An adjourned meeting the the two hundred thirty-third regular meeting was held on the 17th day of August, 1921. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Albee, ~~Shind~~ Shindler, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

There being no objections filed or made to the acceptance of the improvement of 32nd. Street, upon motion duly made and carried, the improvement of 32nd. Street was accepted. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of 32nd. Street and post the same as required by the City Charter.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the 6th day of September, 1921, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m. of said day was the time fixed and the Council Chambers the place appointed for hearing objections to the proposed assessment for the improvement of 32nd. Street. The matter of repairing the bridge on Monroe Street was left to the Street committee.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to extend the water main from 42nd. Street to South line of ~~King~~ Jackson Street. Councilman Albee stated that he had interviewed the S. P. Co. and that they were willing to donate something toward the repair of Railroad Avenue. Upon motion duly made and carried, C. H. Counsell was instructed to repair Washington Street. No further business coming before the Council the Council adjourned.
