TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JUNE 11TH. 1928.

The three hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th. day of June, 1928. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Shrock and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fourteen regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th. day of June, 1928, were read and approved as read.

The Sewer Committee reported the Mr. Elliott had given them a price of \$159.80 for removing the manhole from Mrs. Quant's property and installing one at the parking on the south side of Monroe Street.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Elliott was awarded the contract for removing the manhole from Mrs. Quant's property and installing a manhole at the parking on the south side of Monroe Street and making the proper connections for the sum of \$159.80, Mr. Elliott to use standard sewer pipe and perform the work satisfactory to the City Engineer.

The Street Committee reported that all the property owners along 23rd. Street had not signed for the paving of said Street, and that the Committee would recommend that the street be not paved unless all the property signed for the paving of the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, the report of the Street Committee was accepted.

The bids for the improvement of East Washington Street were opened and read, which bids were as follows:

C. H. Counsell having submitted the lowest bid, upon motion duly made and carried, C. H. Counsell was awarded the contract for the improvement of East Washington Street, and the mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on behalf of Milwaukie with C. H. Counsell for the improvement of East Washington Street for the sum of \$1642.50, according to the terms of his bid.

The proposal of G. C. Pelton for repairing the city hall for \$295.00 was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Pelton was awarded the contract for repairing the city hall for \$295.00 according to his bid, the work to be completed by the 1st day of September, 1928.

A petition to extend Willard Street from 25th. Street to 27th. Street was read, and upon motion duly made and carried, the following resolution was read and adopted as read:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Milwaukie, that the City Engineer be and hereby is directed and instructed to make a survey of the proposed extension of Willard Street as ~~petitioned~~ <sup>petitioned</sup> for and a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of such extension of said street, and of the boundaries thereof, and of the portions of each lot or tract of land to be appropriated therefor. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered the City of Milwaukie contribute \$50.00 to the Milwaukie Community Bank for the purpose of helping pay for a floral float for the Rose parade in Portland. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Treasurer was given a ten days vacation with pay.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON. July 9th. 1928.

The three hundred sixteenth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 9th. day of July, 1928. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Shrock, Sanders and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of June, 1928, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, C. H. Counsell was given ten days further time in which to complete the improvement of East Washington Street.

The Sewer Committee reported that Mr. Elliott had given them a price of \$80.00 for connecting the City Hall with the sewer and installing drain, and that the Committee had ordered him to do the work at that price.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that a stop sign be placed at 27th. Street and Lake Road. A communication from Mr. B. G. Skulason requesting the Council to repair 34th. Street between King Street and Harrison Street was read and referred to the Street Committee with full power to act in the matter. The report of the City Engineer on the extension of Willard Street was read and referred to the Street Committee for investigation and consideration.

Mayor Miller appointed Councilmen Shrock, Sanders and Dell as a Committee to see about taking up \$6500.00 of outstanding water bonds with full power to retire the same. Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Kelso was given a ten days vacation with pay.
