

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 4TH. 1922.

The two hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, was held on the 4th day of April, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Shindler, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Streib, and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the two hundred fortieth regular meeting held on the 7th day of March, 1922, and of the adjourned meetings held on the 15th day of March, 1922, and the 22 day of March, 1922, were read and approved as read. Mr. Counsell of the Street Committee informed the Council that he had covered the can pile and rubbish at the foot of Washington Street with dirt. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance prohibiting the dumping of cans and other garbage and rubbish on private property within the Town of Milwaukie. A communication from the P. R. L. & P. Co. giving an estimate of the cost of moving certain arc lights was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was laid on the table. The application of O. F. Witte for a dance hall license was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the application was allowed and the Recorder was instructed to issue Mr. Witte a Dance Hall License. The Treasurers report was read and ordered placed on file. Mr. Demming of Estacada was present and informed the Council that if he could get a suitable building that he would install a canary in Milwaukie.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 10TH. 1922.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the 5th day of April, 1922. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Shindler, and Albee, and Recorder Mathews. The objections of Richard Walsh to the amount allowed him by the Viewers on the proposed extension of ~~Harrison~~ Harrison St. for his property appropriated for said extension and to the report of the Viewers in general were read and upon motion duly made and carried the objections were over-ruled. The objections of Francis G. Cowing, Guardian of Chas. Campbell, to the amount allowed the said Chas. Campbell by the Viewers on the proposed extension of Harrison Street for his property appropriated for said extension were read and upon motion duly made and carried, the objections were over-ruled. The objections of Nelson A. Cooper and Georgia I. Cooper to the Viewers Report on the extension of Harrison Street were read, and Mr. J. Dean Butler, attorney for Mr. Cooper, stated that the benefits assessed to the Coopers were unjust and inequitable, and that the Council had attempted to appropriated property belonging to the Coopers without allowing them any compensation for the same, and that the proceedings for the extension of Harrison, in his opinion were void, and that he objected to the adoption of said report. Upon motion duly made and carried, the objections of Nelson A. Cooper and Georgia I. Cooper to the Report of the Viewers on the proposed extension of Harrison Street were over-ruled.

The report of the Viewers on the proposed extension of Harrison Street appearing to the Council to be in all respects reasonable and just, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance adopting said report and post the same as required by the City Charter. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned,
