

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, NOVEMBER 21st. 1924.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred seventy second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 21st day of November, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen, Kerr, Miller, and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. There being no objections made to the estimate of the expenditures of the Town of Milwaukie for the year 1925, prepared by the Budget Committee, upon motion duly made and carried, a special tax of \$7559.00 was levied upon all the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the year 1925, and apportioned as follows, to-wit: General fund including salaries of Recorder, Treasurer, Marshal and Traffic officer \$5025.00: Street fund- \$800.00: Fire Dept fund including salary of Fire Chief- \$1420.00: Emergency Fund- \$314.00.

The City Engineer having filed his acceptance of the improvement of Harvey Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the 29th day of December, 1924, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock P. M. of said day was the time set and the City Hall the place fixed to hear objections, if any, to the acceptance of the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare the assessment roll for the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to hire some men and have the paved streets cleaned. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Harvey Street fund in the sum of \$1690.56 in favor of H. W. Oliver payment in full for balance due for the improvement of Harvey Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
