

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 1937, with funding from the Federal Government of the United States of America and from the sale of voter approved General Obligation Bonds, a new Milwaukie City Hall was constructed at 10722 SE Main Street, on property that had been previously owned by the Milwaukie Union School District; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukie City Hall was dedicated and celebrated through a series of public events and activities over the weekend of July 7-11, 1938; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukie City Hall has served as a fire house, police station, public library, municipal court, employee work space, art gallery, and a meeting place for residents to express their thoughts and concerns in an open setting; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukie City Hall has continued its service to the residents and employees of Milwaukie for 80 uninterrupted years since 1938; and

WHEREAS, a grateful City wishes to acknowledge the significant role Milwaukie City Hall has played in eight decades of service to our residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Gamba, Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, a municipal corporation in the County of Clackamas, in the State of Oregon, do hereby proclaim September 7th, 2018, as Milwaukie City Hall's 80th Birthday Celebration Day, and call upon public officials, historians, students, residents, City employees, and all people of Milwaukie to observe this day, to celebrate the faithful service of City Hall, and to recognize the important role this building plays in our ability to accomplish the people's business with appropriate ceremonies, activities, and programs.
