

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 12-1929.

The three hundred twenty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 12th. day of August, 1929. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

The minutes of the three hundred twenty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th. day of July, 1929, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 15th. day of July, 1929, and of the adjourned meeting of the three hundred twenty-eighth regular meeting of the Council held on the 29th. day of July, 1929, were read and approved as read.

Councilman Dean of the Street Committee reported that the Street Committee had employed G. C. Pelton to put in the foundation for the City Hall. Upon motion duly made and carried, the bids for the improvement of Willard Street were opened and read, which bids were as follows:

G. C. Pelton having submitted the lowest bid for the improvement of Willard Street, upon motion duly made and carried, G. C. Pelton was awarded the contract for the improvement of Willard Street according to his proposal therefor. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to entered into a contract on behalf of Milwaukie with G. C. Pelton for the improvement of Willard Street. A communication from the East Milwaukie Progressive Club endorsing the establishing of a play ground for children was read and ordered placed on file. A communication from A. G. Beattie in regard to the taxes against Lots 7 & 8 Block 28, Milwaukie, was read and the matter put over until next regular meeting of the Council.

There being no objections made or filed to the acceptance of the improvement of 35th. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the improvement of 35th. Street was accepted. The proposed assessment to pay the cost of the improvement of 35th. Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the 9th. day of September, 1929, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time set for hearing and considering objections to said proposed assessment.

A communication from Mrs. L. G. Nichols in regard to renting the premises now occupied by the City Treasurer was read and laid on the table. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that City Officers under salary be granted vacations on pay only by permission from the City Council.
