

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEB. 9TH. 1915.

The one hundred fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, Councilmen Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason, recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred fifty fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th day of January, 1915, were read and approved as read. The Street Committee to whom the matter of the assessment against Mr. Ameele property was referred reported that in case Jefferson Street should be extended then Mr. Ameele should only pay for 12½ feet, otherwise the assessment should stand as levied. The Committee also reported that they were in doubt as to the feasibility of extending Jefferson Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the matter was referred to the Street Committee for further investigation.

The following report of the License Committee was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read: We, the license Committee would recommend that the claim of Fritz T. Roysen for \$125.00 await the outcome of the appeal of his case.

The Finance Committee recommended that the Bills of the Milwaukie Water Company and H. V. Carrington be allowed and that the Milwaukie Water Company be sent a statement of the amount due the City from said Company. Upon motion of Councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same.

The Street Committee to whom the matter of objections to the present system of numbering the Streets and houses were referred recommended that the system be not changed. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted.

Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Peery and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, with J. W. Morris for his services as City Engineer for the year 1915, in accordance with the terms of the contract submitted to the City by Mr. Morris.

The Street Committee to whom the matter of the Carver Franchise was referred reported that it would not be necessary for the Council to take any action in the matter until Mr. Carver commenced construction of the railroad in Milwaukie. Upon motion of councilman Skulason seconded by councilman Bond and carried, the matter was referred to the Street Committee to ascertain if Mr. Carver has a valid Franchise and if the Council has the authority to annul and cancel the same.

The Light Committee to whom was referred the matter of changing certain arc lights in the Town reported that they had misplaced the statement of the cost of the change and would not be able to make a complete report at this time. Upon motion of councilman Skulason

duly seconded and carried, the Light Committee was given full authority to act in the matter. A communication from the S. P. Co. in regard to installing the steel girder over Front Street was read and ordered placed on file. A communication from the Social Service Club of Oak Grove requesting the Council to construct a guard railing on the board walk across Kellogg Lake was read and referred to the Street Committee. A petition of property owners on Laurele Avenue objecting to changing the name of the Street and numbering the streets was read and referred to the Street Committee. The application for the transfer of the pool room license from A. J. Eckerle to Chas. T. Disque was read and referred to the License Committee, whereupon the License Committee recommended that the transfer be made. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to make such transfer.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance no. 121 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the followings results: Ayes, Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 121 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 121 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 121. passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman Bond seconded by councilman Peery and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 121 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 121 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion of council Counsell seconded by councilman Peery and carried, ordinance No. 122 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 122 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Grasle seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 122 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Bond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 122 passed the second reading.

Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Peery and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance no. 122 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Pond, Peery Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 122 passed.

Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Peery and carried, ordinance No. 123 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Pond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 123 passed the first reading. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Pond and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 123 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Pond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 123 passed the second reading. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Grasle and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 123 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Grasle, Pond, Peery, Counsell and Skulason. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 123 passed.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 125 entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the expectorating or spitting on the floor of any public hall, building, or office or upon the sidewalks within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance," was read and a copy ordered posted as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 126 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of sections 3245, 3246, 3247, 3248, 3249, 3250, 3251, 3252 and 3253 Lord's Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency," was read and a copy ordered posted as required by the Town Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 127 entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the ruming at large of chickens, geese and ducks within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance," was read and a copy ordered posted.

Upon motion of councilman Pond seconded by councilman Skulason and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Laurel Avenue Improvement in favor of W. H. Counsell in payment for the cost of the improvement of the same.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise in the Portland Daily Abstract for bids for the Harrison and Monroe Streets improvement bonds. The bids to be opened the 26th day of February, 1915. The Recorder was instructed to send a statement to Puffum & Jeffrey of \$10.00 the cost of cleaning the mud and debris from Front Street, which mud and debris was carried on the street by their auto trucks.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

The bill of the P. R. L. & P. Co for lighting was referred to the Light Committee with full authority to pay them same if found to be correct.

The bonds of the Recorder, Treasurer and Marshal were approved and ordered placed on file. The petition of J. F. Wetzler and others asking the Council to call a special election to vote upon an amendment to the City Charter was referred to the Election Committee.

Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Pond and carried, the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into a contract immediately, on behalf of the Town, with Giebisch & Joplin for the installing a water system for the Town of Milwaukie.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned until the 26th day of February, 1915.
