Town hall Milwaukie, Oregon, July 3rd. 1917.

The one hundred eighty fourth (184) regular meeting of the Council was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Bates and Seavey, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred eighty-third regular meeting held on the 5th day of June, 1917, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings held on the 11th and 18th days of June, 1917, were read and approved as read. A communication from W. H. Counsell requesting an extension of time within which to complete 27th. Street was read and upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Counsell was granted 30 days time within which to complete the improvement of 27th. Street. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. A petition signed by property owners whose property abuts on 31st. Street requesting the Council to improve said street was read, and the Council deeming it necessary to improve said Street as petitioned for, the petition was allowed upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specification for the improvement of said street, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. The City Engineer filed plans and specifications for the improvement of 31st. Street, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and presented the same to the Council for their approval. The Council having examined said plans and specifications and estimates and having found said plans and specifications and estimates to be

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satisfactory, the following resolution and notice was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read:

Resolution and Notice for the improvement of 31st Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon. *Resolution No. 3-1917*

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of 31st Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, And, Whereas, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie: Therefore Be It Resolved that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved and adopted; And Be It further Resolved that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

(1). That said street be graded to a grade fixed by the City Engineer, from the south line of Elmer Street to the South end of said Street known as the Southeast corner of Block No. 10 and the Southwest corner of Block No. 11, a distance of approximately 1670 feet.

(2). That a cement sidewalk be placed both on the east and west sides of said street, same to begin 18 inches from the property line and to be 4 feet in width.

(3). That a curb line be established, the outer edge of same to be 11 feet from the property line, but no curbs to be placed at the present time.

(4). That a road bed of pit run gravel be placed in the center, the same to be 14 feet wide and not less than 8 inches thick in the center, and not less than 6 inches thick at outer edge, the same to be both raked and rolled. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this Resolution. Remonstrances against the said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town within 10 days from the 5th day of July, 1917.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for the improvement of 31st Street, and post a copy of the same as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 155 entitled, "An ordinance changing the grade of 31st Street between a point 328 feet South of the South line of Madison Street and the South end of said 31st Street", was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 155 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 155 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Grasle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 155 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 155 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shinder, Grasle, Miller, Bates and Seavey. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 155 passed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Commissioner was instructed to notify the property owners to cut the grass and weed in front of their property.
