TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AUGUST 16TH. 1916.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Felton. Present, Mayor, Felton, Councilmen, Grasle, Millier, Shindler and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of acting upon the resignation of Mr. Harlow as councilman. The resignation of Mr. Harlow as councilman of the Town of Milwaukie was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was accepted. John M. Snyder was duly appointed councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Harlow. The Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the cutting of thistles and other obnoxious ^{weeds} on vacant lot and tracts of land within the Town of Milwaukie, and post a copy thereof in accordance with the Town Charter. The Recorder was instructed to notify the property owners who had failed to pay their assessment for the improvement of Monroe Street, that their assessments were delinquent and unless the same was paid by the 1st day of September, 1916, the Town would proceed to collect the same in accordance with ~~the Charter~~ ^{the City Charter}. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
