

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JAN. 29TH. 1924.

An adjourned meeting ^{of} the two hundred sixty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 29th. day of January, 1924.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The objections of Laurel B. Kinzel and other to the proposed assessment for the improvement of 23rd Street were read and upon motion duly made and carried, the objections were over-ruled. Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 206 entitled, " An ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of 23rd. Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the south line of Washington Street, thence southerly to the north line of Young's Addition, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 206 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 206 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, McIntyre, Miller and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 206 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 206 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by Title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 206 passed. Ordinance No. 207 entitled, " An ordinance amending Section Four (4) of Ordinance number 140 and declaring an emergency," was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to post the same as required by the City Charter. The matter of the Town of Milwaukie gravelling 28th Street through the Hoesly tract was left with the Mayor and Mr. Zanders. Upon motion duly made and carried, R. S. Milln was appointed City Engineer..

Mr. B. McLaren was present and requested the Council to furnish him with bull run water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of Mr. McLaren was granted upon the same terms and prices that the other water users outside of Milwaukie were paying the Town.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to put in a crosswalk on the east side of 23rd. Street, at Washington Street, and put in a cross walk on the south side of Elmer Street at 31st. Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEB. 5TH. 1924.

A special meeting of the Council was held on the 5th day of February, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, councilmen Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, and Recorder Mathews.

Mayor Cowell stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering an amendment to the City Charter authorizing the Council to levy a special tax on the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie each year for a period of ten years. The matter was taken up and discussed and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepared an amendment to the City Charter authorizing the Council to levy a tax of six mills on the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year for a period of ten years to create a sinking fund to retire the water bonds when they become due, and to enable the Council to reduce the water rates, said amendment to be submitted to the voters of the Town of Milwaukie for their adoption or rejection at a special election to be called for that purpose. Also to prepare an argument in favor of the same, and to prepare an amendment to the City Charter authorizing the construction of sewers in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and providing that the cost of the same may be paid for by the persons benefited in ten equal installments by bonding their property. Said amendment to be submitted to the voter at said special election. The Recorder to be paid for his services for preparing said amendments and argument and conducting said election. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to establish the grades on 28th. Street from Harrison Street to Washington Street and from Lake Road to Kellogg Lake. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
