TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 15TH. 1926.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred eighty-eight regular meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Ramsey, Kerr, Grastle, McIntyre and Hazen, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

A communication from County Judge Cross advising the Council that the Town of Milwaukie would receive the sum of \$1940.82 as its share of the Road Fund for 1926. A petition signed by 28 persons requesting that their names be taken off the initiative petition filed with the Recorder was read. Mr. Freeman, an attorney of Portland, was present and

requested the Council to call a special election to vote upon the proposed amendment to the City Charter as petitioned for. There not being sufficient number of legal voters signing said initiative petition, upon motion duly made and carried, the petition was turned down, and it was ordered that no election be called. The City Engineer having heretofore filed plans and specifications for the construction of the sewers as petitioned for, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and said plans, specifications and estimates being satisfactory to the Council, the following resolution was read and unanimously adopted by the Council:

2-1926 RESOLUTION FOR SEWER WORK.

WHEREAS, heretofore there has been filed with the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, a certain petition signed by the resident owners of more than one-fourth the area of the real property, in a certain district, as hereinafter described, within the town of Milwaukie, Oregon, praying for the making of certain improvements by the laying of sewers, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary to grant said petition and make the improvement hereinafter described in the manner set forth, and has required from the City Engineer plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement and an estimate of the total cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed said plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder; now, therefore **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON,** that the aforesaid plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer now on file with the Recorder are found to be satisfactory, and are hereby approved, and **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Council does declare its intention of making the said improvement, the location and kind of said improvement being as follows:

By the construction of certain sewers along the lines hereinafter stated, which said sewers shall include all catch basin inlets and all things necessary in the construction of said sewers, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this resolution. Said sewers are to be constructed along the following lines, and the termini and routes thereof are as follows:

Beginning at a point where Jefferson St. enters the Willamette River; thence Easterly along Jefferson St to 21st St. Northwesterly on 21st St. to Harrison St; thence Easterly along Harrison St. to 29th St. Thence Northwesterly along 29th St. to the city limits. Southeasterly on 29th. St from Harrison St to Monroe Street. Southeasterly on 28th St from Harrison Street to Monroe Street. Northerly on 24th St. from Harrison Harrison St. to the city limits. Through the centers of Blocks 27, 16 and 13 Milwaukie, and Block 3 Lewelling Park Addition. In the centers of Blocks 29, 28, 15 and 14 Milwaukie, and Block 1 Lewelling Park Addition. On Jackson Street westerly from 21st St. 120 feet. On Monroe St. from 21st St. Easterly to 29th St. On 26th St. 300 feet Southerly from Monroe St. On 21st St. from Jefferson St. Southerly to the Southern Pacific Railroad. On Washington St. from 21st St. Easterly to 29th. St. Northerly on 29th. St. 750 feet from Washington St. Northerly on 28th. St. 418 feet from Washington St. Southerly on 27th. St. 779 feet from Washington Street. Southerly on 23rd St. 500 feet from Washington Street. Southerly on Main St. from Jefferson St. to Lake Road. Southeasterly on Lake Road to the division line of the Lot Whitcomb D. L. C. Northerly on 21st. St. from Lake Road to the Southern Pacific railraad. On Willard Street from Lake Road Easterly to Hennemen Acres, and North to Tract 3 Hennemen Acres. Northerly 500 ft. from Jefferson St. and about 80 feet West of the West Line of Front Street.

The City Engineer's estimate of the probable total cost of said improvement is Thirty-six thousand two hundred Seventy Dollars and sixty cents (\$36,270,60).

The District liable to be assessed for the aforesaid improvement is as follows:

Beginning at a point where the westerly projection of the northerly side of Jefferson St. in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, intersects the easterly bank of the Willamette River; thence down stream along the easterly bank of the Willamette River to its junction with the easterly bank of Johnson Creek; thence upstream along the easterly bank of Johnson Creek to its intersection with the center line of the Portland Electric Power Company's Railway as operated this date; thence southeasterly along the center line of the Portland Electric Power Company's railway to its intersection with the westerly property line of Front Street, sometimes known as the "River Road;" thence northwesterly along the westerly side of Front Street to its intersection with the northerly city limits of the Town of Milwaukie; thence following the northerly city limits of the Town of Milwaukie along the northerly side of Lewelling Park Addition, along the easterly side of Streib's First Addition, along the northerly side of Streib's First Addition, and the projection thereof easterly to a point that is in the northwesterly projection of the northeasterly side of Block 2 Brownell Acres; thence southeasterly along the northwesterly projection of the northeasterly side of Block 2 Brownell Acres, and the northeasterly side of Block 2 Brownell acres to a point that is in the northerly projection of the center line of Block 2 Brownell acres; thence southerly along the the northerly projection of the center line of Block 2 Brownell Acres and the projection thereof southerly to a point that is 100.00 feet south of the south property line of Harrison Street; thence westerly along a line that is 100.00 feet southerly and parallel to the southerly propertyline of Harrison Street to a point that is 100.00 feet easterly from the easterly property line of 29th Street; thence southeasterly along a line that is 100.00 feet easterly and parallel to the easterly property line of 29th. Street to the southeast corner of Lot 6 Block "B" Kerr & Shindler's Addition; thence southwesterly to the northeast corner of Lot 3, Block 1 Sellwood's Addition to Quincy Addition; thence southerly along the easterly line of Lot 3 Block 1 Sellwood's Addition to Quincy Addition to a point that is 100.00 feet southerly of the south property line of Washington Street; thence southwesterly along a line that is 100.00 feet southerly and parallel to the south property line of Washington St. to a point that is 100.00 ft. easterly from the easterly property line of 27th. Street; thence southeasterly and southerly along a line that is 100.00 ft. easterly and parallel to the easterly property line of 27th Street to a point in the northerly property line of Lake Road; thence southerly to the northeasterly corner of Lot 2, Block 1 Hoesly's Lakeside Addition; thence southwesterly along the westerly property line of 28th Street to a point that is 150.00 feet southwesterly from the southerly property line of Lake Road; thence northwesterly along a line that is 150.00 feet southwesterly and parallel to the southerly property line of Lake Road to a point in the westerly right of way property line of the Southern Pacific Company known as the Beaverton-Willsburg branch; thence northeasterly along the westerly right of way line of the Southern Pacific Company to a point in the southerly side of Madison Street; thence southwesterly along the southerly property line of Madison Street and the southwesterly projection thereof to a point in the east bank of the Willamette River; thence down stream along ~~east~~ in the east bank of the Willamette River to the place of beginning.

That the above described district is the district referred to in Paragraph One (1) of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Marshal shall, within five (5) days hereof, give notice of the passage of this resolution by posting three (3) notices haeded "Notice of Sewer Work" on the Streets along the line of the contemplated sewer, which notice shall contain a copy of this resolution and shall set the time within which remonstrance against said improvement may be filed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that objections and remonstrances may be filed with the Recorder against the aforesaid proposed improvement at any time within ten (10) days after the date of posting said notices by the City Marshal, and the same will be heard and considered by the Council at a special meeting of said Council to be held on the 31st day of March, 1926, at 7:30 P. M.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the said impeovement be made at as early a date as possible, as said sewer is urgently needed, and it is necessary to take advantage of weather conditions in the construction thereof: Now, Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect immediately upon its adoption approval.

There being no remonstrances filed against the construction of the sewers heretofore petition for, upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the construction of said sewers according to the plans and specifications therefor and post the same as required by the City Charter. A petition requesting the the Council to construct sewers along Washington Street, from 29th St. to Elmer Street and Elmer Street to 32nd. Street and south on 32nd. Street was read, and it appearing that said petition was signed by the resident property owners of more that 25% of the area of the real property that would be assessed to pay the cost of said sewers, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the construction of the sewers as petitioned for and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.
