

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, AUGUST 26, 1935

The four hundred fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 26th day of August, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders.
Present: Mayor Sanders; Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Shrock and Walsh; Marshal Riley, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Adams.

The matter of a business and trade licensing ordinance was taken up for discussion. E.B. Stanley and Wallace Miller opposed the passage of an ordinance unless local business men and tradesmen could be taxed a small amount and outsiders a large amount.

C.S. Smith, I.A. Jones and J.F. Mourer favored the passage of a licensing ordinance licensing businesses and trades carried on in the City and imposing a reasonable tax.

After considerable discussion it was moved by Shrock and seconded by Walsh that the mayor appoint two councilmen to act with the Recorder and a committee of citizens in studying the ordinances of other cities and preparing after such study a suggested form of ordinance. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition signed by several citizens asking that steps be taken to have the old barn on the Wilson place on twenty-ninth street removed was read. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the Recorder take care of the matter.

A letter from the Clackamas County Chapter of the American Red Cross requesting aid in securing quarters was read. Mr. Harry Dean appeared in behalf of the request. Mr. Dean was told that the Council would assist in whatever way it could.

The matter of appointing a budget committee was brought up by the Recorder. Action on the matter was deferred until the next meeting.

The Recorder suggested that the City Council protest the removal of the local S.E.R.A. sewing project to Oregon City. The Recorder was instructed to write such a letter of protest to the S.E.R.A. officials.

It was moved by Walsh and seconded by Burdick that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance licensing slot machines, the fees to be as follows: \$75.00 to each owner and \$5.00 per machine per month to each operator. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Walsh that a Co-Two fire extinguisher be purchased. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Shrock and seconded by Burdick that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder issue warrants for the same.
