to the ordinance granting him certain franchise rights for railway purposes over certain streets in Oregon City, and upon motion it was ordered that the final vote and passage of said ordinance be deferred until the September regular meeting.

In the absence of the Mayor, Councilman A. Knapp, President of the council, presided and acted as Mayor.

The minutes of the meetings of the Council held August 4, 1909, August 9, 1909, August 11, 1909, August 18, 1909 and August 23, 1909 were read and upon motion approved by the Council.

The communications of the Western Union Telegraph Company and the Portland Railway Light & Power Company relative to painting the poles of said companies in Oregon City were read and ordered filed.

The following resolutions were read and adopted by the Council.

Resolution

Whereas Oregon City did issue Improvement Bond No. 68 for the sum of \$500.00 on Nov. 1, 1907 for the

payment of a portion of the cost of the improvement of Madison Street and whereas said bond is subject to cancellation on Nov. 1, 1909.

Therefore be it resolved that said improvement bond No. 68 be and the same is hereby ordered canceled on Nov. 1, 1909 and that the principal and interest shall be paid on that date and that interest shall cease on the same on said date.

Resolution

Whereas Oregon City did issue Improvement Bond No. 46 for the improvement of Jackson Street in said city in the sum of \$500.00 dated Oct. 1, 1908 and whereas said bond is subject to cancellation on Oct. 1, 1909. Therefore Be It Resolved that said Improvement Bond No. 46 for the sum of \$500.00 be and the same is hereby ordered canceled on Oct. 1, 1909 and that the principal and interest on said bond be paid on that date, and that interest shall cease from and after said date.

The Records report for the month ending September 1, 1909 was read and adopted by the Council.

The initiative petition of M. D. Phillips, R. B. Beatie, D. C. Baker, et al asking that the following ordinance named by title be submitted to the legal voters of Oregon City for their approval or rejection at the regular municipal election to be held in said City the first Monday in December 1909 was read. Said ordinance was designated by title as follows:

An Ordinance

To instruct the Mayor and Council of

Oregon City, to remove from the public square known as Block No. 40 in Oregon City, the structure commonly known as the McLoughlin building, to prohibit its being placed upon any other public square in Oregon City, and to repeal every resolution, permission or license by the Council, the Mayor or any other officers of Oregon City allowing the said structure or any other old or second hand building to be placed on said Block 40 or any other public square in Oregon City.

Said ordinance was also read to the Council and upon motion the whole of said matter was laid on the table.

Upon motion it was ordered that the claim of City Attorney, Livy Stipp, in the sum of \$15.00 for the examination and work upon Swift franchise and further for the sum of \$10.00 for examination and work upon Oregon & California Railroad Company franchise be struck from the report of said Finance Committee.

Later upon motion and roll call a warrant for the sum of \$25.00 was ordered drawn upon the General Fund in favor of Livy Stipp, City Attorney, for payment of his bill incurred in the examination and work upon said Swift and

Oregon & California Railroad franchises.

Ordinance No. 451

An Ordinance authorizing and permitting Oregon and California Railroad Company its lessee, successors and assigns to construct, maintain and operate a side track in Center Street of Oregon City from a point in the main track of Oregon and California Railroad Company at the southerly end of the trestle of Oregon and California Railroad Company crossing Abernethy Creek to a point where the north line of 15th Street crosses the said main track of said Oregon and California Railroad Company and to construct, make and maintain a fill in Center Street between the south line of Sixteenth Street and the north line of Fifteenth Street was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of W. A. Shewman, Jr., printer and publisher of the Oregon City Courier, the City official paper, that said ordinance had been published in the Oregon City Courier, on the date of August 20, 1909 as by the City Charter provided upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon roll call passed the vote being as follows: Ayes, Councilmen Betzel, Cooke, Knapp, Michels, Meyer and Sheahan (6). Noes, none (0). Absent, Councilmen Andresen, Pope and Strickland (3). The acting Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

Upon motion it was ordered that the matter of the final consideration and passage of the ordinance granting certain franchise

rights to F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, for railway purposes over certain street in Oregon City, be deferred, said matter, to be taken up at any time subject to the call of the Mayor.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Street Superintendent notify, the property owners, owning a certain barn at about the northeast corner of Block 173 in Kansas City Addition and near Sixteenth Street to remove the same from said street within ten days from the date of such notice and if said barn were not so torn down that the Street Superintendent should tear the same down and remove it and collect the expense from the owners of said barn.

An Ordinance granting to F. M. Swift, his successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate electric railways, telephone and telegraph lines on Fifth Street from top of

bluff easterly to Monroe Street, on Monroe Street from Fifth Street to Sixth Street, on Sixth Street from Monroe Street easterly across Jackson Street, on Center Street from south side of Fifth Street to Tenth Street and thence northerly 160 feet, on Eleventh Street from 100 feet westerly of west line of Washington Street, to John Adams Street on John Adams Street from Eleventh Street north to city limits, on Fifteenth Street from Jefferson Street, to Water Street, on Water Street from Fifteenth Street to Tenth Street, on Eleventh Street from east side of Main Street to Water Street, on Center Street from Sixth Street to First Street and on First Street from Sixth Street westerly to bluff at Railroad Avenue, and to construct, maintain and operate elevators on portions of Fifth or Sixth or Seventh Streets in the City of Oregon City, State of Oregon, was read for the first time and upon motion ordered published to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held Monday, September 27, 1909 at 8 o'clock P. M.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to consider matters relative to the purchase of certain fire equipment and the consideration of the acceptance of Water Street and any other matter which might regularly come before the Council.

Mr. A. G. Long of Portland appeared before the Council and explained to the Council the workings of the chemical engine and upon motion the matter of the purchase of chemical engine for the fire department was referred to the Committee on Fire and Water for investigation and to report back at the next meeting of the Council.

Upon motion and roll call a warrant for \$36.00 was ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of David Caufield, account special

police services.

The estimate of the City Engineer as to the amount of work done by contractor Harry Jones upon Water Street from Fifth to Sixth Streets was read together with his report that he found the work satisfactory and in accordance with the contract.

Upon motion said estimate and report were accepted by the Council and upon motion and roll call warrants on the following funds in the following amounts were ordered drawn in payment thereof:

The application of the Hawley Pulp and Paper Company for granting certain permit for the laying of pipe on Third Street was brought before the Council and after consideration of said matter the following motion was introduced and seconded and upon the same being put it was carried.

On motion the application of the Hawley Pulp & Paper Company to lay a pipe line down Third Street is hereby granted upon the following conditions, namely:

The Hawley Pulp & Paper Company is hereby granted the right to lay and maintain

a pipe line for the conveyance of oil from the northerly corner of Lot 1, Block 29 of Oregon City, Oregon, northerly across Third Street to a point 20 feet south from the southwesterly line of Block 28, thence running westerly parallel with the westerly line of Block 28 to the Willamette River – said pipe shall not exceed 10 inches in diameter, shall be buried below the surface of the street not less than 18 inches, and, after the same shall be laid, the surface of the street together with the pavements thereof, shall be repaired and relaid and left in as good condition as they now are, and the laying of said pipes shall be done under the supervision of the Committee on Streets and Public Property and subject to the approval of said Committee. The said Company shall first give a bond in the sum of \$250 to properly replace the pavement.

Upon motion it was ordered that the Street Superintendent notify the property owners, or their resident agents, owning real property abutting on Water Street between Fourth Street and Fifth Street and between Sixth Street and Eighth Street to put down a new six-foot sidewalk along their property, said sidewalk to be laid with the contour of the ground.

Upon motion the City Attorney was instructed to perfect an ordinance so as to enable the City to enter into a contract with some abstractor for an abstract of Main Street from the south line of Third Street to the end of Main Street south and report to the Council relative to the same and have said

ordinance ready for introduction.

The minutes of the meeting held September 1, 1909, September 8, 1909 and September 27, 1909, were each read and upon motion approved by the Council.

The application of D. McHenry, M. Justin, J. B. Kerrick, L. Fuchs, D. M. Klemesen, Edw. Reckner, Fred Cooper, Carl G. Hodes, Fourth and Main Streets, Carl G. Hodes, Sixth and Main Streets, Ralph O. Smith, Astman & Knightly and H. Kruger for the renewal of their saloon licenses for a period of three months from September 30, 1909, and the applications of E. A. Brady, Lawrence Ruconich, E. Matthies and Knapp & Nobel for the renewal of their saloon licenses for a period of six months from September 30, 1909, were each read and it satisfactorily appearing to the Council that each of said applicants had published notice as required by the City Charter, upon motion said licenses were ordered granted, conditioned upon the paying of all necessary license fees and filing the required bond by the respective applicants.

Upon motion the request of Thomas O'Neil that a certain old barn standing partly on his property and partly in the street, near Block 173, Kansas City Addition, be removed, was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

The petition of H. C. Stevens et al in regard to the change of grade of Sixth Street, from Bluff to Jackson Street, was read and upon motion it was ordered that the prayer of said petition be granted and that the City Engineer make the necessary survey and report the same to the Council.

The petition of John Bittner et al for the improvement of High Street from the north line of Seventh Street to the south line of Seventeenth Street was read and upon motion said matter was laid on the table

until the matter of the litigation of Eleventh Street was settled by the Court.

The petition of Wm. Sheahan et al for the change and re-establishment of grade of Water Street from the north line of Tenth Street to the first alley north together with City Engineer's report on the same, giving grade figures, was read and upon motion the prayer of said petition was granted and the Recorder was instructed to publish the necessary notice in regard to the change of said grade.

The communication of M. Justin relative to the blockading of alley next to the post office between Main Street and Water Street was read and said matter was referred to the Chief of Police for investigation and with instructions to look after the same.

The application of Geo. A. Brown to rent a certain portion of Water Street, at its junction with Fifth Street, and just south of Fifth Street, the space being 20 x 24 feet, was read. In said application, the applicant agreed to pay \$35.00 a year rent for the same.

Upon motion it was ordered that the prayer of the petition be granted and the ground be leased to him provided there were no remonstrances or protests filed by abutting property owners within thirty days from this date.

The petition of the Oregon City Commission Company to put a driveway on Eleventh Street from Main Street a distance of about 30 feet westerly was read and upon motion granted.

The petition of C. M. Fairbrother et al for two arc lights on Division Street was read and upon motion the matter was referred to a committee consisting of Councilmen

Andresen, Cooke and Sheahan for investigation and with instructions to report back to the Council.

The affidavit of Philip J. Sinnott, Chief Clerk of the Publisher and Printer of the Oregon City Courier, the City official paper, that notice of assessment of the improvement of Water Street from the southerly line of Fifth Street to the northerly line of Sixth Street had been published in said paper as by the City Charter provided, in the issues of August 27 and September 3, 1909 was read and ordered filed.

The estimate of the City Engineer relative to cost for the construction of concrete culvert from west side of Jefferson Street to the west side of Monroe Street, was read, and upon motion referred to the Street Committee for investigation with instructions to report back to the Council.

The Treasurer's quarterly report for the quarter ending September 30, 1909, was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

The Recorder's monthly report was read and adopted.

The report of the Committee on Fire and Water recommending the purchase of a hand chemical engine, Champion No. 11, from A. G. Long & Co. of Portland was read and adopted. Whereupon the following ordinance was introduced:

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of a No. 11 Champion Hand Chemical Engine was read for the first time and upon motion ordered published to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held October 18, 1909, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Also he was instructed to notify Williams Bros. Transfer Company to clean the dirt off from and fix up the sidewalk on the north side of Fifth Street between Washington and Adams Streets in front of their property.

Upon motion the committee heretofore appointed on arc lights was discharged.

The various Councilmen from the different Wards reported to the Council that they had respectively decided upon new arc lights to be placed in their respective Wards, as follows, to wit:

to the Council and the City Attorney was instructed to draw the necessary resolutions and ordinances pertaining to the same and report the same to the Council.

The petition of J.G. Finucane et al asking for the improvement of Sixteenth Street from Madison Street to Division Street was read and upon motion said petition was referred to the City Engineer with instructions to make the necessary plans, specifications and estimates, etc., pertaining to said street improvement and report the same to the Council.

The petition of James Roake et al asking for certain changes of grade on Eleventh Street was read and referred to the City Engineer for investigation and to report to the Council later on.

The communication of A. L. Beatie et al against the allowing of space between the outer edge of sidewalk and property line for Washington Street improvement, was read and upon motion the prayer of said petition was ordered granted.

The applications of James Wilkinson, Lou Cochran, Harriett Cochran and Nan Cochran and Dan Lyons to have wood sidewalks put in in front of their respective property on account of Twelfth Street improvement were each read and ordered filed.

Upon motion the saloon license of Paul Grozefsky for saloon located at Seventh and Railroad Avenue was transferred to Joseph Wilson.

The petition of F. C. Burke pertaining to Washington Street improvement was read and referred to the City Engineer for investigation.

The petition of L.A. Nobel for rebate of \$100.00 on account of saloon license ending June 30, 1910, was read and laid on the table.

Upon motion and roll call a warrant for the sum of \$83.33 was ordered drawn on the General Fund in favor of H. Kruger on account of rebate for saloon license for saloon located on the west side of Main Street between Fourth and Fifth Streets on account of fire burning up said saloon.

The Treasurer's quarterly report for the quarter ending June 30, 1910, was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

The semi-annual report of the Board of Water Commissioners was read and referred to the Finance Committee.

The Recorder's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Upon motion the matter of entering into a contract with the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for phone in Engineer's office was referred to the Finance Committee with power to act.

Upon motion the Chief of Police was instructed to notify the man running the popcorn wagon at Seventh & Main Streets to pay a license of \$10.00 per month.

The communication of the Commercial Club pertaining to sprinkling Main Street, and other matters was read and referred to the Committee on Health and Police.

The petition of E. Richards pertaining to the doing of certain work along Twelfth Street in front of his property at Twelfth and Main Streets, in connection with Twelfth Street improvement was read and referred to the contractor of said street.

Upon motion it was ordered that the provisions pertaining to the excavation of crushed rock in connection with Twelfth Street improvement, classifying the same as cement gravel, to be put in the contract that way, provided that the Engineer should be the sole judge as to what constitutes crushed rock and that the same shall be excavated and computed under his direction.

Upon motion it was ordered that in the Washington Street improvement

contract a provision be inserted as follows: "In all solid rock excavation, measurements of one foot shall be allowed below subgrade."

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the City Council of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer of said city has submitted his report and filed in the office of the Recorder, plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Jefferson Street, said city, from the southerly line of Twelfth Street, and estimates of the work to be done thereon, and the cost thereof and;

Whereas, such plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the City Council of said Oregon City, therefore,

The said plans and specifications and estimates are hereby approved and be it

Resolved, that it is the purpose and intention of the said City Council of Oregon City to make the said improvement being described as follows, to wit:

The street shall be brought to sub-grade the full width thereof between the southerly line of Second Street and the southerly line of Twelfth Street. The report of the City Engineer pertaining to 12th Street sewer was read and ordered dropped.

Whereas, said plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the City Council of said Oregon City, therefore,

The said plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and be it

Resolved, that it is the purpose and intention of the said City Council of Oregon City to make the said improvement, it being described as follows:

The street between said points shall be brought to sub-grade the full width thereof. On the road bed macadam shall be placed not less than 6 inches at the curb and not less than 9 inches at the center of the street and when completed the said road bed shall be brought to grade specified in ordinance read second time August 3rd, 1910.

Said street shall be properly provided with all drains, catch basins and gutters necessary to properly drain said street. Sidewalks shall be made of concrete, except, where upon application to the City Council owners are permitted to have wood walks laid. All sidewalks shall be six feet wide and laid to the property line. Curbs shall be placed on each side of the macadamized portion of the street 20 feet from the center of the street. Curbs shall be of concrete set vertically to sub-grade. Crosswalks shall be of wood 4 feet wide and not less than 3 inches thick and all the said improvement shall be made according to the plans and specifications as above stated and approved hereby.

Whereas, such plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the City Council of said Oregon City, therefore,

The plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and be it

Resolved that it is the purpose and intention of the said City Council of Oregon City to make the said improvement, being described as follows, to wit:

The street shall be brought to sub-grade to full width thereof.

On the road bed macadam shall be placed not less than 6 inches thick at curb and not less than 9 inches thick at center of street, and when completed the said roadbed shall be brought to grade specified in ordinance passed by said City Council on Sept. 7, 1910.

Said street will be properly provided with drains, catch basins and gutters necessary to preserve the grades, embankments and surface of the street, and to provide all proper drainage. Sidewalks will be made of concrete, except where on application to the

Council, owners are permitted to have wood walks laid. All sidewalks shall be six feet wide and laid to the property line. Curbs shall be placed on each side of the macadamized portion of the street 20 feet from the center line of street where the road bed is 40 feet wide. Curbs shall be of concrete and set vertically to sub-grade of street. Crosswalks shall be of wood 4 feet wide and not less than 3 inches thick and all the said improvements shall be made according to the plans and specifications filed Dec. 7, 1910 and approved hereby.

The improvement shall be classed as Macadam and shall be maintained by Oregon City for the full period of ten years from date of the acceptance thereof by the Council.

Whereas such plans, specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the City Council of said Oregon City, therefore:

The plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved for such sewer as follows, to wit:

By laying a sewer along Ninth Street from Taylor to Washington Street with vitrified terra cotta pipe having an interior diameter of 12 inches and an 8 inch sewer laid along Taylor Street from Seventh to Twelfth Street shall empty into a septic tank located at Twelfth Street Canyon and constructed of concrete and said sewer shall have the necessary manholes, lampholes, laterals and connections. It shall be laid and connected according to the plans and specifications adopted and approved by the resolution.
