

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, SEPTEMBER 9, 1935

The four hundred sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 9th day of September, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.

Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lealyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred fourth and four hundred fifth regular meetings of the Council were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Communications from the Women's Christian Temperance Union of Milwaukie, Oregon, Jennings Lodge Women's Christian Temperance Union, Minhorn Community Church of Milwaukie, Oregon, Wichita Evangelical Church, Immanuel Evangelical Church, Women's Christian Temperance Union of Evergreen, and Clackamas County Ministerial Association requesting that the Council prohibit the operation of slot machines in Milwaukie were read. Mrs. Edith Hazen and Reverend A. P. Lyton requested the Council to prohibit the operation of slot machines.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the Recorder prepare and post ordinances prohibiting the operation of slot machines excepting vending machines and "pin ball games" and also an ordinance licensing the operation of pin ball machines. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Recorder brought up the question of the appointment of a Budget Committee. E.W. Kirkpatrick, Harry Ray, Roy Miller, R. S. Ramsey, W. O. Parks and J. F. Mourer were appointed members of the Budget Committee.

George L. Mathews submitted an application for endorsement of the Council to his application to the State Liquor Commission to sell beer. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Application be denied. Motion carried and so ordered.

Wallace Miller spoke on the question of the Council endorsing the Eagle Creek water development project.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that proceedings be started on securing a well water supply. Motion carried and so ordered.
