The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held on the 4th day of June, 1919, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried the Street Committee was instructed to repair Lake Road with sand. The Contract with the Clyde Equipment Company for renting the Roller was read and the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to execute the contract on behalf of the Town. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Company to move its guy stub and anchor on Sellwood Street east of 32nd Street 8 and 1/2 feet from property line.

The two hundred ninth regular meeting of the council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Acting Mayor Miller. Present, Miller, Counsell, Grasle, Hart, Mathews and Riley. The minutes of the one hundred eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the 1st day of July, 1919, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 15th day of July, 1919, were read and approved as read.

Mr. Morgan representing the Lake Wood Mutual Water Users Association was present and requested a reduction in the price of excess water used by the Association during the months of July, August and September. Upon motion duly made and carried, the price of the excess water used by the Lake Wood Mutual Water Users Association during the months of July, August and September was reduced to 20 cents per 100 cubic feet. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Marshal was instructed to send notices to all persons in Milwaukie who are allowing obnoxious weeds and grass to grow on and in front of their property to cut and remove the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to make application to some bonding Company and secure an undertaking on an appeal to the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon, in the case of Montague-O'Reilly Co. vs. Town of Milwaukie.
