The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th day of July, 1914, and the adjourned meetings of the regular one hundred forty-eight meeting of the Council held on the 24th and 31st days of July, 1914, and the xxxxxxxx minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 5th day of August, 1914, were all read and approved as read. The following bills were read and approved by the finance Committee, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the several fund in payment of the same:

The Flection Committe made the following report:

Milwaukie, Oregon, Aug. 11, 1914.

Mr. Mayor:-

Your Committee on Elections begs to make the following report and recommendations: That Mr. W. F. Kelso be appointed registrar for the Town of Milwaukie for the remainder of the year (1914) and that he be compensated for his work at the rate of ten cents for each person registered.

That he provide himself with two suitable poll books, cost of the same to be charged to Milwaukie, and that one poll book be used for the names of persons residing in the First Ward and the other book for persons residing in the second Ward. That Mr. W. F. Kelso require those registering to wrife their full name; age, address and lenght of time residence within the Town of Milwaukie, in the book designated for the Ward in which they live.

The Committee further recommends that the registration books be opened for use on the 15th. day of August, 1914 and close on the 15th day of October, 1914, and that immediately upon close of the books they be delivered to the Recorder of the Town and kept by him until needed for

reference at the poles.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Fire Committee was adopted. A communication From the Social Service Club in regard to the piling maintained in Front Street by She Southern Pacific Company was read and ordered placed on file. Upon motion of councilman Mytchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Southern Facific Company that unless they proceeded to remove the said piling from Front Street with in 30 days, the Council would declare it a nuisance and the Town would proceed to remove the same from the street. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 115 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following Ayes, Mitchell, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent Loeding. Ordiance No. 115 passed the first reading. Upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 115 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following rresults: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent, Loeding. Ordinance No. 115 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 115 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Mitchell, King, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Absent Loeding. Ordinance No. 115 passed. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by coubcilman Counsell and

carried, the recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the improvement of Laurel Avenue in the Portland Daily Abstract, said bids to be opened on the 18th day of August, 1914.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 18th day of August, 1914.
