

Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie on or before the 25th. day of August, 1925.

The Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie is hereby directed to cause this notice and resolution to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the following streets be paved at the same time the other streets were being paved: 29th Street from Harrison Street to Washington Street; Jackson Street between Front Street and Main Street and 27th. Street to the south limit of the Grammar School. The said streets to be paved sixteen feet in width.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that 30th. 31st. 32nd streets and west Monroe Street be repaired by scarifying, rolling and placing crushed rock on the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to have Clackamas County start paving at 27th. & Washington Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance licensing breeders' of dogs in the Town of Milwaukie. TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 14th. 1925.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the 14th. day of August, 1925. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 229 entitled, "An ordinance to provide for the issuance of Milwaukie General Obligation Paving Bonds in the sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000), providing for the form of the bonds to be issued and the coupons attached thereto, ratifying, approving and confirming the sale of said bonds heretofore made," was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 229 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 229 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 229 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 229 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The rollcall showed the following result: Ayes, Councilmen Ramsey, McIntyre and Hazen. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 229 passed the third and final reading.

The City Engineer having filed his certificate of completion of 32nd. Street and his approval thereof with the Recorder, upon motion duly made and carried, the 26th day of August, 1925, was fixed and set as the time for hearing objections to the acceptance of the improvement of said street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 26th, day of August, 1925.
