COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

A special meeting was held on the 17th day of September, 1934 pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of meeting with the budget committee.

Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock, and Walsh; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn, Recorder Adams and Freeholders E.W. Kirkpatrick, H.M. Ray, R.S. Ramsey, J.F. Maurer, W.O. Parks, and H.H. Farnham.

E.W. Kirkpatrick submitted the budget for 1935 as proposed by the budget committee.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dean that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance embodying the proposed budget for 1935 submitted by the budget committee. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

A special meeting was held on the 18th day of September, 1935⁴ pursuant to the call of Mayor Miller for the purpose of considering proposals of the Charter Amendment Committee.

Present Mayor Miller, Councilmen Dean, Dell, Sanders, Shrock and Walsh; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and J.F. Maurer, J.M. De Vee, E.W. Kirkpatrick and Clarence Rudder.

J.F. Maurer submitted the charter committee report stating that it was felt that the charter should be at least amended if not rewritten. He stated that the particulars in which the charter needed to be amended the most were as follows: 1. time of holding elections 2. purchase of materials and supplies and hiring of labor by the council and also sale of real estate by the council 3. shortening of time for posting of ordinance 4. appointment of Marshal by Council.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dell that the Recorder be authorized to prepare and post an ordinance calling a special election to be held on November 6, 1934 for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie four proposals to amend the city charter as follows: 1. Change the date and time of holding elections so as to conform with the State Constitution 2. Change the charter so that the Council can make purchases and hire employes and sell real estate procured as the result of sale on account of city liens without passing an ordinance 3. Changing the charter so that emergency ordinances can be passed and will be effective at once and so that ordinances do not have to be posted more than ten days before they can be passed 4. Changing the charter so that the marshal may be appointed by the Mayor and Council instead of being elected by the people. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Dean that the Recorder be authorized and directed to institute and carry out all necessary steps incident to the special election to be held on November 6, 1934. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting was adjourned.
